Things to Know

- **Steven Alker** won for the second consecutive week on PGA TOUR Champions, carding a final-round 68 en route to a three-stroke triumph at The Ally Challenge presented by McLaren.
- **Weather Delay:** The start of the final round was delayed by two hours due to heavy rain accumulation.

Steven Alker, 68-65-68 – 201 (-15)

- The 55-year-old earned his 13th win on PGA TOUR Champions (113 starts).
- Earned his third win of the 2026 season (15 starts).
 - Previous wins: Cologuard Classic (March 20-22), Rogers Charity Classic (Aug. 21-23)
 - Remains No. 4 in the 2026 Charles Schwab Cup standings.
- Becomes the third three-time winner of the 2026 season on PGA TOUR Champions.
 - Joins Stewart Cink (5 wins) and Zach Johnson (4 wins)
- This is his second three-win season on PGA TOUR Champions since joining in 2021.
 - Wins by season: 2020-21 (1 win), 2022 (4 wins), 2023 (2 wins), 2024 (1 win), 2025 (2 wins), 2026 (3 wins)
- The winner of last week's Rogers Charity Classic becomes the first player to win back-to-back tournaments on the PGA TOUR Champions schedule since Stewart Cink (2026 Hoag Classic, 2026 Senior PGA Championship).
- Becomes the first player to win back-to-back starts on PGA TOUR Champions since Zach Johnson (2026 Principal Charity Classic, 2026 Kaulig Companies Championship).
- Earned his first win at The Ally Challenge (five starts).
 - Previous best finish at this event: 3rd (2021), T3 (2025)
- Improves his PGA TOUR Champions winning percentage to 11.50% (13-for-113), fifth-best in PGA TOUR Champions history among players to win 10 or more times.
- Improved to 2-for-4 when playing in the last group of the final round this season.
- This was the largest come-from-behind win in the nine-year history of The Ally Challenge (2 strokes).
 - Previous mark: 1 stroke (six times)

Other Notes

- World Golf Hall of Fame member **Retief Goosen** (2nd) carded the low round of the day (64). This is his fourth top-3 finish of the 2026 season (17 starts).
 - Previous top-3 finishes: Mitsubishi Electric Classic (Won – Modified Stableford scoring), Principal Charity Classic (T2), Mitsubishi Electric Championship at Hualalai (3rd)

- 36-hole leader **Michael Block** (T3) closed with 2-over 74 to notch his third top-10 finish on PGA TOUR Champions (five starts).
 - Top-10 finishes: T3 (The Ally Challenge), T5 (Rogers Charity Classic), T9 (DICK'S Open)
- Two-time defending champion (2024, 2025) **Stewart Cink** (T3) carded 67 to earn his ninth top-3 finish of the 2026 season (15 starts). He remains atop the Charles Schwab Cup standings for the 20th consecutive week.
- On the day before his 55th birthday, World Golf Hall of Fame member **Pádraig Harrington** posted 1-over 73 to finish T7. He remains No. 3 in the 2026 Charles Schwab Cup standings.
- **John Rollins** (T7) made a hole-in-one on No. 8 in the final round.
- Rookie **Zach Johnson** (T21) saw his streak of top-10 finishes to open his PGA TOUR Champions career snapped at 12. The four-time winner in 2026 remains No. 2 in the Charles Schwab Cup standings.
- **Mark Hensby** withdrew before the start of the final round.
- **Mark Calcavecchia** was disqualified for not showing for his final round tee time.
