1972 RECAP: In many ways, it was another routine year for Tommy Aaron. He did not record a Tour victory, finished second once and tied for second three times. But 1972 was different; it marked the first year the sweet-swinging Georgian joined the exclusive Century Club with \$118,924 for a 9th place finish on the money list.

Aaron won nearly half his "Century Aaron won nearly half nis "Century during a four-week period in late July and August when he finished 4th in the National Team (paired with Charles Coody), tied for second in the PGA, tied for 9th at West-chester, and tied for 3rd in the USI for total winnings of \$43,983.

At the time, Tommy said: "I believe I am playing better than I ever have. Now if I could just win a tournament..."

Tommy got his wish in October in an off-Tour event when he won the Lancome Trophy at Saint-Nom-La Breteche, near Paris,

France. In November, he won the individual title and led the U.S. Team to an 18-stroke victory over Japan in the second match between the countries.

Other high finishes by Aaron on the Tour in 1972 were a second place finish at Greensboro, and ties for second at Los Angeles and Houston. He lost playoffs to George Archer at Los Angeles and Houston.

As usual in recent years, Tommy's game has been a model of consistency. In 1972, his scoring average was 71.4, which is within a decimal point of his 1971 average, 71.5. In 29 events, Aaron made the top 10 nine times and missed the cut only 4 times.

Aaron credits the difference the last few years to a change in his swing. "It's not quite as long and maybe a little bit firmer," he says. "Now I believe my swing holds up better under pressure."

PRIOR YEARS: Over the years, Tommy Aaron has been called the "runner-up champion" and he doesn't like the tag one bit.

Since he joined the Tour in 1961, he has had 14 runner-up finishes, but doesn't think that is too high a number. Especially when you consider that four of them came in 1963 and another four in 1972.

"I'm sure I got the label in 1963, be-cause a couple of my seconds that year came rather dramatically. I lost to Tony Lema in sudden-death at Memphis and lost an 18-hole playoff to Arnold Palmer at Cleveland."


However, even Tommy must have wondered when he would break through in the years 1961-1969. He had been second or tied for second nine times during this period.

And, then it happened. On July 28, 1969, Tommy beat Sam Snead in an 18-hole playoff to win the Canadian Open. But his first victory had an ironic twist. His winning purse of \$25,000 did not count as official money.

Aaron made it official the next year when he won the Atlanta Classic.

Tommy dominated amateur golf in Georgia in the late 50's. He won the Georgia Open three times and the Georgia and Southeastern Amateurs twice each. On the national scene, he was a finalist in the 1958 U.S. Amateur and captured the 1959 Sunnehanna and 1960 Western Amateurs. He was a member of the victorious 1959 Walker Cup Team.

Aaron was a member of the 1969 Ryder Cup

1972 RECAP: Brian (Buddy) Allin put together another strong season and came close to winning another tournament. His 69-66-69-68--272 placed him just one stroke in back of winner Jim Colbert at the Greater Milwaukee Open.

He had two other 66's during the yearone at the Jackie Gleason Inverrary Classic when he tied for fourth; the other at Sahara Invitational.

Buddy also tied for seventh in the Cleveland Open and the Kaiser Invitational, opening with 68's in both events; and he tied for 10th in the Canadian Open.

It was his second full year on the Tour, and his earnings of \$47,576 helped to establish him as one of the game's more solid performers. However, Buddy still would like to find more consistency. He missed the cut in 13 of his 35 starts.

He suffered through a stretch in the late spring when he missed the 36-hole cut in eight of 11 starts. When he was at Pebble Beach for the U.S. Open in June, he enlisted the help of his former teacher in Santa Barbara, Calif., and Buddy's play improved considerably the rest of the year. His 1972 scoring average was 72.5.

PRIOR YEARS: It isn't often a rookie can jump out and win a tournament, especially if he does not have a superb amateur background. But, Allin did just that in 1971 in the toughest of all situations.

He had to win the Greater greensboro Open in sudden death over Rod Funseth and Dave Eichelberger. He rolled in a 20-foot putt from the fringe for a birdie on the first extra hole.

After only 13 weeks of Tour experience, Buddy started his week at Greensboro with a 75, and then tacked a torrid seven-underpar 64 on the board. He followed with 67 and 69 to force the tie.

The victory was his only finish in the top 10, but Buddy did cash checks in 17 events. Unfortunately, his play was curtailed during the second half of the season because of stomach problems.

Buddy played on the Brigham Young University varsity with Johnny Miller and Mike Reasor. But, he also was an artillery officer in the Army, spending 16 months in Vietnam. He was decorated four times.

Allin qualified for the Tour in the 1970 Qualifying School after his discharge from service. He gained the necessary backing when a Santa Barbara businessman was impressed with his play in the 1971 Los Angeles Open.

He believes an inadvertent left ankle injury suffered in a casual game of tennis really helped his golf. Until then he had been a "fast-foot" swinger. With the sore ankle, he had to get his shoulders more into it, and found it did lengthen his game, thus giving him more confidence.

And, for Buddy, who only weighs 135 pounds, it was just what his game needed.

1972 RECAP: "Don't call me a cowhand from Gilroy, Calif., anymore," says George Archer. "I'm a rancher now and own 1,000 head of cattle."

Certainly George can well afford the promotion. He finished in third place on the money list, earning \$145,027, just \$2,742 behind his 1971 winnings, his most profitable year so far on Tour.

His other vital statistics were equally impressive. He had two wins, one second place, three ties for 5th, as well as four other finishes in the top ten. In the 29 events he entered, he was in the money 26 times and he missed the cut only 3 times. His scoring average was 71.4 only a shade more than his 71.3 average in 1971.

Archer started this year in the best way possible, by winning the first tournament on the schedule--the Glen Campbell Los Angeles Open. Tied with Tommy Aaron and Dave Hill after 72 holes at 270, George went on to win the 18-hole playoff with a 66, two better than Aaron and Hill, who scored 68's.

George was less fortunate at Tucson. He and Miller Barber tied at 273 after regulation play, then tied again after the 18-hole playoff with 72's. In the sudden-death finale, both players carded pars on the first two holes, but it was Barber who rolled in an 18-footer on the 3rd hole for a birdie and the victory.

Archer's second victory came in the Greensboro, and in another playoff. Tied again with Aaron at 272, George won on the second extra hole with a par, when Aaron put his tee shot in a water hazard.

PRIOR YEARS: George Archer got into golf when he caddied in San Mateo, near San Francisco, at the age of 12. He has played the game almost constantly since.

Archer had an excellent amateur record. In 1963, he won the Trans-Mississippi Amateur, the Northern California Open, and the San Francisco City Championship. He also reached the semi-finals of the U.S.Amateur, where he bowed to the ultimate winner, Deane Beman, and was low amateur for the third straight year in the Lucky International.

George caught the eye of Eugene Selvage, who was chairman of the Lucky in its early

years. He went to work on Selvage's 5,000 acre breeding ranch at Gilroy, California, and, with a two-year promise of backing, joined the Tour.

George's first victory was in the 1965 Lucky, when he beat Bob Charles in a suddendeath playoff. "It was probably the biggest thrill of my life," says George. "There were a lot of home folks around..including one kid I used to shoot arrows with back in the sixth grade."

Since then, Archer has won 10 other events, including the 1969 Masters.

1972 RECAP: Miller Barber did not have the type of year that satisfied him completely, but he did keep his streak alive of winning a tournament in each of the last six years.

His victory was a struggle, though. He had to fight George Archer for 21 extra holes at the Tucson National Golf Club to win the Dean Martin-Tucson Open. Tied at the end of regulation 72 holes with 273, and in the scheduled 18-hole playoff the next day, they still were deadlocked with 72's. After they both parred the first two extra holes, Miller ended it when he rolled in an 18-footer for a birdie.

The next week, Barber tied for fifth in the Andy Williams-San Diego Open, starting with a 74, and finishing 69-69-67. He was fourth in the Cleveland Open and tied eighth in the Byron Nelson at Dallas.

Miller finished with \$73,664, his lowest money total since 1967. Competing in 36 evenzs, he missed the cut eight times. This compares with missing the cut three times in 31 events the year before. His stroke average increased too, from 71.3 to 72.3, and that would be enough to drop his earnings considerably. He had 19 rounds in the 60's, and had five top ten finishes.

PRIOR YEARS: Just how well Barber can play this game was evidenced in the 1971 Phoenix Open. He shot 65-64-67-65 --261, which was 23 under par and the lowest total on the Tour since Mike Souchak's 257 in the 1955 Texas Open.

It also is evidenced in the fact that Miller has won nearly \$600,000 in the last seven years. And to think that he nearly gave up the Tour for good, when an earlier attempt did not pan out as well as he had hoped.

He was working at the Apawamis Club in Rye, N.Y., as an assistant to Jack Patroni and seemed settled into the role of club professional. At age 31, a few members liked his action, and sent him back on Tour with their blessings.

Miller certainly did not let them down. He has won seven titles, the first being the 1964 Cajun Classic.

Twice he has won more than \$100,000, but in 1971 it appeared as if he was heading for a record year. He had collected more than \$80,000 by mid-March with such efforts as the Phoenix victory, second in Hawaii and thirds at Doral-Eastern and San Diego. That pace was too warm even for Miller to keep going, but he did finish the year with 10 finishes in the top 10.

A graduate of the University of Arkansas, he also was a former Lieutenant in the Air Force. Miller has won positions on the 1969 and 1971 Ryder Cup teams.

many bac shots that it drained my confidence.
When I went back to my old game, my confidence was gone. I couldn't do the things I used to."

He finished the year with a 72.9 stroke average. The year before, it was 71.0.

After five straight years of winning more than \$100,000 and collecting eight titles during that span, Frank fell off to \$56,188 in 1972. And \$22,000 of that total came in the Match play, when he defeated Paul Moran, Lee Trevino and Babe Hiskey to reach the finals, only to lose a tough 2 and 1 decision to Jack Nicklaus.

"I tried to rearrange my game," Beard said, trying to explain his slump. "I've always been a hooker, but I felt that shot limited me. So, I straightened up and aimed right at the hole. I started to hit so

He finished the year with a 72.9 stroke average. The year before, it was 71.0.

He did manage four top 10 finishes, gaining a tie for fifth in the last event of the year, the Walt Disney World, and ties for ninth at the USI Classic and the Southern Open. In the latter, he cut loose with a blistering seven-under 63 the second day, followed with a 69 to be tied for the 54-hole lead, and then rocketed to a closing 76.

Frank had 17 rounds of 69 or less (compared with 37 such rounds in 1971), but very uncharacteristically,he also had 26 rounds of 76 or more.

PRIOR YEARS: One of the best players of our time, Beard has put together a record that includes 11 victories in 10 years and total winnings of \$807,618, the eighth best in the history of the game.

For five straight years, 1967 through 1971, his elegant, impeccable swing and a velvet touch with the putter enabled him to win more than \$100,000 and eight titles. His \$175,224 was No. 1 on the Tour in 1969. Frank was a member of the Ryder Cup teams of 1969 and 1971.

Beard always has taken a business-like approach to the game, maintaining that it is a business, and the purpose is to win as much morey as you possibly can. He leaves the jokes to others.

His success - until this past year - was due to his consistency. "The key is trying to eliminate the mistakes," he often has said.

Frank joined the Tour in 1962 after being graduated from the University of Flor-ida. Frank won the Kentucky Amateur golf title twice.

1972 RECAP: During the early part of the year, Deane Beman was bothered again by tendonitis. As Deane put it at the end of July: "This is the worst season I've had in 16 years."

In the 21 events in which he competed through the PGA Championship, Deane had only two finishes in the top ten -- a tie for the 7th in the Hope Classic, and a tie for 10th in the Canadian Open. He had earned only \$24,739 for 71st place on the money list. "In one way, I brought it all on myself," says Deane. "I live where it gets pretty cold and I was out hitting practice shots early in the year, off ice. I aggravated my left wrist and had to quit playing for about four weeks."

To aid in his recovery, Deane used a machine developed for him by a doctor friend in Olney, Md. "It's the only one of its kind," Beman says.

PRIOR YEARS: There were many who were surprised at Beman's decision to become a touring professional at the age of 29 in 1967. He had been one of the world's outstanding amateurs. Besides, he had a growing insurance business in Washington, D.C.

Among Beman's accomplishments before joining the Tour were victories in the 1960 and 1963 U.S. Amateurs and 1959 British Amateur. He was also a member of five U.S. Walker Cup teams, four U.S. World Amateur teams, and four U.S. Americas Cup teams. Many observers considered that Beman was not long enough to make good on the Tour. What they did not take into account was Deane's ability to compensate for this deficiency by becoming deadly accurate with his entire game, and particularly his fairway woods and putting.

"It works on radio frequency, and can be applied to any muscle group you want to build up...so far, this device has been a great help."

Deane started to make his move at Westchester, where he tied for 15th. He tied for the 11th in the USI and qualified for the Match play only to lose a close first round match to Jack Nicklaus, 1 down. After ties for fourth in the Southern and a solo second at St. Louis, Deane closed with a 67 for 279 in the Quad Cities to edge rookie Tom Watson by a stroke.

Beman ended the year with \$ 88,859. This topped his previous high of \$82,747 in 1971. He had competed in 32 events, finished in the top ten 7 times, and missed the cut 8 times. His scoring average was 71.7.

There is another factor prominent in the Beman success story. It's his burning desire to be a great player -- not just an average one.

"I didn't want to be one of those people who sit back in later years and tell their kids how great they could have been. I felt I could play out here (on the Tour), and the only way to prove it was to do it. If I didn't succeed, then at least I could say I tried."

Since joining the Tour in 1967, Beman has won three major events. He also won the 1971 Quad Cities Open, which that year was a satellite event played opposite the Ryder Cup.

1972 RECAP: The day Don Bies long will remember dawned on August 26 at the Country Club of North Carolina. He had to face Arnold Palmer in a first-round test in the U.S. Match Play Championship.

Bies (pronounced Bees) was at his absolute finest and he pushed Palmer out of the tournament with a most convincing 5 and 4 victory. It was the most one-sided triumph of the event.

"This certainly is one of the highlights of my career," the Seattle resident said. "I never missed a shot through the first eight holes and by that time, Arnold was four down."

