Things to Know

- **Steven Alker** defeats **Y.E. Yang** with a birdie on the first playoff hole (No. 18) at the Rogers Charity Classic, earning his 12th PGA TOUR Champions title and second victory of the 2026 season.

Steven Alker, 68-61-65 – 194 (-16)

- Closed with 5-under 65, playing the back nine in 5-under 30, then defeated Yang with a birdie at the par-5 18th on the first playoff hole.
- 55-year-old earns his 12th PGA TOUR Champions title in his 112th career start; second win of the 2026 season in his third career playoff.
 - 2025 Cologuard Classic: Defeated Jason Caron
 - 2026 Cologuard Classic: Defeated Pádraig Harrington
- Marks his fourth PGA TOUR Champions season with multiple victories (2022/four, 2023/two, 2025/two, 2026/two).
- Entered the week at No. 10 in the Charles Schwab Cup with six top-10 finishes including a T4 in his last start at the Boeing Classic.
- Moves from No. 10 to No. 4 in the Charles Schwab Cup, trailing only Stewart Cink (1), Zach Johnson (2) and Harrington (3).
- Joins Cink as the only Champions Tour players with at least two wins in 2025 and 2026.
- Records the third playoff victory in Rogers Charity Classic history.
 - 2014: Fred Couples def. Billy Andrade
 - 2022: Jerry Kelly def. John Huston
- Matched the tournament's 18-hole scoring record in the second round with 9-under 61, eagling the par-5 11th and playing the back nine in 6-under 29 to climb from T27.
 - Previous 61s at the Rogers Charity Classic: Fred Couples (2014), Miguel Angel Jiménez (2015), Michael Bradley (2019) and Ken Tanigawa (2024)
- Owns three top-10 finishes in four career starts in Calgary (6/2024, T5/2025).
- Becomes just the third international winner in tournament history.
 - 2016: Carlos Franco, Paraguay

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- o 2025: Richard Green, Australia

Other Notes

- **Y.E. Yang** (2nd) forced the playoff with a bogey-free, 7-under 63, playing the back nine in 6-under 29 and birdieing the 72nd hole; he made two bogeys all week.
 - o The 54-year-old was seeking his second PGA TOUR Champions title after winning the 2024 Stifel Charity Classic; he moves to 1-1 in playoffs in his PGA TOUR Champions career (def. Bernhard Langer in his lone win)
 - o Marks the fourth runner-up finish of his PGA TOUR Champions career in his 124th start
 - o Entered the week at No. 27 in the Charles Schwab Cup and moved up to No. 18 with the runner-up
 - o The runner-up finish came 17 years and one week after he defeated Tiger Woods by three shots at the 2009 PGA Championship
- 2022 champion **Jerry Kelly** (T3) matched Yang with a bogey-free 63 of his own, going out in 5-under 30; his second consecutive top-five finish lifts him from No. 18 to No. 11 in the standings.
- **Zach Johnson** (T3), seeking a fifth win of the 2026 season, closed with a bogey-free 65 and remains No. 2 in the Charles Schwab Cup standings.
- 54-hole leader **Ryan Armour** (T5) closed with 1-under 69, marking the rookie's best finish on PGA TOUR Champions (previous: T23, 2026 Kaulig Companies Championship); he moves from No. 74 to No. 54 in the standings.
- Defending champion **Richard Green** (T5) carded a final-round 67.
- **Retief Goosen** (T5), **Michael Block** (T5) and Canadian **Mike Weir** (T14), each bogey-free through 36 holes, made their lone bogeys of the week Sunday; Goosen's two eagles for the week both came at the par-5 11th.
- First-round co-leader **Rob Labritz** (T9) eagled the par-5 18th, his second eagle of the week, to close with 68; **Miguel Angel Jiménez** (T14) was 12-under before a double bogey at the 72nd hole.
- **Brandt Jobe** posted Sunday's low round, 8-under 62, climbing 32 spots to T30.
- Ten eagles were recorded Sunday, eight of them at the par-5 18th; **Cameron Beckman** (No. 6) finished the week with three eagles, including his opening-round hole-in-one.
- **Jeff Maggert** withdrew prior to the final round.
