Things to Know

- **Scott Hend** posted rounds of 66-69-69—204 to claim his first PGA TOUR Champions title at the 50th edition of the Trophy Hassan II in Morocco and is now fully exempt on Tour through the 2027 season.
- Trailed by two shots with 10 holes to play in the final round but a three-shot swing on the par-3 ninth – where Hend made birdie and leader **Tommy Gainey** made double-bogey – vaulted him into the tournament lead, which he never relinquished.

Scott Hend, 66-69-69 – 204 (-15)

- The 52-year-old Australian earns his first win on PGA TOUR Champions (12 starts).
 - Previous best finish: 2nd (2026 Regions Tradition)
- Earns exempt status on PGA TOUR Champions through the 2027 season; exempt into the season-opening Mitsubishi Electric Championship at Hualalai in 2027-28.
- Moves from No. 14 to No. 5 in the Charles Schwab Cup standings.
- Becomes the third first-time winner on PGA TOUR Champions this season.
 - Zach Johnson (James Hardie Pro Football Hall of Fame Invitational), Boo Weekley (Insperity Invitational)
- Becomes the fourth straight international winner of the Trophy Hassan II in its Champions Tour era, and the first Australian to win in the event's 50-year history.
 - Stephen Ames (2023/Canada), Ricardo Gonzalez (2024/Argentina), Miguel Ángel Jiménez (2025/Spain)
- Recorded 86 starts on the PGA TOUR, where he was a member in 2004-2005; posted a career-best solo-third at the 2004 AT&T Classic, finishing two shots shy of Zach Johnson.
- Owns three career wins on the DP World Tour, as well as three on the Staysure Legends Tour, including two during the 2025 season; finished first on the Legends Tour's Order of Merit in 2025, which is how he earned his spot in the Trophy Hassan II field.

Other Notes

- Two-time Charles Schwab Cup champion **Steven Alker** (T2) ties the day's low round with a closing 68 to notch his fourth top-10 of the 2026 season in his second career start at the Trophy Hassan II (finished solo-second in 2025); moves from No. 6 to No. 4 in the Charles Schwab Cup standings.
- Overnight leader **Tommy Gainey** (T2) led by one shot on the tee of the par-3 ninth before recording a double-bogey to fall from 13-under to 11-under; records his fourth top-10 of the 2026 season and best finish on PGA TOUR Champions since his maiden win at the 2025 Constellation FURYK & FRIENDS; moves from No. 11 to No.

8 in the Charles Schwab Cup standings; becomes the first 36-hole leader/co-leader in the Champions Tour era of the event to not win.

- After opening the week with a 74 – his highest score on PGA TOUR Champions in 12 months – World Golf Hall of Fame member and past Trophy Hassan II champion **Ernie Els** (T4) rallied with rounds of 68-69; the South African finished solo-third in the 2025 event.
- Note: Due to course routing, players were paired in threesomes off of Nos. 1 and 8 tees.