He went on to eliminate Leonard Thompson, 2 and 1, in the afternoon. The next morning in the semi-finals, he had to challenge Jack Nicklaus. And challenge he did. The match was even through the 13th,

PRIOR YEARS: Although Bies had been making occasional appearances on the Tour for several years, it wasn't until 1968 that the opportunity arose for him to see more action. The Seattle Golf Club, where he was an associate professional, was closed for renovations during part of the year.

"I couldn't play at home since the club was remodeling the tees and greens, so I figured it was a good time to hit the Tour," he explains.

He played in 15 events that year, and did very well indeed. He finished fifth in the U.S. Open at Oak Hill in Rochester, N.Y. He added a fourth in the American Golf Classic and by the end of the journey, he had collected \$30,347, good for 58th place on the exempt list.

but a bad tee shot cost him the 14th and he went two down at the 15th when he dropped his approach in a lake. And that was the final margin, losing 2 and 1.

Spurred by this showing, and a tie for third in the Greater St. Louis Open, Bles went on to his most lucrative year, winning \$54,452. He entered 33 events, had seven top 10 finishes, a total of 23 "in-the-money" tournaments and a scoring average of 72.0.


His low round of the year was a 65 the last day in the Hawaiian Open, and it jumped him to a fifth-place finish. He had three 66s, including the second day at St. Louis - where he also had two 68s; another at the Tucson Open en route to a tie for sixth, and the third one on the final afternoon of the Bob Hope Desert Classic, where he finished in a tie for 33rd.

"My wife and I talked it over later in the year," he said. "We felt that since I had the exemption for all of 1969, I should try it."

It was a good move, because for the next two years, Bies did make the top $60\,$ exempted list again.

He fell off the pace in 1971, his best finish being a tie for llth in the Milwaukee Open, and he collected only \$22,771. But he stayed with it, and a most profitable 1972 resulted.

Back home, he is a five-time winner of the Washington PGA championship.

1972 RECAP: Homero Blancas moved back into the victory column, but it was not easy. The happy hombre from Houston had to turn back the talented rookie, Lanny Wadkins, in sudden-death, to do it in the Phoenix Open.

It helped to make a good season all the more satisfying. He accumulated \$92,977 and finished 20th on the money list.

Homero's year had a rather unusual start. He opened in Tucson and tied for 62nd. The next week in San Diego, he started 69-69 and finished with a tie for ninth. Then he missed the cut in Hawaii, skipped the Bob Hope Desert Classic, won at Phoenix and missed the cut again the next two times out.

His victory was made possible by his second-day effort, a 10-under par 31-30-61 at the Phoenix Country Club, and he finished regulation play with an 11-under par total, 273.

On the playoff hole, Wadkins needed a 15-footer for a birdie and he missed, while Homero dropped his three-footer for the victory.

It did mark the return of Homero as one of the headliners. "I've been having trouble with my driver for the last year-and-a-half," he said, explaining his problems.

Blancas had nine top 10 finishes in 1972. Four times he finished fourth, one coming in the U.S. Open. He also closed with a 65 for another fourth at Westchester.

His Phoenix victory put him in the Tournament of Champions, and he tied for fourth there - with a 65 the second day. It also put him in the Masters, and a third round 69 helped him to tie for fifth. Homero had a tremendous finish at Hartford to tie for fifth, going 71-69-69-64.

Playing in 31 events, Homero missed the cut nine times, and he had a stroke average of 71.7.

PRIOR YEARS: If there is one thing unique about Homero Blancas it is his ability to shoot some incredibly low scores. This past year, for example, his 61 at Phoenix was the low on the Tour.

Maybe it all started in 1962 when he posted a 55 on the Premier course in Longview, Texas to equal the all-time low scoring record. The only blemish is that the layout Homero played was 5,002 yards, while the original record, achieved in 1936, was on a 6,400-yard course.

He was a highly-regarded young player when he joined the Tour in 1965. He had a fine record at the University of Houston. He was named to two All-America teams and won

the Southern Intercollegiate. He then spent 21 months in the $\ensuremath{\mathsf{Army}}$.

His first year was so successful, winning \$26,162, that he was named the "rookie-of-the-year." His most impressive victory was in the Colonial National Invitation in 1970. Homero had four super days on the tough Colonial course, with 69-68-69-67. The victory came when Lee Trevino and Gene Littler barely missed long putts at the final hole that would have let them tie.

His earnings dropped off in 1971, mostly because of inconsistency. He did have eight top 10 finishes, but none of them were high enough to generate serious threats.

1972 RECAP: For over five years, Gay Brewer had wondered whether he would ever again know the sweet taste of victory. Brewer's last Tour win had been in the 1967 Masters, and for a player of his skills, that's a long drought. "I thought about it a lot," says Brewer. "I was wondering if I'd ever win again."

Gay's victory came in the 1972 Canadian Open. Leading after three rounds by three strokes, Gay shot 70 in the final round, and staved off challenges by fast-finishing Dave Hill (67) and Sam Adams (66), winning by one stroke with 275.

Brewer attributed his victory to new confidence in his putting. "My putting has been a disaster for 2-1/2 years," said Gay. "You name and I've tried it -- including cross-handed."

A few days before the Canadian Open, Nick Weslock (four-time Canadian Amateur Champion) played a practice round with Brewer. Weslock saw that Gay was crouching too much over the ball, and suggested Gay try what Billie Burke had told Weslock two years before, namely, stand more upright and hold the hands higher on the shaft. The advice worked like a charm.

Earlier in the year, Brewer had suffered a near-fatal bout with a bleeding ulcer being rushed to a hospital on April 5, the night before the first round of the Masters. Brewer made a good recovery, and acquired a new diet which includes only bmoiled food, nothing fried, and plenty of milk.

Brewer's year-end figures for the Tour were: 27 events entered;22 times in the money; cut4 times. He had one win, a tie for 3rd, and five other finishes in the top ten. His scoring average was 71.5.

Abroad, Brewer captured the \$65,000 first prize in the \$300,000 Taiheiyo Club Masters in Japan, where he beat David Graham in a playoff.

a long-time resident of Dallas, Texas, he
now resides in Palm Springs, California.
In his 17th year on Tour, and with career
earnings of \$562,678, Brewer has found
that travel can line the wallet as well as
broaden the mind.

Gay took up golf at age 8, and by his mid-teens, was one of the hot prospects in

the Louisville area. Winning the 1949 U.S. Junior, he spent two years at Kentucky U. before joining the Tour in 1956.

Brewer made one of the great comebacks in recent Golf history when he rebounded to win the 1967 Masters. The previous year, he lipped out his final putt, and lost in a playoff. Brewer was a member of the 1967 Ryder Cup Team.

In Britain, Brewer won the 1967 and 1968 Alcan eyents at St. Andrews and Birkdale respectively. Each win was good for \$55,000.

1972 RECAP: Billy Casper owned two of the more impressive streaks in sports when the 1972 Tour began. He had captured at least one championship in each of the previous 16 years; and he had six straight years of winning at least \$100,000. Both went down the drain in 1972.

In 20 tournaments, the closest Billy came to victory was in the Byron Nelson Classic in Dallas, where he lost in sudden death to Juan (Chi Chi) Rodriguez. He held the lead after three rounds with 202 (8 under), one in front of Rodriguez. But an even par round by Chi Chi was good enough for him to tie Casper and throw it into a playoff. On the first extra hole, Casper missed his 25-foot birdie attempt, while Chi Chi made his five-footer.

Billy only made the top 10 on three other occasions. He trailed Gary Player by

one stroke after three days at the PGA, but a final round 74 dropped him into a tie for fourth. He was tied with Jack Nicklaus after three rounds of the Greater New Orleans Open, but a final 76 dropped him into a tie for eighth. In the Bob Hope Desert Classic, he used a last-day 67 to gain a tie for seventh.

Entering 20 tournaments - the same as the year before - Casper made money in 15, missed three cuts and was forced to withdraw from two because of illnesses. One of the latter incidents came at the Kaiser after rounds of 71, 66 and 69. He was in second place as the last round started, but when dizziness set in, he dropped out after seven holes.

He had 19 rounds of 69 or less, and posted a final stroke average of 71.4. The year before, his average was 70.7.

PRIOR YEARS: Undoubtedly one of the greatest players of all time, Casper has won 48 Tour tournaments. He won the Vardon Trophy for the low-stroke average on the Tour 1960, '63,'65,'66,'68. He was named PGA Player-of-the-year 1966 and 1970. He won two U.S. Opens, 1959 and 1966, the latter in a playoff with Arnold Palmer at the Olympic

Club in San Francisco. He won the Masters in 1970 in a playoff over Gene Littler. He has been a member of the last six Ryder Cup Teams. His career earnings of \$1,292,028 rank only behind Jack Nicklaus and Palmer. He was the year's leading money-winner in 1966 and 1968.

1972 RECAP: Jim Colbert was not exactly the model of consistency, but when he was good, he was very good. Two of the best weeks were Milwaukee and Westchester, when he totaled \$53,350.

The second victory of his seven-year career came at Tripoli Country Club, Mil-waukee, with his rounds of 66-67-69-69. He won by a stroke over four others.

He proceeded to miss cuts the nextthree weeks, and then came back to collect his big check at Westchester. Although he trailed winner Jack Nicklaus by three, Jim's final day 65 was most profitable.

He had three other finishes in the top 10 - a third in the Robinson Fall Classic (69-68-71-67); and ties for sixth at Monsanto and the Southern Open.

One of his more disappointing weeks came in New Orleans. He trailed by two shots after recording 67-69, and then proceeded to shoot himself out of it with 74-79.

He entered 35 events and made money only in 19 as he failed to survive the 36-hole cut in 12 events and withdrew from four others. His scoring average was 72.3. Still he totaled \$85,302, easily his best year financially.

After he collected \$28,500 at Westchester, he said it provided a big breakthrough for him. "The last three years, I've been in the \$40,000 to \$50,000 range, but now this will put me well into the \$70,000, and I'm sure I can go higher before the year is over. But it's important. It's a big hurdle getting over the \$50,000 mark."

PRIOR YEARS: Colbert is another golfer who switched from one sport to another and blossomed into a winner. He was an all-State football star in high school and was given a scholarship to Kansas State University.

Playing in the rain and mud against the Nebraska freshmen, the five-foot-nine, 170-pound Colbert went after a fumble and a Cornhusker lineman went after Colbert. Jim lost a few teeth, and his desire to continue in football.

Golf became Jim's game and he made the varsity, going on to place second in the 1964 NCAA championship. Jim also added the 1965 Kansas Amateur title to his collection and moved onto the Tour the next year, after a brief stint as an insurance agent.

His sophomore Tour year was a good one, winning \$25,425, but a slump set in. In his own determined way, Jim fought back in 1969, reaching the peak late in the spring when he won the rain-delayed Monsanto Open at Pensacola.

His biggest money year came in 1970 when he collected \$49,212, aided by a second in the Doral-Eastern and three other finishes in the top 10.

In 1971, his biggest moment came when he tied for third in the U.S. Open at Merion, just two strokes in back of Lee Trevino and Jack Nicklaus.

Jim was introduced to golf by his father at age eight. He won the Kansas City Junior championship when he was 11.

1972 RECAP: After a great year in 1971, Charles Coody had to be content with just a very good year in 1972.

Coody played in 31 events in 1972, had one third place, a tie for third and three other finishes in the top ten. He was in the money 22 times, and missed the cut nine times. His scoring average was 72.0, a mere two percentage points above his 1971 average, but enough to make the difference.

Charles had an excellent tournament at Hawaii. He and Bob Murphy were tied after 63 holes with 239. Coody had four birdies in an outward half of 32, parred through 17, then faced an 18-foot on the 18th hole that would have given him a 67 and put him in a three-way tie at 274 with Murphy and Grier Jones. Coody missed.

Charles again came close in the Byron Nelson, his 275 total being good for a tie for third, two strokes off the pace. In the National Team, Coody combined perfectly with partner Tommy Aaron for the first round lead with a 62, but the team could not guite maintain that pace, their 267 total being five shots behind the leaders, but good for fourth place.

What happened to Coody in the L&M Open one would not wish on one's worst snemy, let alone a nice guy like Charles. He was leading by three strokes with three holes to go and stood at seven under par. He went bogey, double bogey for a 70, 286 total, and a tie for fifth.

At San Antonio, Coody was again in good position after three rounds. He had shot 207, three shots behind Mike Hill, the leader and ultimate winner. Hill shot a closing 69, while Coody slipped to 71 for 278 and a tie for fifth.

Coody was a member of the TPD Policy Board and will continue to serve in 1973.

PRIOR YEARS: Charles Coody grew up in Stamford, Texas, and won the state high school golf championship in 1954. In the next seven years, he won some 30 amateur titles in Texas, many while attending TCU.

After graduation, Charles spent three years in the Air Force. He qualified in 1960 and 1961 for the U.S. Open and was a semi-finalist in the 1962 U.S. Amateur. This earned an invitation to the 1963 Masters

Coody broke into professional golf in 1963 with a bang, scoring a hole-in-one in the second round of the Denver Open, in which he finished tied for 18th.

The Masters has provided Coody with his highs and lows on Tour. In the 1969 Masters

he held a one-stroke lead with only three holes to play. "I changed from attacking the course to defensive playing," says Charles, who bogied in and tied for fifth.

Coody vowed that if he were in the same situation again, he would "try to birdie into the clubhouse." The following week, in the Cleveland Open, he played attacking golf to win by two strokes.

Charles' finest moment came in the 1971 Masters with more of the same brand of golf. In the last round he birdied 15 and 16, then parred in for a 70 -- 279 and victory. Coody's win earned him a place in the '71 World Series, which he won, too.

Coody was a member of the 19"1 Ryder Cup Team.

1972 RECAP: When Chuck Courtney cut loose with a torrid seven-under par 64 in the final round of the Greater Milwaukee Open, he was one of the happiest men at Tripoli Country Club. An early finisher that day, he knew he had a chance to win, but, at worst, his 12-under par total of 272 would be good for a large check.

One thing Chuck needed was a large check, and he did eventually finish in a tie for second, one stroke in back of Jim Colbert. Courtney collected \$8,531. At that point, the Californian knew he was headed for his biggest money year in nine swings around the Tour.

But that was not the best. Two months later, he recorded 69-68-69-70-276 to tie DeWitt Weaver in the Southern Open, but he lost in sudden-death on the first extra

hole. Still, Chuck collected \$11,400 --his biggest payday ever.

When the season ended, Chuck totaled \$52,268, which was more than \$25,000 over his previous best year.

He would have won in Milwaukee but for the third day. He opened with a 69, added a 65 and then skied to a 74 before his tremendous finish.

Chuck added three more top 10 finishes, tying for fifth in Houston with a closing 69; tying for eighth in the Robinson with a final 68; and tying for 10th in Memphis.

In 1972, Chuck had 28 rounds of 69 or better and finished with a fine 71.7 average. He entered 36 events, made money in 26, and missed the cut seven times.

PRIOR YEARS: Since he joined the Tour in 1964, Chuck Courtney has been able to win three titles - the 1964 St. Paul Open, the 1967 Puerto Rico Open and the 1969 Tallahassee Open.

Yet Chuck has not been able to put together the consistency needed to win the sizeable checks. He was one of three rookies to win in 1964, and that was especially pleasing since his former home was in nearby Minneapolis. Chuck's family moved to La Jolla, Calif., when he was 11.

He won the Southern California scholastic championship. He won the San Diego County Open in 1960, which was no easy feat, and he also won a pair of San Diego City

titles. In 1958, he was runner-up in the National Jaycee championship.

His idol in his young days was Gene Littler, and he used to caddie at the club where Littler played.

Chuck recalls, "I used to beg the caddie-master to let me carry Gene's bags when he came back from the Tour."

Until his strong showing in 1972, Chuck's best year was 1971, when he won \$27,030. His highest finish on the money list was his rookie year of 1964, when his \$19,668 placed him 38th.

1972 RECAP: Statistically, Bruce Crampton put together a most interesting year. First, he earned well over \$100,000 without winning an event. More remarkable are the figures he produced in the Doral-Eastern and Florida Citrus. In these consecutively scheduled events on the Tour, Bruce had identical round-by-round scores and finishes, namely: 72-70-69-69--280 for ties for fifth.

Bruce's other figures for the year: 29 events entered, 26 times in the money, cut twice, withdrew once. He had 13 finishes in the top ten, including one solo second and a tie for second. Nine of Bruce's top ten finishes were a tie for fifth or better. His scoring average was 71.2.

In the Masters, Bruce had an indifferent start - 72-75, eight strokes behind Nick-laus, the leader. Then a third round of 69 put Bruce at 216, only four shots behind Nicklaus, who also led going into the last

PRIOR YEARS: Crampton has established himself solidly as one of the best foreign players on Tour with five consecutive years of winnings over \$100,000.

Crampton joined the Tour in 1957 after winning the Australian Open at the age of 20. His first five years were pretty rough on a boy from a foreign land who nevertheless persisted through five years of never meeting expenses in 80 abortive starts.

The 37-year-old Aussie took up golf though his parents wanted him to play their game, tennis. Solidly built and strong, Crampton was once known as "Iron Man" because of the number of events per year he played during his early career.

round. Bruce had his chances. He birdied the first hole, holing a 12-footer, and the 12th from six feet. But he bogeyed the third and had a double bogey on No. 7. Bruce's closing 73 left him at 289 in a tie for second three strokes behind Nicklaus.

"She's a tough old lady to shave strokes," said Bruce of the Augusta National course. "I have been playing here for many years and never have defeated par."

In the U.S. Open at Pebble Beach, Bruce played steadily. Rounds of 74-70-73 left him one stroke behind Nicklaus going into the last round. Nicklaus shot 74 and Bruce shot 76, good for second place.

At the time Bruce came up with one of the better lines of the tournament. "I'm working on my own slam; runner-up in all major events in one year (referring to his second place at the Masters)"!

When his game started clicking in 1962, Bruce moved quickly into the top echelon of money-winners. His career earnings to date are now close to \$800,000.

Crampton is a fatalist who frequently has declared, "If you are meant to win, you will. Like playing a difficult shot through trees, I play it strong because I believe it is my destiny to do or don't."

1972 RECAP: In 1972, Bruce Devlin enjoyed his most profitable year on Tour despite dividing his time between playing golf and designing golf courses with his partner, Bob Von Hagge.

While he only played in 21 events, Bruce was 17 times in the money, with two firsts, one second, and a total of seven finishes in the top ten. He missed the cut only 4 times. His total earnings were \$119,768, over \$7,000 better than his previous best year in 1970. His scoring average was 71.9.

Devlin's win at Houston did not begin under auspicious circumstances. First, his wife's handbag was lost en route, and with it \$25,000 worth of her jewels. The insurance on the gems had lapsed. Second, and of far more concern, Bruce's son, Kurt, was scheduled to have a hernia operation at Houston the Monday after the event was scheduled to end.

But after a rainout on Sunday, Bruce found himself going into the last round on Monday, with 206 and a 2-shot lead over the field and the worry of his boy's operation. The doctors rescheduled the operation so that Bruce knew his son was OK before playing the last round, and Bruce strolled to a two-shot victory with a final round of 72.

Bruce lost a heart-breaker to buddy David Graham at Cleveland. He lipped out a put that would have won on the 72nd hole. Then, after tying at 278 with Graham, Devlin three-putted the first extra hole, giving Graham a "life" when both bogied the hole. They both missed the green on the second extra hole, then Graham made his 12-footer and Devlin didn't.

Bruce made amends in the USI. With a 54-hole total of 206 and a two-shot lead over Lee Elder and John Mahaffey, Bruce had consecutive birdies on holes 8 through 11, stretching his lead to four strokes. He cruised home to a three-stroke victory over Elder, who finished with 278.

PRIOR YEARS: Bruce Devlin had to turn down his first invitation to the Masters in 1961 due to lack of funds. But when the second invitation came in 1962, he made the journey to the U.S. and has been on the Tour ever since.

Aided by a practice tee session with Jack Nicklaus, he broke through to victory in the 1964 St. Petersburg Open.

Devlin's most lucrative year was in 1970. He played in 19 Tour events, and won

money in every one. His scoring average was 70.9 strokes. He had nine finishes in the top ten. He won the Bob Hope Desert Classic and the Cleveland Open on Tour, then won the last Alcan at Portmarnock, Ireland by a whopping seven strokes. The victory was worth \$55,000.

Devlin is a former winner of the Australian Open and PGA, and French and New Zealand Opens.

1972 RECAP: Lee Elder put two of his greatest efforts back-to-back late in the summer, but all it profited the popular Washington, D.C., pro was two secondplace finishes.

In the USI Classic at Pleasant Valley in Sutton, Mass., Lee posted a 10-under par total of 70-67-71-70--278 and won \$22,800, but lost by three strokes to Bruce Devlin.

Two weeks later at Wethersfield Country Club for the Greater Hartford Open (Lee skipped the L&M Open in between the two events), he was even better, recording a 15-under par 64-69-69-67-269. But he only tied Lee Trevino, and then the Merry Mex beat him with a birdie on the first extra hole, sinking an 18-footer. Elder collected \$14,300. "I've played the last two tournaments in 25 under par and still haven't won," he lamented.

PRIOR YEARS: The rewards in golf can be most satisfying for those with the dedication and perseverence to stay with it, and such a man is Lee Elder. He worked long and hard just for the chance to get on the Tour. He played for a decade on the United Golf Association Tour, winning 21 of 23 events at one stretch.

Finally the time came, as Lee and his wife, Rose, managed to save enough to give it a try. Lee entered the 1967 Qualifying School and he made it.

While he has yet to record a victory, Lee has done well. The first year, he collected \$31,691. A nice chunk of that came when he tied Jack Nicklaus and Frank Beard in the American Golf Classic at Akron. Beard dropped out of the playoff early, but Lee carried Jack to the fifth hole before a Nicklaus birdie ended it. Ir all other respects, it was a super year for Lee, his best ever at the pay window, as he collected \$70,401.

Elder entered 33 tournaments in 1972, had 23 in-the-money finishes, including two more ir the top 10-a tie for sixth in the Morsanto Open at Pensacola; and a tie for 10th at the Colonial.

His 64 at Hartford was his low round of the year, but he also had a pair of 66s, one at Hawaii and the other at Milwaukee. He had a total of 25 sub-70 rounds as he compiled a 71.6 stroke average.

It wasn't until April that he really got his game going. He only finished five of his first nine events, and the best finish was a tie for 26th in Hawaii. But from that point on, Lee played the way everyone knows he can.

Lee consoled himself later, saying, "I showed the greatest golfer in the world that I coulć hit a few licks, too."

His earnings increased to \$53,679 in 1969, but they slipped the next year. However, Fe was back on his game in 1971, gaining the top 60 for exemption and cashing checks for \$49,933. Very consistent, in only 30 events he only had seven rounds over 75.

At the end of 1971, Gary Player invited Lee to play in South Africa, Player's native land. Because of South Africa's apartheid policy, the trip attracted world-wide attention. During the trip, Elder won the Nigerian Open.

1972 RECAP: It was another good year for Rod Funseth, the quiet, steady man from San Jose, Calif. He had four finishes in the top 10, including a pair of third places - at Jacksonville and Tallahassee.

Actually, he had a chance to tie for the lead after the regular 72 holes at Jacksonville, but his birdie putt on the final hole stopped just short. He finished one stroke in back of Tony Jacklin and John Jacobs. Jacklin went on to win the playoff.

At Tallahassee, Ron was five shots back after 36 holes, but he turned it on with a 68 - 69 finish.

He tied for fifth in the Florida Citrus

Open with a 69-68 close and tied for sixth in the Milwaukee with a blistering 66 last day.

Funseth has been known for his super rounds, and one of his all-time best came the third day of the Bing Crosby at Pebble Beach. He set a course record with a 64.

He also had a 65 the second day of the Kemper Open at Charlotte, N.C.; and a pair of 66's - the one at Milwaukee and the other at Greensboro.

He was in the money in 28 of his 35 starts, earning \$48,238. It was his second most rewarding year since joining the Tour. His stroke average was 71.8.

PRIOR YEARS: Although he has not won since the 1965 Phoenix Open, Rod Funseth has been a steady performer and earning a comfortable living on the Tour.

He has been close to victory several times, such as in 1971 when he lost in a three-way playoff for the Greater Greensboro Open title. Buddy Allin was the victor, while Rod and Dave Eichelberger settled for second.

He also had two third-place finishes in 1971, and his total winnings of \$63,567 made it the best year of his career.

Rod turned professional in 1956 at the age of 23 and after several seasons working as an assistant at various clubs, hit the tournament trail in 1961.

Among his more solid performances was a second place in the 500 Festival Open in Indianapolis in 1967, ties for third in the 1965 and 1966 Canadian Opens, and a third in the 1967 Phoenix Open. He also was the runner-up in the 1964 St. Paul Open, this coming despite being troubled with injuries in 1963 and 1964.

It is obvious from his ability to register the super round, that Rod does have a sound game. Some say he almost is too polite, too gentlemenly to be the consistent winner that many believe he should be with his smooth swing.

But he loves the game, and his fellow professionals will tell you that they can look forward to an enjoyable round when they are paired with him.

1972 RECAP: Although Bob Goalby's string of at least one victory a year was snapped at five, he did add suspense to the closing tournaments. It wasn't until his tie for 20th at the Heritage Classic on Hilton Head Island and his tie for fifth in the Walt Disney World - the last two tournaments of the year - that he clinched a spot in the top 60.

After his superb seven-under 65 the third day in the Disney, it appeared as if he might have a chance to keep his winning streak alive. But Jack Nicklaus was too much a champion that week.

Bob's best finish came in the Greater St. Louis Classic before many of his hometown fans. He had rounds of 67, 68 and 66 for the opening three days and was three strokes in back of Deane Beman. But, a final round 73 snuffed out his hopes as Lee Trevino nailed the victory.

PRIOR YEARS: Even Goalby is amazed at his record in recent years. One of the leading players on the Tour for many years, Bob has faced "do-or-die" situations for the last four years, and each time he did what he had

In 1969, he won the Robinson Fall Classic, which assured him of exempt status for the next year. In 1970, he won the Heritage Classic on the difficult Harbour Town Links, again to gain exempt status. In 1971, in the last event of the year, he won the Bahamas National Open by one stroke over George Archer, once again gaining exemption.

Again, in 1972, he did it with strong finishes in his last two tournaments.

His other top 10 finish was in the Monsanto Open at Pensacola, where he had two 68's and a brilliant final-day 65.

He was one of three players to have two holes-in-one during the year, getting them at the Monsanto and at Hartford.

Goalby had a slow start, mainly because of illness. He finished well down the list at Los Angeles and the Bing Crosby, and then was forced off the Tour for three weeks. It wasn't until his tie for 17th in the Masters that he was able to generate the strength for a good showing. He followed with a fourth at Monsanto, tie for 17th in the Tournament of Champions and tie for 17th at Houston.

Goalby's statistics for 1972 were: 34 events entered, 25 times in the money, cut seven times and withdrew once. His scoring average was 71.9.

Winner of 11 Tour titles, the high point in his career came in 1968 when he won the Masters with an impressive 11-under par 277. At the time, it was the fourth lowest winning score at Augusta.

Goalby was a four-sport athlete at Belleville (III.) High, winning 11 letters. He turned down major league baseball offers and enrolled at IIIinois U. to play football, but only stayed one year.

He turned golf professional im 1957 after winning six amateur tournaments during the previous two years.

1972 RECAP: The first half of 1972 was not a happy time for David Graham. Through the U.S. Open, he had earned only \$8,869, not good enough to be among the top 100 money-winners. From being an international winner, David was finding it tough making the transition to being just another rookie on Tour.

He had tried different putters, different sets of clubs, and even eye glasses, which he said: "bothered me to death on the course." He had actually developed a nervous twitch in his face. "I was a nut case," David said. "Somebody should have packed me home to Australia at that point."

Then, at the last day in the U.S. Open, Arnold Falmer spotted an old Tommy Armour putter that David was using. Arnie tried it, like it and asked if he could have it. David replied: "If you'll give me a set of those irons of yours in exchange." (Palmer had a set of Australian-made irons that Graham liked.)

With the new clubs, Graham went on to tie for sixth in the Western Open the next week and then won in Cleveland. Graham and Bruce Devlin were tied after regulation play at 278. Graham won on the second hole of the sudden-death playoff with a par when Devlin failed to make a 10-footer and David made one of about the same length.

Graham had mixed emotions about winning. "Bruce and I are very close friends. If there was anybody I'd like to beat it wasn't him. It's a hard thing when you are so close to someone." However, the \$30,000 first prize made an extra special present for David's wife Maureen, whose birthday fell on the day of the playoff.

David had worse luck in the other two playoffs he was in during the balance of the year. At the Liggett & Myers Open, Graham tied at 285 with Lou Graham, Hale Irwin and Larry Ziegler, but was eliminated at the first extra hole. And in the off-Tour event, the Taiheiyo Club Masters (Japan), he lost in a playoff to Gay Brewer.

During 1972, Graham played in 32 events on Tour, and was in the money in 18 of them. He had one win, one second place finish, and six times in the top ten. David missed the cut 11 times, and did not qualify 3 times. His scoring average was 72.7.

PRIOR YEARS: Graham began his tournament career in the late 60's, playing the Australian and Par East Circuits. In 1969, David tied for first place in the Singapore Open, after making his lowest-ever tournament round (a 62) but lost the playoff.


In 1970, Graham had a great year. Victories at home in the Tasmanian and Victorian Opens set up his world travels. He went on to win the Thailand and Tokyo Yomiuri Opens, then came to Europe and won the French Open.

"I won about \$65,000" says David. "If I had won that many tournaments in America, I would have made \$400,000."

Graham came to the 1970 ATP Qualifying School rated by some observers as a "sure thing" to get his player's card, but failed to get it.

The following week, David went to Buenos Aires where he and Bruce Devlin teamed to win the World Cup for Australia. Graham placed second in individual scoring.

In 1971, Graham won the Caracas Open and Japanese Airlines Tournament. He also qualified easily at the ATP School.

1972 RECAP: In 1972, Lou Graham had by far his most financially rewarding year on Tour thus far, while recording the second win of his career in the Liggett & Myers Open.

Graham played in 34 events, and was in the money in all but three. He missed the cut three times. Besides his win, he tied for second in the Houston Open, placed third at Atlanta, and had four other finishes in the top ten. His scoring average was 71.5.

At Houston, Graham had his chances to win. Seven strokes behind third round leader Bruce Devlin, Lou had six birdies in his final round 67. But he made bogeys at the 14th and 17th due to sand troubles, and finished in a tie for second at 280, two strokes out.

At Atlanta, Lou was at 208 after three rounds, two strokes behind the leader, Bob Lunn. Graham's closing 70 left him in third place by three strokes. Another of Graham's better finishes was in the Canadian Open when he led after two rounds with 136. He finished in fifth place, three strokes behind the winner, Gay Brewer.

PRIOR YEARS: Golf has played a large role in Graham's life since he was about 10, and his skill led to a scholarship to attend Memphis State. He was there three years although he has admitted, with a smile, "I didn't like school from the day I went into first grade."

He enlisted in the Army, but "I wanted out from the day I got in," says Lou. For a time Graham was stationed at Fort Myer in Arlington, Va., and was a member of the President's Honor Guard. He served with the select guard at John F. Kennedy's inauguration among other State functions.

In the L&M Open, Lou was in a four-way tie with Hale Irwin, Larry Ziegler and David Graham after 72 holes at 285. After David Graham and Ziegler were eliminated with bogies at the first extra hole, both Irwin and Lou parred 16. At 17, Hale hooked his drive into water. All Lou needed was a par, but he sank his 25-footer, and made a birdie.

"The last time I was in a playoff was at Hartford and George Archer won and J.C. Snead and I were second," said Lou. "I learned something from that experience and was determined to be aggressive...it worked."

"After my tendonitis operation," added Lou, "I had wondered if the ability to win had been cut out,too...but, as they say out here, when it is your turn to win there is no way to stop it."

Graham's other high finish was at the Heritage, when he tied for fifth at 284, three strokes behind the winner, Johnny Miller.

Out of the Army in 1962, Graham worked two years as an Assistant in a Baltimore club before joining the Tour in 1964.

Graham made steady progress on the Tour until he developed tendonitis in his left hand in 1968. This eventually necessitated corrective surgery.

His record over the past three years shows that he has not only recovered his touch -- he has improved it.

1972 RECAP: Although Hubert Green played
well enough to make the top 60,
it was not the type of year he expected from
himself. For one thing, he won nearly
\$30,000 less than he did in his exceptional
year of 1971.

Hubert did have three top finishes, a tie for sixth in Philadelphia where he opened with a 68 - one stroke off the lead; a solo seventh in the USI Classic in Sutton, Mass., thanks to a closing 67; and a tie for eighth in Phoenix, with a fast 66 finish.

The 66 was his best round of the year, and he also had three 67s, but he did have the problem in several events of suffering through a high round when it appeared as if he was ready to make a move.

Maybe the tempo of the year was set when he missed the cuts in the first two events, the Los Angeles Open and the Bing Crosby.

Hubert did have three top finishes, a tie for sixth in Philadelphia where he

His scoring average was 72.7.

PRIOR YEARS: Green found the perfect way to make his rookie year of 1971 a smashing success. He won a tournament, the Houston Champions International and he had to defeat veteran Don January, a former PGA champion, in a playoff to do it.

Hubert went on to earn \$73,439 in his first swing around the Tour, and he supported the triumph with a second place in the Greater New Orleans Open and a third at Tallahassee. He also tied for fourth in the Hawaiian and Greater Hartford Opens.

At New Orleans, Hubert was leading after three rounds and had a respectable one-under 71 the last day, but Frank Beard had a 68, and took the title by one stroke. The next week at Tallahassee, he again had the lead after three rounds, but had a final 75 while Lee Trevino recorded a 68 to take the victory. victory.

A tailspin followed his Houston tri-umph, as Hubert only had one top 10 finish in his next 18 events - the tie for fourth at Hartford.

The slim Alabaman qualified for the Tour in 1970 after failing to make it the year before. It prompted him to say, "the tour isn't as tough as the Qualifying School."

Hubert is the son of a general practi-tioner in Birmingham, but he went to Florida State University, from where he was graduated in 1968.

He was a strong contender for the 1968 U.S. Amateur title at Scioto Country Club in Columbus, O., and was selected for the U.S. Walker Cup team that year. However, he had to decline the latter invitation because of his prior decision to become a professional.

1972 RECAP: When Paul Harney was handed the winner's check for \$30,000 at the Andy Williams-San Diego Open, he still didn't seem certain that it was for real.

After all, the silver-haired club professional from Pleasant Valley Country Club in Sutton, Mass., figured championships were behind him. He was out on the winter Tour - as always - to win some money and enjoy himself.

At age 42 and gone from the Tour as a regular for several years, he had given up the thought of winning again. And especially this year.

"I used to spend three or four hours a day, hitting balls into a net in my pro shop getting ready to come out here," he said. "This year I didn't have time." He couldn't explain why he won, except to say he does like the speed of the greens in Southern California.

PRIOR YEARS: Harney has won seven tournaments during his adventures on the Tour and a nice piece of change.

Yet, when he won the \$30,000 in the Andy Williams-San Diego Open in 1972, it represented more money than he had won in any other single year except one. That was in 1970, when he collected \$40,316. His best that year was a second at Hartford to Bob Murphy.

Paul was born in Worcester, Mass. As an amateur, Paul captained the Holy Cross golf team and won the 1952 Eastern Intercollegiate. After his graduation, he served as a lieutenant in the Navy for two years and then joined the Tour in 1954.


Harney always has been an excellent player, and most observers have felt that he could have been a steady winner if he had stayed with it, instead of settling down in one spot as a club professional.

This past year, Paul entered 17 tournaments, and only missed the cut in three of them. He also had a tie for eighth in the Doral-Eastern with middle rounds of 69-68 in his only other top 10 finish, but he did play well enough to collect \$51,507, finishing 48th on the money list. His scoring average was 72.2.

He had some other good starts, such as 68-68 at Greensboro, and finished 71-73 for 30th place; and he had an opening 67 at Hartford and finally tied for 32nd. In one of his favorite tournaments - the Los Angeles Open - he tied for 12th with 71-69-71-68. He won this event twice, in 1964 and 1965.

In 1963 he left the Tour full time to take a job in Sacramento, Calif. Two years later, he moved to Pleasant Valley.

He nearly won two more titles in 1963. He tied Arnold Palmer in the Thunderbird Classic and then lost in sudden-death. In the U.S. Open at Brookline, Mass., he finished fourth, but only one stroke behind the trio in first place - Julius Boros, Jacky Cupit and Palmer. Boros won the playoff. (Harney's other playoff loss was to Tony Lema in the 1957 Imperial Valley Open.)

1972 RECAP: Labron Harris, Jr., reached another milestone last year, and it was most pleasing to his banker. Labron picked up checks totaling \$64,909, the high mark of his nine years on Tour.

He failed to cash a winner's check, but the big, bespectacled Oklahoman put on a tremendous display the final day of the Western Open, posting a 65, to place second and earn \$17,100. This was just two weeks after his excellent work at the Kemper Open in Charlotte, N.C., shooting 69-69-71-68 at Quail Hollow.

In the Western, Jim Jamieson was the winner by six shots, but Labron had thoughts of trying to nail him. "I was trying but maybe I wasn't quite bold enough. Some of my putts died right at the hole," he said.

PRIOR YEARS: It took Labron six years to make the adjustments needed for success on the Tour. At least, that is how long he struggled before reaching a profitable plateau.

When he first joined the ranks in 1964, everyone felt he would do well. He had a long-and-strong game, taught to him by his father, the famed golf coach at Oklahoma State. Besides, Labron, at six-feet-two and 200 pounds, was a tireless worker.

Obviously, in his case, more was needed. He had the skill to win the 1962 U.S. Amateur championship, but somehow, he could not relay it to the rigors of the Tour. For each of the first three years, he earned less than \$10,000.

Gradually, a little daylight began to appear in 1967 and it became a little better in 1968, when he increased his earnings to \$21,577. He lost the Philadelphia Classic in a playoff to Bob Murphy.

He had three other finishes in the top ten: a tie for fourth in the Robinson Fall Classic - he won there in 1971; a tie for seventh in the Atlanta Classic and tie for ninth in the Andy Williams-San Diego Open.

Labron still is trying to find more consistency in his game. He entered 39 events and failed to survive the 36-hole cut 15 times. It hurt in such tournaments as the the \$250,000 Westchester Classic, when he opened with a 66 and followed with a 77, eventually tying for 54th. At Milwaukee, he started with 65 to be tied for the lead, and then tacked on a 73.

Labron had one other 65, that coming in the final round of the Greater St. Louis Classic. He had a total of 26 sub-70 rounds. His scoring average was 72.2.

There was a slight slump again in 1969, but his check book was buoyed in 1970 when he finished second to Bobby Nichols in the \$300,000 Dow Jones Open, and picked up \$34,000. He earned \$56,220 that year, but exemption points were figured on a different basis then, and he still was not in the coveted top 60.

Then came the just reward in 1971. He captured the Robinson Classic in a three-hole playoff over Bert Yancey. Labron forced the tie with a birdie at the 71st hole, and saved a par out of a bunker at the 72nd.

The victory assured him of a precious item - an exemption for all of 1972. It was the first time he ever had enjoyed such luxury.

He also has one special distinction among his fellow pros. He is the only one with a Masters degree in mathematical calculations.

1972 RECAP: "The only goal I've ever set has been to win \$100,000 a year," says Jerry Heard. "If you win that much, you usually have to win a tournament or two."

The easy-going Heard, whose response to tension on the Tour is to hang loose and whistle "Take Me Home, Country Roads", won two tournaments in 1972, and confirmed many observers' opinion that he has "arrived" as a top player.

"That's what I'm working toward," says Heard. "I want to be as good as I can get. I want to win them all."

Heard's first win came in the Florida Citrus, but not a moment too soon for Jerry. Through the Doral-Eastern, the previous week, he had earned only \$15,115, the only bright spot being a tie for third in the Bob Hope Desert Classic.

Heard's two-stroke win in the Citrus put him up in the top ten money-winners, a

position he was not to relinquish for the rest of the year.

"I put an awful lot of pressure on my-self to win a lot of money fast," Jerry said after his victory. "But I know now you can't do it like that. You've got to take each round as it comes, every tournament as it comes, and just let it happen."

Heard's new approach continued to pay off in succeeding weeks. He tied for fifth at the Masters, finished second to Dave Hill at Monsanto -- Dave birdied 18, and Jerry bogied it for Dave to win by a stroke with 271 -- and tied for fourth in the Tournament of Champions.

And then it happened again, in the Colonial, Jerry and Fred Marti battled it out down to the wire. Tied on the 72nd hole, Jerry birdied and Fred bogied.

Heard's figures for 1972 were: 31 events entered, two wins, one second, one third, and 7 other finishes in the top ten. He was in the money 28 times, and only missed the

PRIOR YEARS: Jerry Heard took up the game at age 11 in Visalia, Calif-ornia. In less than a year he was shooting par golf as a result of daily practice at the driving range of a municipal course operated by his father.

He soon gave up baseball, although he was an excellent junior player. "Golf was more of a challenge," he says. He did stay with other sports, and thus never made a name as a junior golfer.


His golf game was good enough to merit a scholarship to Fresno State. Heard won several college events, but missed the cut the only time he entered the national colleg-

Late in 1968 he dropped out of school to attend the Fall Qualifying School.

Heard made no waves in his rookie year, winning \$10,236. He started 1970 on an even lower key: in his first five tournaments, he won only \$133 at Phoenix.

In May, 1970, he married Nancy and his fortunes changed. Two subsequent ties for fourth at Westchester and in the Kaiser, and three other finishes in the top ten netted a \$44,919 year.

In 1971, after several close calls, Heard broke through impressively, romping to a three-stroke victory in the American Golf Classic.

1972 RECAP: Dave Hill again played a limited schedule of 21 events in 1972 (23 in 1971), but nonetheless managed to retain his position among the top money winners.

He won one event, tied for second in another, and had six other finishes in the top ten none of which was worse than a tie for sixth place. He was in the money 16 times, was cut three times, and withdrew once. His scoring average was 71.5 (71.4 in 1971)

Hill started the year by losing a thriller to George Archer at Los Angeles. Dave got into a three-way tie with George Archer and Tommy Aaron at 270 by tanking a 30-foot putt on the 18th green. While the 18-hole playoff remained close all the way, Archer won with 66, with Dave and Tommy two strokes behind.

In the Monsanto, Dave's opening 64 put him seven under and was good for a one-stroke lead. It was also the lowest start by a winner in 1972. Dave described his round like this: "If I can hang on to the club, and get real lucky, I might even make the cut. I thought I'd shoot about 76, and that's about what I should have had." Hill continued to scramble in his second round but somehow shot 68, good for a four-stroke lead (equalling the biggest 36-hole lead in 1972). In the third round, Hill made 68 and upped his lead to five strokes. He hit every green, but said, "I'm still struggling with my swing." In the last round, Hill's par 71 was enough to ensure victory - just. Jerry Heard, who finished with a 65, went two ahead of Hill at the 16th, but bogeyed the 18th. Dave had to make a birdie on the 18th to win, which he ensured by means of a five-iron that finished four feet from the stick.

Dave also came close in the Canadian Open, but left himself with too much to do, going into the last round three strokes behind the leader, Gay Brewer, who stood at 205. Hill's closing 67 and 276 total was just one shot behind Brewer, and Dave finished in a tie for second with Sam Adams.

PRIOR YEARS: Ever since 1959, when Hill came on the Tour from Jackson, Mich., he has been a dashing and sometimes stormy figure on and off the course.

For all the fireworks, no one underrates Dave's talentfor the game. He can play. He proved this positively in 1969, when he ended up second on the money list with \$156,423 and won the Vardon Trophy with a 70.344 average for 90 rounds. He was a member of that year's Ryder Cup team.

He came right back in 1970 with a lucrative \$118,415. In 1971 he limited his play, quitting after the Hartford Open in September. Still, with six finishes in the top ten, Dave pocketed \$61,410.

Hill has won nine tournaments and finished close in several others, including the 1970 U.S. Open at Hazeltine, where he shot 288, finishing second to Tony Jacklin by seven shots.

1972 RECAP: Mike Hill was fighting for his "exemption" life as the Tour headed down the home stretch. Then the broad-shouldered fellow from Jackson, Mich., put everything together in the San Antonio-Texas Open.

His opening round of 67 placed him two strokes off the lead, but when Mike added a 68, he was off and running by himself. A 69 on the third day gave him a three-stroke margin. Through the pressure of the final 18, with so much at stake, Mike hung another 69 on the board and clinched his victory by two strokes over Lee Trevino.

Midway through the tournament, Mike said exactly what he thought, "It makes my objective - making the top 60 - look a lot better. That's why I'm here anyhow, to make the top 60."

The victory itself assured him of an exemption in 1973, and the \$25,000 first -

PRIOR YEARS: When you take a good look at Mike Hill's career record, realize that here is a man who never gives

Take 1971, for example. Prior to the Westchester Classic in late July, he had only two finishes in the top 10. He was 98th on the official point list. From that point on, he cashed checks in 11 of 12 tournaments to finish 55th on the exemption list. Even more impressive, of his last 34 competitive rounds, 24 of them were under par.

Mike will tell you, though, that he had it easier starting out than his brother Dave. "I have a sponsor and Dave didn't. Also, I have a great golfer to set me straight when things go wrong."

As a boy, Mike liked baseball better than golf. But he used to join Dave as a caddie and playing at Jackson (Mich.) Coun-

place check also put him well into the top 60. In fact, it increased his earnings to a solid \$67,067 and 33rd place. It became his most profitable year.

With all that safely put away Mike put his clubs in storage for the year and skipped the last two events.

He entered 34 tournaments and made money in 26. He had six top 10 finishes, with one of his better efforts being in the Greater St. Louis Open, where he closed with 69-65.

At the Milwaukee Open, he did just what he did in San Antonio - posted four rounds in the 60's (67-69-69-69-but had to settle for a tie for ninth.


While recording 22 rounds in the 60's, -- including a most impressive 66 at Akron Firestone - he compiled a season stroke average of 72.1.

try Club, which adjoins the family farm. An older brother, George, now an attorney, also was one of the group.

After high school, Mike entered the Air Force for 42 months. He then enrolled at Arizona State and remained for two years before returning home to drive a truck.

When Dave started to win, Mike turned to golf, and in 1966 made his first attempt at earning his player's card. He missed the next two years, but by 1968, the ATP card was his.

Two years later, in the Doral-Eastern Open, Mike broke through as a winner, too. And one of the happiest men on the Tour that day was brother Dave.

1972 RECAP: One of Larry Hinson's more disappointing days came on the cold, rainy afternoon which marked the final round of the Cleveland Open. He had led the tournament for 70 holes, but bogeyed the 71st. Meanwhile, Bruce Devlin and David Graham were finishing with birdies, and Larry dropped into third place. Graham went on to a sudden-death victory.

Larry opened at Cleveland with a 65 for his low round of the year. Although he had four other top 10 finishes, his perround stroke average increased from 71.7 in 1971 to 72.2 last year.

A pair of 68s led him to a tie for sixth in the Robinson Fall Classic. He started with 67-68 at Tallahassee and was tied with two others for the 36-hole lead, but finished 73-71 to tie for eighth.

He also tied for ninth in Houston and tied for 10th in the Bob Hope Desert Classic.

Larry continued to be bothered somewhat by an ailing shoulder - just as he was in 1971. Competing in 37 tournaments, he made the top 25 on 12 occasions. Five times, he had two rounds in the 60s in the same tournament. He made money in 27 events.

PRIOR YEARS: Hinson appeared headed for super-stardom when he won the Greater New Orleans Open in 1968 and followed with a spectacular 1970 in which he won \$120,897 for eighth place on the money list.

During the next year Larry was bothered by an ailing shoulder and the "old touch" never seemed the same. He finished in a tie for third in the Robinson Fall Classic in 1971, but that was his best and his earnings dipped to \$48,604. After Robinson, the pain in his shoulder became so severe he withdrew from three straight events.

Larry has the admiration of all his fellow competitors, though. He has a withered left arm, the result of a bout with polio when he was a boy.

Determined to make good in the game he loves, he turned professional in 1968 and finished fifth in that year's spring class of the Qualifying School.

The slim, blond from Columbus, Ga., has one of the more pleasing personalities on the Tour. He never has let his handicapped arm interfere with his progress.

At East Tennessee State, from where he was graduated in 1968, Larry won the College Division, NCAA golf championship. He also was quite a basketball player while in high school.

In 1970, after he set the Tour record for winning the most money without the benefit of a victory, he was named the recipient of the Ben Hogan Award for attaining the most success despite his handicap.

Larry also tries to help others, especially young polic victims, with visits to homes and hospitals to chat with youngsters.

1972 RECAP: Babe Hiskey's story of life on the Tour is one of frustrations and disappointments. But the sun began to shine in a big way in 1972.

Babe easily had his most successful year, winning \$49,489 and combined with his close friend, Kermit Zarley, to capture the National Team Play championship. He also did well in the Match Play, losing a tough one-up decision to Frank Beard. Earlier, Babe had disposed of George Archer and Dave Stockton.

The year did not start out promisingly for Hiskey. He failed to qualify for two events and missed the cut in another. At Hawaii, he finished 75th, even though he opened with a 68.

 $\frac{\text{PRIOR YEARS:}}{10 \text{ years, but few players have}}$ battled the odds as long as he.

For example, in 1964 -- his second yearhis Approved Tournament Players' card was about to be revoked, but he appealed and was given another chance.

When he started, he had a five-year contract with a sponsor. When it ended, Babe tried to make it on his own, and went broke. His father came to the rescue, gave him the financial aid he needed plus a new automobile when his old one gave forth with its final chug.

A lesser man would have given it up, but Babe fought on, and his reward came in the 1970 Sahara Invitational when he won the \$20,000 jackpot by one stroke. It gave him \$27,057 for the year - plus an exemption for all of 1971.

Two weeks later in Phoenix, he tied for 10th with three rounds in the 60s. The next weekend in the Jackie Gleason Inverrary Classic, Babe only tied for 68th due to a third round 81, but on the final day, he had a seven-under par 29 on one side to match the low mark of the year for nine holes.

There were other good days, such as his final 65 at Milwaukee, the 66 on the third day at the Kaiser and a 67 in the third round at Jacksonville.

Despite his good year, Babe finished it in about the same way he started, missing cuts in five of his last eight starts. He entered 36 events in 1972 and made money in 22. He had 4 finishes in the top 10, including a tie for 7th in the Little Crosby.

"Winning at Sahara was a victory for me and my dad," he said. "I probably would not have stayed on the Tour if it were not for him."

In 1971, Babe's best finish was a tie for seventh in the Western Open, and his earnings dipped to \$21,566.

One phase of Babe's life that has been most important is his spiritual devotion. He and Zarley are prominent in leading a number of the players in weekly Bible study lessons.

In fact, when they won the Team Play title at Laurel Valley last summer, Zarley commented to the Press, "The Preachers got 'em."

1972 RECAP: Hale Irwin has been on the Tour for five years, but in the last two, he has developed into one of the game's outstanding players. During that time, he snared one victory, in the '71 Heritage Classic at Harbour Town, but he was second in three events in 1972, and he easily could have won two of those.

In the Andy Williams-San Diego Open, Hale had a four-stroke lead with nine holes to play. He finally lost by one stroke to Paul Harney, after rounds of 69-68-67-72. "I didn't choke," Hale said later, "I suddenly couldn't hit the broad side of a barn with a putter."

Late in the summer at the L&M Open, Hale tied three others for the lead after 72 holes, and eventually lost to Lou Graham on the third extra hole.

PRIOR YEARS: While attending the University of Colorado, Hale Irwin was an excellent football player, good enough to make the All-Big Eight defensive team as a safetyman for two years.

"I never gave professional football a thought," Hale says. "I knew I wasn't fast enough or big enough."

Golf was his love, too. He won the National Collegiate championship in 1967. After he was graduated from Colorado, he turned pro the next year and made it through the spring Qualifying School.

He completed a respectable first year, winning \$9,093. He doubled that the next

Irwin also had a tie for second at the Kaiser, finishing 65-66, but George Knudson had the victory well in hand.

Three times Hale finished third -gaining ties at the Western Open and Sahara Invitation (70-69-67-69); and a solo third in the American Golf Classic.

He had a total of 11 finishes in the top 10, including a tie for ninth in the USI Classic, where a 69-67 start tied him for the halfway lead, but a 76-72 finish ended his hopes. His stroke average was 71.7, just one tenth higher than the previous year.

Irwin competed in 34 events in 1972, was in the money in 27, missed the cut six times and withdrew once.

1972 RECAP: "I had a lot of things to prove to a lot of people -including Tony Jacklin", said Tony after
his victory at the Greater Jacksonville Open.

"Even though you've won two major championships, people forget in a hurry. Even some of the pros are looking at you wondering if you're a flash in the pan... I had a chance to win at Phoenix and at Inverrary, and maybe at Crosby, too, but I was pressing. So this one is extra nice."

In the Crosby, Jacklin sported nickers. He was also tied with Jack Nicklaus one stroke off the third-round pace of 210 set by Johnny Miller. But Tony took two double-bogies in his last round 77, one at 18 where his drive found the rocks. He finished tied for sixth.

At Phoenix, Jacklin was co-leader after three rounds with Homero Blancas, the ultimate winner, at 204. But a last round of 72 left Jacklin tied for fourth.

Tony made a great run at Inverrary. In the last round, he began with birdies

on the first two holes, and was out in 32 using only 12 putts, and trailed Weiskopf by a stroke. But two three-putt greens coming in meant 38, a round of 70 and another tie for fourth.

Jacklin put it all together at Jacksonville. Tied at 283 with John Jacobs after four rounds, Tony won with a par on the first extra hole, where Jacobs had tree trouble and bogied.

Trouble and bogied.

Tony left the Tour after the Cleveland Open. He had played in 20 events, was in the money 16 times, and missed the cut four times. He had one win and four other finishes in the top ten. His scoring average was 72.3. He did not return to the U.S. as the British PGA brought out a new rule in 1972, stating that, between August 16 and October 7 (when most major Pritish events are scheduled), no British player can compete abroad in conflicting tournaments. tournaments.

At home, Tony finished third in the British Open, two strokes behind Lee Trevino, won the British PGA and had runner-up finishes in the Swiss Open and Dunlop Masters. He also won the Dunlop International in Melbourne, Australia.

PRIOR YEARS: Tony Jacklin got bitten by the golf bug when he started caddying for his father, a truck driver in Scunthorpe, Lincolnshire. He started playing almost immediately.

Tony's first victory was in the British Assistant's in 1965. Like many other young British pros he tried his luck in South Africa and the Far East. In 1967 he won his first major title, the New Zealand PGA. At home, he won several events, including the 1967 Dunlop Masters.

Graduating from the Fall 1967 ATP Qialifying School, Jacklin won the 1968

Jacksonville with 273, equalling the record score set by Doug Sanders in 1966.

In 1969, Tony won the British Open, the first home-grown champion since Max Faulkner in 1951. He followed this up with a seven-stroke victory in the 1970 U.S. Open at Hazeltine, and thus became the first British holder of the U.S. Open since Ted Ray in 1920 and the first Briton ever to hold jointly the U.S. and British Open Titles.

Jacklin has represented Britain in three Ryder Cup Matches (1967, 1969 and 1971) and played for England in four wo Cup events (1966, 1970, 1971 and 1972).

1972 RECAP: 1972 marks the year that Jim Jamieson broke through. Earning \$109,532, Jim finished 15th on the money list. In 37 events, Jim was in the money 27 times, cut eight times and withdrew once. He had one win, tied for second once, and had six other finishes in the top ten. His scoring average was 71.7.

In the Masters, Jamieson was at 213 after three rounds, only one stroke back of Jack Nicklaus. However, on the first hole of the final round, when Jim saw "what I thought was a perfectly good approach dance over the green I thought, 'I'm in trouble today.'"
But not more than many others. Jim's closing 77 compares with six scores among the finishersof 80 or higher. Jamieson's total was 290, four strokes behind Nicklaus.

Jim romped to victory by 6 strokes in the Western Open. He shared the first round

lead with R.H. Sikes at 68, but thereafter led the field the whole way on subsequent rounds of 67-67-69 for a 271, 13 under par.

Jim's victory was celebrated appropriately - ir champagne for both him and a crowd of his supporters from Moline and the press.

At the PGA, Jim also had a great chance but this time plans for a champagne party did not materialize. Jamieson was four behind Player who stood at 209 going into the final day. Jim had a couple of birdies which put him level with par and one ahead of Gary midway in the final nine, but bogies on the final three holes at Oakland Hills finished his chances. Jamieson finished in a tie for second at 283, two strokes behind Player.

Jamieson with Tom Weiskopf represented the U.S. in the World Cup in Melbourne, Australia, where the team tied for fourth place.

PRIOR YEARS: Jamieson is living testimony to marital bliss. As a sophomore on the Tour, he struggled early in 1970 to win money. In his first nine tournaments, Jim missed the cut six times. To top that off, he failed to qualify in his next three starts.

Jim dropped off the Tour and on April 11 married blonde Donna Pfister, an airline stewardess he met during the 1969 Danny Thomas-Diplomat Invitational in Florida.

Jim returned to the Tour for the Tallahassee Open, and his fortunes improved radically. He won money in 16 straight tournaments, finishing third in the Green Island Open and a tie for third in the Western.

"Two things contributed to my improvement," said Jim. "First, I was profiting from my experience on the Tour. Secondly, after we were married I felt I had someone to work for. I was able to set my goals higher."

Jim's performance also qualified him for the Alcan Golfer of the Year event at Portmarnock, Ireland. Here his more mature attitude really paid off. Blown around the first day by half a gale to an 80, Jim refused to quit, and finished 72-73-68 and tied for 15th.

Jamleson had a good year in 1971, winning \$40,804, but just failed to win exemption, finishing 62nd on the Exemption Point list.

1972 RECAP: Grier Jones captured his first victory on the Tour this year, and his second. He won \$140,177, finishing fourth on the money list. In 35 events, he was in the top ten 13 times, and finished in the money 30 times. His scoring average was 71.2. Some comeback for a young man who earned \$30,929 in 1971 and who finished 76th on the 1971 exemption list and faced qualifying in 1972.

"Last year was probably the driving force that helped me this year," Grier says. "I play better when I have a good incentive, and I sure had one when this year started."

"I set a few goals for myself. I wante to get back into the top 60. I wanted to win a tournament, and felt that if I could get into the top 25 each week I gradually could work toward a victory.

"I studied everything about my game. I decided it wasn't because of a lack of talent. I decided it wasn't my golf swing. It had to be something else, and that was attitude. Maybe it was just a little negative. I was letting those bad rounds get to me."

PRIOR YEARS: When Grier Jones was graduated No. 1 qualifier in the 1968 Fall Qualifying School for approved Tournament Players, he was immediately slated as a future Star of the Tour.

Certainly, the blond, personable Jones turned pro with most impressive amateur credentials. He won the 1968 NCAA Championship. His other titles included: 1967 and 1968 Big Eight Championships; 1968 Oklahoma Intercollegiate; 1968 Oklahoma Invitational, and 1968 Broammoor Invitational. He was also named to the 1968 NCAA All-American team.

His goal for 1969? "I hope to make the top 60...those Mondays are no fun." He not only finished 50th on the money list for 1969 he also earned the title of "Rookie of the Year."

Jones started 1972 fast with several high finishes. Then, in Hawaii, he was five strokes off the pace set by third round leader Bob Murphy. Jones tied Murphy with a final round of 64, and went on to win on the first extra hole.


Grier played well in the Bob Hope Desert Classic, finishing in a tie for seventh, at 349, five strokes belind the winner Bob Rosburg. But then at the Jackie Gleason Inverrery, Jones had to withdraw due to pulled ligaments in his back. Although he returned to the Tour a couple of weeks later for the Florida Citrus, Grier's back wasn't entirely right until around the middle of June.

Soon after, Jones hit a hot stretch. He tied for 7th at Cleveland, tied for 8th in the Canadian Open, tied for 2rd at Milwaukee, and finished 2nd in the National Team.

But the best was yet to come. After another short slump, which included a tie for 53rd in the PGA Championship and missing the cuts in the Westchester and USI Classics, Grier bounced back to capture his second victory -- the Robinson's Fall Golf Classic.

He made the same goal for 1970, and was again successful, improving on his 1969 earnings by nearly \$19,000, and finishing 36th on the money list. Then the roof fell in.

Now that he's back on top, Grier says that acclaim as a future star doesn't matter to him. "All I want to do is play good golf...It's nice to have people say you're going to be a star, but it doesn't really matter what people say. It's how you play that counts. The rest takes care of itself."

1972 RECAP: George Knudson was holding on by his fingertips, hoping to gain a spot in the top 60 exemption point list when he went to the Kaiser International in October. Then the easy-going Canadian proceeded to run away from the field, winning by three shots and collecting a healthy \$30,000 check.

Tied with Arnold Palmer following the first round, George trailed Arnold by two after 36 holes. He then notched a 66 on the scoreboard, and suddenly was five shots in front. Palmer? He had a 75 that day. Knudson now had taken his total to 15 under par. At one point during the final afternoon, he increased it to 19, but he coasted home and finished with a 17-under-par total of 271. "I wasn't worried," he said. "I didn't see how anyone could catch me."

The next week in the Sahara Invitational, he gave it another good run. He tied for the first-day lead with a 65, added a 70 and now trailed by two. But a third-day 66 put him three strokes ahead of Lanny Wadkins. Instead of completing back-to-back victories as he did at Phoenix and Tucson in 1968, George shot a 76 and tied for seventh.

He collected \$74,366 making it his peak year with seven top 10 finishes. A third-round 66 helped him to finish fourth in the American Golf Classic and a 67-68 close gave him a tie for fifth in San Diego. He also had a super finish in the Canadian Open, with 69-67 to tie for sixth.

Competing in 28 events, he failed to make the cut nine times. He had 23 sub-70 rounds, including a 65 and six 66's. His scoring average was 71.7.

PRIOR YEARS: Knudson is regarded by his fellow professionals as one of the finest shotmakers in the game. Yet, he has never reached the heights some believe he should. "When I was younger," George has said, "I'd spend every day on the golf course. But now it's work...not play."


He has won eight events on the main Tour and his career earnings of \$424,946 attest to the fact that he has had a comfortable living, nevertheless.

He turned professional in 1958, and took a few stabs at the U.S. Tour without any

success in 1959 and 1960. Then, the tempo began to improve, and his earnings increased to a high of \$71,360 in 1968 - the year he won Phoenix and Tucson in succession.

The next three years, he did well enough, but it always was a struggle to make the exempt list. In 1970, for example, he had to to win the Robinson in the fall to make it. In 1971, he finished strongly in the final events to grab the 60th - and last spot.

He won the Canadian PGA in 1964, and two two years later, he was the low individual in the Canada Cup (now World Cup) matches, competing for his homeland.

1972 RECAP: Bob Lunn finally found his proper "fighting" weight late in the spring and he is convinced it enabled him to win the Atlanta Classic, ending a 17-month drought.

At one point early in 1971, he was nearly 50 pounds under what he had been the year before, and it was showing disastrous effects on his game.

Gradually, he began to replace the pounds, but his game continued to be ragged through the early part of 1972. In 15 regular Your events, his best finish had been a tie for 25th in the Bing Crosby. He had missed six cuts and withdrew on another occasion.

Then came his four days at the Atlanta Country Club. After rounds of 67 and 68,he was one stroke in back of Jack Nicklaus. Bob had a third-day 71 and moved into a tie with Gary Player During the final afternoon, he

PRIOR YEARS: Few people noticed there even was a fellow named Lunn on the Tour in 1967. He only won \$ 1,871. But, big Bob, the son of a retired San Francisco policeman, came on in a hurry the following year.

He won back-to-back titles in Memphis and Atlanta, and finished with his biggest year ever, \$ 102,711. He has added a title to his list each year since, winning the Greater Hartford Open in 1969, the Florida Citrus Open in 1970 and the Glen Campbell-Los Angeles Open in 1971. In the latter, he had to defeat Billy Casper in a four-hole playoff.

In 1970, he topped the century mark again in winnings, with \$ 101,685.

turned in a 69 and edged Player by two strokes.

It was the sixth victory of his sixyear career, and his second in Atlanta. He followed with a tie for 10th in the Kemper, shooting 69-68-69 the last three days. Two weeks later, he tied for third in the Western Open, closing with 68-68-69.

He is back up to around 210 pounds now, and believes, "This is my most comfortable weight." He said he "felt good when I lost all the weight, but I must have been weaker than I thought."

Troubles returned at the end of the year though, as he failed to make the cut in six of the last eight starts. The \$51,114 he earned is his lowest money mark since his rookie year of 1967. His stroke average went up considerably. He had 72.7 in 1972, 1.1 higher than in 1971. In 33 events, he made money in 19, missing the cut in 13. He had three top ten finishes.

It is interesting to note that Lunn won the Citrus in Orlando in 1970 even though he was not expected to enter. He never had played well in Florida, he felt, so decided to pass up that portion of the Tour. Besides, his wife, Angie, was expecting their second

Angie suggested he play and win it as a present for the anticipated heir. He obliged, beating Arnold Palmer in a tense, final-round battle.

Bob joined the Tour after going through the 1967 Qualifying School. He is one of the the game's big hitters, and is considered a better putter than he gives himself credit for being.

1972 RECAP: Jerry McGee was a worried young man at the beginning of the year. He had been forced off the Tour for the final six months of 1971 because of an injured thumb. In his first three starts of 1972, he failed to survive the 36-hole cut.

Jerry finally went the distance in San Diego, but finished 77th. A flicker of new hope came in the Hawaiian Open, when he finished with a 68 and a tie for 35th. Two more high finishes followed before McGee finally started to get his game together

Jerry finished with \$47,751 to easily make the top 60 for the second straight year. As a sideline, he also won four automobiles in the "closest-to-the-flag" contests.

He had three finishes in the top 10, his most impressive being a tie for fifth

in the Masters on his first trip to the Augusta National. He called it, "the biggest thrill I've ever had in golf."

He tied for seventh in St. Louis with a 68-69 finish, and a tie for 10th in Greensboro with 67-69 for his middle rounds.

One of the busiest players on the Tour, Jerry entered 40 events and made money in 33. His lowest round of the year came on the final day, a 66 in the Walt Disney World Open. He also had three 67's - at Tallahassee, Greensboro and Robinson.

He also had two holes-in-one during the year - at the Greater New Orleans Open and the U.S. Open. He laughs, "All I got for those were the right to hit first on the next tee."

72 3 Jerry's scoring average for 1972 was

PRIOR YEARS: It is interesting to speculate what McGee might have done in 1971 if he had been able to play the last six months of theyear. He had won \$54,359 through the Canadian Open early in July, when pulled ligaments in his thumb sent him home for the year.

"The longer I was at home," McGee said, "the more I wondered if I'd ever play again."

His fast start in 1971 gave him a tie for second in the Byron Nelson Classic, two strokes in back of Jack Nicklaus; a third in the National Airlines Open; a tie for fourth in Cleveland and a tie for seventh in the Colonial National.

Fortunately, his total points were more than enough for exempt status. He only missed the cut three times in 24 tournaments.

Jerry joined the Tour in 1967, and, after three rather lean years, climbed to \$22,965 in 1970, breaking into the top 100 for the first time.

Although Jerry never hesitates to say what is on his mind, he also is one of the better "one-liners" on the Tour.

One of his most memorable came after playing 18 holes in the rain on a soggy Crawford County C. C. course in the Robinson Classic: "They say Mark Spitz is a great athlete....well, I'd like to see him swim 18 holes like we did today."

In the first round of the Glen Campbell-Los Angeles Open, John put a sizzling five-under par 66 on the scoreboard, and that was good for a tie for second place, one off the lead. Naturally, he couldn't hold that pace, but as the year progressed, Mahaffey proved he had the skills to excel.

John was one of the busier players, entering 41 events, and he was in the money 28 times, gathering in \$57,779, good enough for 39th place. He had eight top 10 finishes, including a solo second at the Danny Thomas-Memphis Classic. In that one, Lee Trevino

PRIOR YEARS: The folks in Texas knew all about John Mahaffey, the golfer, long before the rest of the world did.

He had achieved such successes as winning the NCAA championship in 1970 for the University Of Houston; tied for low amateur in the 1970 U.S. Open at Hazeltine; was a semi-finalist in the 1970 Western Amateur and the Trans-Mississippi; tied for third in the 1970 Southern Amateur.

He was named to the Collegiate All-America golf teams in 1969 and 1970 and was named a recipient of Sports Illustrated's Award of Merit in 1969.

Even back in May of 1971, before he had earned his players' card, he challenged the difficult Colonial National Invitation field in Fort Worth and tied for 12th.

won by four, but John's final 69 on the tough new Colonial course assured him the \$19,950 chack

He was a strong contender at the USI Classic, especially after his second-round 67. He finally finished tied for third, earning a \$11,800 check. His next best finish in a main Tour event was a tie for seventh at Sahara, where he started 68-66, but finished 73-70.

He did produce 23 sub-70 scores and finished with a respectable 71.8 stroke average. He also showed his strength in the few "second tour" events he entered, such as a second in the Vern Parsell Open and a third in the B.C. Open.

John has had moral support from one of the game's all-time greats, Ben Hogan, and that has helped him immensely.

"I met Mr. Hogan while I was working in the pro shop at Houston Champions for Jackie Burke and Jimmy Demaret," John recalls. "I played one practice round with him, and the next day, he asked me to join him again. Later that day, I was having dinner at the club, and Mr. Hogan came over and asked if I'd like a special invitation to the Colonial National in Fort Worth the next week. You know what I told him."

He also has played with Hogan "two or three" times since then. However, Ben hasn't actually given him any "lessons," as such. "He told me, 'You know how to play golf. Just go out and work on it yourself. That's the best way.'"

John did just that, and, obviously, it has worked out very well indeed.

1972 RECAP: As Fred Marti walked down the 18th fairway on the final day of the Colonial National Invitation in Fort Worth, he was tied with Jerry Heard for the lead.

They were playing together in the last twosome on the course, and it appeared as if Marti just might nail down his first triumph after eight years on the Tour. Marti moved into the tie when the usually-steady Heard suffered a double bogey at the previous hole.

But it was not to be for Marti, the likeable, broad-shouldered Texan. He dumped his approach in the front left bunker, came out strong and two putted for a bogey. Meanwhile, Heard rolled in a long putt for a birdie to win by two shots.

Marti opened the Colonial week with a 66 to tie for the first-day lead. He was one shot back after two days and trailed Heard by three as the final day began.

Competing in 34 tournaments, Fred finished in the money 20 times and earned \$46,269, his second best year ever. He had two other top 10 finishes, gaining a tie for fourth at the Bing Crosby and tie for sixth at Tallahassee, where he opened with a 67. He missed the cut 10 times.

Marti opened the year with a brilliant first-round 65, six under par, at Rancho Park in the Los Angeles Open. Three indifferent rounds followed and he finished far back.

His best round of the year was a sixunder-par 64 at Preston Trail in the Byron Nelson Classic during the third day. He tied for 13th there.

During the first round of the Phoenix Open, he had a string of six consecutive birdies, second best on the 1972 Tour.

Marti's scoring average for 1972 was 72.2.

PRIOR YEARS: Marti still is searching for his first Tour victory, although he did gain some satisfaction from winning the 1971 United-Ontario Open, a Second Tour event opposite Hawaii.

This husky fellow has been close on other occasions, such as his second place in the 1971 Kaiser when he finished with 68-67.

He has been in the top 60 in four of his last five years, missing in 1970. But his best season ever was in 1971, when he collected \$58,740. He had six top 10

Fred is a second generation PGA member, but he didn't begin to take the game seriously until he was 19 years old. When he entered the University of Houston in 1959, he began to think of the game as his career. By 1963, he was the National Collegiate champion and was named to the college All-America team. The next year, he turned professional.

His father and his Uncle Leroy, a onetime Tour player, helped him along, putting the finishing touches on his game.

An injured back slowed his progress in 1965, but he finally started to move up the ladder by 1966.

1972 RECAP: In 1972, Johnny Miller enjoyed his best year on the Tour to date, finishing 17th on the money list for \$99.348.

In the Crosby, Johnny had the threeround lead at 210, six under par, one ahead
of Jack Nicklaus. Then, as Johnny described
it, "Everyone laid down and died out there."
Johnny had three straight bogeys in the
middle holes, and then hit what he described
as a "perfect shank" on the 16th from which
he escaped with a bogey after a fantastic
trap shot. Meanwhile, Nicklaus, who led at
17, three-putted that hole, and he and John
tied at 284. At the first extra hole, Nicklaus holed for a birdie from 18 feet, after
Miller had missed his birdie from 25 feet.

In the U.S. Open, after three rounds, Johnny was only two strokes behind Jack Nicklaus who stood at 216. But a closing round of 79 left Johnny in seventh place, seven strokes behind Jack.

PRIOR YEARS: In 1966, a tall, blond, photogenic amateur from San Francisco named John Lawrence Miller, 19, placed eighth in the U.S. Open at the Olympic Club. He was a challenger all the way. Partisan natives predicted a bright future for the prodigy who first picked up a club at five years of age and who won the U.S. Junior in 1964. He won All-American honors while at Brigham Young.

When Johnny went to the 1969 Qualifying School, he won easy induction, and went on to make the cut in the first seven events. He had picked up a guick \$8,364 by the end of the season.

At the outset of the 1970 season Johnny came up with a round of 61 in the third round of the Phoenix Open. Jim Jamieson playing with him, said it could have been a

In the National Team, Miller and Grier Jones were six strokes off the third round pace of 196 (17 under) set by the ultimate winners, Babe Hiskey and Kermit Zarley. While Miller and Jones shot a spectacular 63 in the last round, they had to be content with second place, three shots behind.


In the Heritage, Johnny shot 71-65 and tied for the lead. In the third round, Johnny shot a 75, but still held the lead at 211. The high scoring was due to cold winds that gusted to 25 miles an hour. As Johnny put it, "I figured par at Hilton Head was around 74 today." The final day, the weather was kinder, and Johnny had another 65 for a total of 281, to edge Tom Weiskopf by one shot.

Miller competed in 30 events in 1972. He was in the money in 25, missed the cut four times and withdrew once. He had seven finishes in the top ten and a scoring average of 72.0 (71.4 in 1971).

57 or 58 "if some lipped-out putts had dropped."

In 1971, Miller reached the peak of a fine year when he carded a final-round 67 to romp to a five-stroke victory in the Southern Open, his first win on Tour.

However, the turning point in that year was his closing rounds of 68-68 in the Masters which put him in a tie for second two shots behind winner Charles Coody, who finished at 279. That gave Johnny confidence. "That's when I knew I could play with the big boys," he says. In 33 tournaments in 1971, Miller finished in the money 27 times and had a total of nine finishes in the top ten.

1972 RECAP: In 1972, Bobby Mitchell enjoyed his best year on Tour. In 30 events entered, he won once, finished second once, tied for second twice, and had three more finishes in the top ten. He was in the money 24 times, was cut only 5 times and withdrew once. He earned \$113,719, over \$37,000 more than his previous best year in 1971. His scoring average was 72.1.

Early in the year, he finished a solo second to Jerry Heard in the Plorida Citrus Mitchell's 278 total included a second round that would have sent a rookie reeling into a tailspin - a 78. Mitchell closed with 68, 66.

Then in the Masters, Mitchell played steadily throughout, but had to be content with a tie for second at 289, three shots back of Jack Nicklaus.

Bobby turned the tables dramatically on Nicklaus in the Tournament of Champions. Two strokes behind Nicklaus after three rounds, Mitchell picked up the strokes in his closing round of 70 and was all tied with Nicklaus at 280 after 72 holes. On the first playoff hole, a par 3, Mitchell rapped in a 20-foot birdie putt, while Nicklaus yanked his tee

shot left into rough and his soft wedge out would not hold on the fast green.

It was in the T of C that Mitchell complained of being golf's "Invisible Man," claiming that he deserved more ink than the press corps had given to date. "Ken Venturi says that I'm the most underrated player on the Tour," said Mitchell.

"Maybe I'm too plain," added Bobby. "I don't throw my clubs. I don't wear colorful clothes."

However, Mitchell has tried, in his own way to change his image. Late in 1971, he purchased a toupee. "At first, I did it for a joke," he says. "But I got to liking it and it felt good, so I just leave it on all the time now. I think it looks good."

Bobby went on to two other fine efforts late in the year. In the Kaiser, he played very steady golf - 277 - but finished fifth behind Knudson who shot 271. And in the Walt Disney Open, Mitchell again put a bad round behind him - an opening 73 - with subsequent rounds of 69-68-66 to get a piece of second place.

PRIOR YEARS: Mitchell did not have an amateur record "because I never was an amateur. I enjoyed the game as a kid and so I decided to become a professional at 15."

Mitchell worked in the shop and later on the teaching tee at Danville, Va., Golf Club. In 1965, he won two tournaments with the same title, the Virginia Open. "One was sponsored by the State amateur association and the other by the PGA," he explains. "They've gotten together now so that there's only one state open now."

At 22, Bobby decided he felt ready to go on the Tour. "I was scared," he said. "I had played well locally, but wasn't sure I belonged on the Tour."

However, after his first two years, Bobby improved steadily. In 1970, he earned exemption from qualifying. Then Bobby was invited to the 1971 Masters on the strength of finishing in the top 16 in the 1970 U.S. Open. Later in 1971, Mitchell broke through by winning at Cleveland by seven strokes with 66-64-67-65--262.

1972 RECAP: It took Bob Murphy a few days to get started at the beginning of the year, but once he did, he cut loose with one of the most impressive string of finishes of 1972.

He missed the cut in Los Angeles and then opened the Bing Crosby with two unspectacular rounds of 76 and 74. From that point on, Mr. Murphy was some kind of player.

He closed the Crosby with 69-69 to tie for sixth and in the next eight tournaments, he had six finishes in the top 10. By mid-March, he had accumulated more than \$57,000.

His closest brush with victory came in the Hawaiian Open, where he started with a 65 to tie for the lead, held a one-stroke advantage after the next two rounds, and finally was tied at the wire by Grier Jones, who closed with a 64. In the playoff, Jones won with a par on the first extra hole.

Bob also tied for fourth in Tucson; had

solo fifth places at the Bob Hope and Jacksonville, a tie for fifth in the Florida Citrus (where he opened with 76 and closed 66-69-69), and a tie for ninth in San Diego. He had 13 rounds in the 60s in that stretch and finished the year with 25.

He had another hot stretch in the spring, with a fifth at the Colonial, tie for seventh at Atlanta and a tie for sixth at Philadelphia, where he started 68-69 and was one shot off the pace.

Bob entered 30 tournaments and totaled 10 finishes in the top 10. He missed the cut only five times and compiled a stroke average of 72.0. His total winnings added up to \$83,259 and 26th place, making this the third best of five years on tour.

In the fall, Murphy ventured to Australia, and despite the cold weather, he won the Wills Masters. Bob always has said he can't play when it gets too cold, but he laughed after his triumph and said, "I guess I won't be able to say that anymore."

PRIOR YEARS: Murphy had strong credentials when he joined the Tour in 1968, and he didn't wait long to let the world know just how well he could play the game.

His first year was sensational, to say the least, winning \$105,595, which stood as the record for the most money won by a firstyear man until Lanny Wadkins passed it in 1972.

But Bob had a stretch in the summer of '68 that may never be matched by a rookie. He was second in the rich Westchester Classic and won back-to-back titles at Philadelphia and in the Thunderbird, all in a three-week period.

Born in Brooklyn, N.Y., but now a devout Floridian, Murphy is a little on

the heavy side at 5-10, 215 pounds. The most unusual part of it all, though, is that a shoulder injury forced him out of baseball into golf. He was a standout pitcher with a scholarship to the University of Florida.

So, at age 19, he started to play golf seriously and worked his way on the University of Florida team.

The result was that three years later, he won the U.S. Amateur and the NCAA championships. After he was graduated in 1966, he passed through the 1967 Qualifying School.

He has one other Tour victory, in the 1970 Greater Hartford Open, and he also passed the Century mark that year, too, with \$120,639.

His best chance for victory came in the Dean Martin-Tucson Open. He led as late as the 69th hole, but he three-putted the next and took a double bogey at the home hole. On the latter, as he was addressing his tee shot, a baby began to cry. Bobby backed away, but when he stepped up again, he promptly put his drive in the water. A par

PRIOR YEARS: If anyone ever decides to give away a "nice guy in sports" award, Nichols would be one of the leading candidates. He is one of the top players on the Tour, too.

Over the years, he has been one of the game's more consistent performers, and has a knack for winning big ones. For example, in 1964, he won the PGA championship with an impressive display of shotmaking. Later the same year, he added the lucrative Carling World title. He missed winning the 1967 Masters by one stroke when his close friend, Gay Brewer, closed with a 67. In 1970, the year of the \$300,000 Dow Jones Open, Bobby won it to take home \$60,000.

at the hole would have moved Nichols into the playoff with Miller Barber and George Archer. "Shucks, I wasn't trying to make par there anyway. I wanted a birdie to win," he said.

He did have a slightly better finish, a tie for second in the Kaiser International. He used a hole-in-one on the final day to help him post a course record 64 at the Silverado Country Club in Napa, Calif., but he still fell three shots short of winner George Knudson.

He closed with a 67 at Harbour Town to tie for third in the Heritage. Among his other leading finishes were a tie for fourth at San Antonio, where he had a 69-68 close; a tie for fifth in Team Play with George Archer; tie for sixth in the Western; tie for seventh in the Colonial where he had middle rounds of 69-68; tie for ninth at Jacksonville and a tie for 10th at Bob Hope, thanks to a 68-66 finish.

Bobby was a football and basketball star at St. Xavier High in Louisville, Ky. until a car crash threatened to wipe out his athletic career. He suffered a broken pelvis, had a brain concussion and spinal damage. He was hospitallized for more than three months. During his recuperation, he turned more and more to golf. His game developed fully at Texas A&M, where he won the 1956 Southwest Conference title.

In 1962, he received the Ben Hogan award for his courageous recovery from the accident. And, in 1967, he was named to the U. S. Ryder Cup team.

1972 RECAP: While Jack Nicklaus did not make the Grand Slam in 1972, his record was still fantastic. On the Tour, he competed in 19 events, and was never out of the money. He won seven, was second twice, tied for second once, and was 14 times in the top ten. His scoring average was 70.2 as he set a new money-winning record of \$320,542 for a single year.

Nicklaus started his year with a win in the Bing Crosby, defeating Johnny Miller on the first hole of sudden-death. Then, after finishing second to Tom Weiskopf in the Jackie Gleason Inverrary, Jack gained his second victory in the Doral-Eastern the next week. This boosted his career earnings to \$1,477,200.86, overtaking for the first time the previous record holder, Arnold Palmer.

PRIOR YEARS: After 11 years on the Tour, Nicklaus has won just about every title and honor in golf. He has won the Masters in 1963, 1965, 1966 and 1972; the U.S. Open in 1962, 1967 and 1972; the British Open in 1966 and 1970 and the PGA Championship in 1963 and 1971.

He also has won the World Series in 1962, 1963, 1967 and 1970; the Australian Open in 1964, 1968 and 1971, and the U.S. Amateur in 1959 and 1961.

Nicklaus' next win was at the Masters where his total of 286 left Weiskopf, Bobby Mitchell and Bruce Crampton three strokes behind. But Bobby Mitchell turned the tables on Jack in the Tournament of Champions, winning with a birdie on the first playoff hole.


In the U.S. Open, Jack's winning 290 was three ahead of runner-up Crampton. The victory tied Bobby Jones' record of 13 major championships.

At Muirfield, hopes for the Grand Slam were dashed as Jack finished in second place, one shot behind Lee Trevino's 278.

Nicklaus other wins in 1972 were in the Westchester Classic, the U.S. Professional Match Play Championship and the Walt Disney World Open.

Nicklaus has been PGA Player of the Year in 1967 and 1972; leading money-winner in 1964, 1965, 1967, 1971 and 1972, was a member of the 1969 and 1971 Ryder Cup Teams. In the World Cup, he was a member of the winning U.S. Teams in 1963, 1964, 1966, 1967 and 1971 and was low individual scorer in 1963, 1964 and 1971.

1972 RECAP: It was a most frustrating year for Arnold Palmer. He tried contact lenses and finally settled on glasses, but still could not see a victory - for the first time in his career.

Arnold had ten finishes in the top 10 and collected \$84,181, but it broke a string of six years over \$100,000. His scoring average went to 71.4 from 70.6.

He finished second to Lanny Wadkins at the Sahara, parring the final hole when a birdie would have forced a playoff. He was third in the U.S. Open at Pebble Beach, four strokes in back of Jack Nicklaus.

PRIOR YEARS: Arnold Palmer grew up alongside the Latrobe (Pa.) Country Club where his father was and still is the head professional.

As a youngster, he played and practiced the game every chance he had. A tour at Wake Forest College and a two-year stretch in the Coast Guard preceded his decision to turn professional in 1954, not long after he won the U.S. Amateur championship.

By the middle of 1955, he had his first victory, in the Canadian Open. Since then, Arnold has won nearly every championship in-

He also tied for third at Greensboro, one stroke behind George Archer and Tommy Aaron (Archer won the playoff). But Arnold had a two-stroke lead with three holes to play, and he took a triple-bogey six at the 16th

He had fast finishes to gain sixth places at the Bob Hope (66-69) and the Byron Nelson (67-68). In the Kaiser International, he tied for 11th. He had a two-stroke lead after the first two days, but a 75-74 finish killed his hopes.

Palmer entered 22 events in 1972 and made money in 19 of them.

It has also been habit for Gary to win one or two events a year in this country despite his limited play. 1972 was differ-ent in that Gary added another notch to his belt of major titles--a win in the PGA Championship. Championship.

Gary's first victory of the year was at New Orleans. Player was in the pack all the way, and started the last round three strokes off the pace (207) set by Billy Casper and Jack Nicklaus. But, as Billy and Jack faltered, Gary had birdies at the second, 8th and 1lth holes, and parred in for a 69 and a 279 total which edged Nicklaus by a stroke.

"I only missed six greens the entire tournament", says Gary, "and I don't remem-ber ever doing that before."

Gary lost a close one to Bob Lunn at Atlanta. Tied at 206 with Lunn after three rounds, Gary lost ground when Lunn eagled

the second hole. Then, Gary drew even at the 12th with two successive birdies. But a bog-ey at 15 spoiled Gary's round and his 71 and 277 total was two shy of Lunn's winning score.

In the PGA Championship, Gary was leading by one stroke after three rounds. But, as Gary said, "This tournament doesn't start until the 10th hole tomorrow (the final round)." And so it was to prove. Gary started, bogey, birdie, bogey, bogey, and it was a different ball game. Ten players were within a stroke of the lead at one point. But the "Black Knight" outlasted them in the end, producing a career 9-iron at Oakland Hills' lôth hole over the water to within four feet of the hole to put the issue to rest. Gary's 281 total was two ahead of runners-up Jim Jamieson and Tommy Aaron. Aaron.

Gary had a nice bonus to his PGA win, taking home the \$50,000 first prize in the World Series.

Gary's statistics on the Tour for 1972: played 15 events, in money 14 times; won 2, second once, top ten eight times. His scoring average was 71.1.

PRIOR YEARS: "A great golfer is a man who can win anywhere in the world", says Player. By his own definition, Gary definitely qualifies. He stands with Gene Sarazen, Ben Hogan and Jack Nicklaus as the only golfers who won golf's four major titles. Gary won the U.S. Open in 1965, the British Jpen in 1959 and 1968, the PGA in 1962 and 1972 and the Masters in 1961.

Among his other triumphs are: Australian Open in 1958, 1962, 1963, 1965, 1969, and 1970; Australian PGA, 1957; Piccadilly World Match Play in 1965, 1966, 1968 and 1971; Canada (now World) Cup team and individual low in 1965; over a dozen South African titles, and wins in the World Series in 1965 and 1972.

1972 RECAP: Six finishes in the top 10 helped to assure Phil Rodgers of a good year, but the Southern Californian could not keep his game under the control he would have liked.

He finished in the money in 22 of 35 events in 1972, as compared to 30 times in the same number of events the year before.

Still, Phil managed to collect \$53,511 for his third best season since joining the Tour in 1961. His best finish was a third in the San Antonio-Texas Open, finishing third with a strong 67 the last day.

PRIOR YEARS: Rodgers has had an up-and-down career while on the professional tournament trail, partially because of physical ailments, but when he has been good, he has been very, very good.

Phil joined the Tour in 1961 as a 23year old after a strong amateur career. By his sophomore season, he was a winner, capturing the Los Angeles and Tucson Opens in 1962 and finishing 11th on the money list with \$32,181. He also chased Jack Nicklaus and Arnold Palmer to the wire in the 1962 U.S. Open at Oakmont, finally gaining a tie for third.

He added the Texas Open title to his collection in 1963, and lost the British Open the same year in a playoff to New Zealand's Bob Charles. Then, the first slump set in.

Phil couldn't find the right combination again until 1966, and he came on strong to win the Doral and Buick Opens, gathering in \$68,360, finishing sixth on the money list.

Twice he was fourth, in the Colonial National where a last day 74 cut into his hopes, and in the Canadian Open, where he blazed three strong rounds of 68-68-69 after an opening 72.

A third-round 68 helped him to a tie for seventh in the PGA, and he also had ties for ninth in the Andy Williams-San Diego Open and the Jackie Gleason Inverrary Classic.

He was able to post 21 scores in the 60s, with his best being a 65 the last day in the Bob Hope Desert Classic. However, in stroke averages, he put a 72.1 on the board, as compared to 71.4 the year before.

A hand injury brought on by an admirer's crushing handshake, partially was responsible for the next slump in 1967, and it carried through 1968.

He started to put his game together again in 1969, continued to improve in 1970 and by 1971 he cashed in his most profitable year, winning \$71,399. He was runner-up to DeWitt Weaver in the Match Play, third in the Canadian Open and had six top 10 finishes.

Most important, Phil only missed two cuts, while finishing in the money 30 times in 1971.

A native of San Diego and a super football fan, Phil started in golf at age 10. He won the International Jayces Junior title at 17. He went to the University of Houston and captured the NCAA crown in 1967. He also reached the quarter-finals of the U. S. Amateur.

1972 RECAP: Juan (Chi Chi) Rodriguez has been one of the clown princes of golfing royalty for many years, but decided to change his image - and hopefully his fortunes - by concentrating harder on his game.

"I never really concentrated on the golf course," says Chi Chi. I always wanted to be liked by everybody. I used to do a lot of things that took my mind off my game."

The reason for this sudden change of heart? In 1971, he finished 74th on the official points list and, for the first time in 10 years, lost his exempt status.

Besides greater concentration on his game, Chi Chi credits his excellent 1972 season to a "lesson" from Gary Player at the Jackie Gleason Inverrary Classic. "He has helped me," says Chi Chi. "He said: I've been watching you for six years and you always have moved your head on your backswing. You come off the ball."

Chi Chi was in position to win the Greater Greensboro, but bogeyed the 16th and 17th holes to finish in a tie for third place.

But all this was forgotten when he won the Byron Nelson Golf Classic. Billy Casper and Chi Chi were tied at 273 after regulation play. On the first hole of sudden-death, Chi Chi made a birdie the hard way at the 555-yard 15th. Drive into the trees, second out, but short, as Casper drove down the middle and also was short with his second. Chi Chi's pitch finished five feet from the pin. Casper missed from 25 feet, and Chi Chi holed his putt for victory.

Chi Chi was again in position to win at Philadelphia. Leading after three rounds with 209, Rodriguez lost the lead to J.C. Snead when he three-putted the short 16th. He lost by one stroke to Snead's 282.

However, 1972 was by far Chi Chi's most lucrative year on Tour, topping by over \$55, 000 his previous best year in 1968. Chi Chi played in 32 events, was in the money 27 times and was cut five times. He won one, was second once, and had eight other finishes in the top ten. His scoring average was 71.3.

PRIOR YEARS: Rodriguez grew up in San Juan, Puerto Rico. His father worked on a plantation and it was there that chi Chi taught himself to play golf by making clubs out of the limbs of guava trees and balls out of hammered tin cans.

At 19, Chi Chi joined the Army so that he could help support the household. "People laugh at me for joining the Army to make money, but it was more than I could make caddying at Dorado Beach," says Chi Chi.

When Chi Chi got out of the Army, he returned to San Juan, where Pete Cooper and the late Ed Dudley helped him refine his game.

Joining the Tour in 1960, Chi Chi never finished higher than sixth until he broke through in 1963 to win the Denver Open.

Recently, Chi Chi has been troubled by injuries. In 1970, he said, "My arms were painful more days than they were sound." Finally, in November of that year a New York surgeon removed calcium chips from Chi Chi's left elbow, and did other corrective surgery that relieved the pain.

1972 RECAP: When Bob Rosburg faced the press corps after the final round of the Bob Hope Desert Classic, he had tears in his eyes. "Just to come back and prove to myself after 11 years that I still could win. Well...words can't explain it."

That is what happened, too. The last time he had the winning feeling was in the 1961 Bing Crosby. But, under the warm sun of Palm Desert, Calif., Rosburg found the magic touch again. He had rounds of 66-69-72-70-67 for 16-under par and a one-stroke decision over Lanny Wadkins.

He said help he received from Claude Harmon in the fall of 1971 improved his game tremendously, and his marriage, also in the fall, to Eleanor Kane, improved his mental outlook.

Bob went on to enjoy his most successful season, financially, since joining the

Tour in 1953. He pocketed \$78,887 for the 27th place on the money list. He had 31 starts and drew checks from 18 of them. Five times he missed the cut, and he did withdraw from seven others. At one stretch, it was an injured hand that gave him problems.

Rosburg, who turned 46 in the fall, had five other top 10 finishes, and four of them came with good closing rounds. He shot a 68 the last round at Doral and tied for second; had a 66 close at Los Angeles and tied for fifth; had a 65 the last day at Hawaii and tied for sixth , and a 68 the last day at Westchester let him finish tied for ninth. He also tied for ninth in the Tournament of Champions. He had one other 65, that in the third round of the Bing Crosby. In all, he had 15 sub-70 rounds and finished with a 72.4 stroke average.

This past fall, Bob was named to the Tournament Players' Division Policy Board.

PRIOR YEARS: Rosburg received his first taste
of the Tour in 1953, and only
won \$ 150. The next year he won two tournaments, the Brawley Open and the Miami Open.
His cash return for the year - in those days
of small purses - was \$ 8,622. He also won
the 1956 Motor City Open and 1956 San Diego
Open and the 1961 Bing Crosby. In 1959, he
captured the PGA Championship in Minneapolis,
finished second to Billy Casper in the U.S.
Open and was named to the Ryder Cup Team.

In 1969, he tied for second in the U.S. Open behind Orville Moody at the Houston

Champions course, and in 1971, tied for third in the Open behind Lee Trevino and Jack Nick-laus at Merion.

During the late 1960's, he was not a full-time tourist, but decided to rejoin the clan after winning the 1970 Club Professional Championship.

During his collegiate days at Stanford, Bob was a standout baseball player. He received his degree there in 1948. To this day, he is one of the biggest all-around sports fans on the Tour.

1972 RECAP: 1972 was another come-back year for Doug Sanders. In 1971, he had finished with only \$24,891, the lowest in his career since 1959. But durable Doug has bounced back.

While playing in only 26 events in 1972, Sanders finished in the money 21 times, was cut only three times and withdrew twice. He won one event, tied for second once and had five other finishes in the top ten. His scoring average was 71.4.

Doug's come-back really got going with a solid performance at Houston. He finished in a tie for second with rounds of 68-71-70-71--280, just two strokes behind winner Bruce Devlin.

In the Kemper, Sanders' third round total of 207 tied him with Lee Trevino, one stroke behind Gibby Gilbert, the leader. At the 18th hole, Trevino and Sanders were still tied and were now leading the field, Sanders just off the green in two and Trevino back down the fairway eyeing his approach. Doug, dressed in blue, settled down over his 25-footer from the fringe, and holed it, putting the pressure squarely on Lee. Trevino's response was an iron shot to within six feet. But then he missed the putt. Sander's 13-under-par 275 gave him the victory by one stroke.

Other high finishes by Sanders in 1972 were a tie for seventh in the PGA Championship where Doug shot 285, four strokes behind winner Gary Player, and a tie for fifth in the L & M Open, where Doug's 286 total failed by one shot to put him into the four-way playoff won by Lou Graham.

PRIOR YEARS: Sanders learned about golf at the Cherokee Golf and Country Club in Cedartown, Ga. "We caddies weren't permitted to play," Doug says, "but we used to sneak on the course. The hole we played had honeysuckle on one side and a creek on the other. If we went off the fairway, we would lose golf balls. I developed the short swing to stay on the fairway."

The short swing has proved very successful for Doug in his 16 years on Tour, despite periodic predictions that such a style "could never last." At the end of 1972 season he stood lith on the career earnings list with \$724,123, and had 20 wins on Tour.

Doug's most lucrative year on the Tour was 1967 when he finished sixth on the money list with \$109,455. That year he won at

Doral, was second at Greensboro, the Western and American Golf Classic. He was a member of that year's Ryder Cup team.

Sanders also has an exceptional record in the British Open. In 1966, he shot 283 and tied for second one shot back of Jack Nicklaus at Muirfield. In 1970, he lost in a playoff 73-72 to Jack at St. Andrews, after tying at 283. (This was the year Doug missed a 30-inch putt on the final hole which allowed Nicklaus to tie him.) In 1971, he tied for ninth at Birkdale, and in 1972 he finished fourth with 281 at Muirfield, three strokes behind Trevino.

In 1970, at the Bob Hope Desert Classic, Doug was struck on the head by an errant ball dispatched by Vice-President Agnew. At the end of the year, he won the Bahamas Open, which restored him to exempt status after a poor showing in 1969.

1972 RECAP: Consistency is becoming more a part of John Schlee's game, and it never was more evident than this past year. He made money in 27 of 37 events, finishing in the top 10 eight times and earning a career high of \$51,435.

His best finish was a solo fifth in the USI Classic when he opened with a 67. He tied for sixth in the Hawaiian Open and the Robinson Fall Classic, where he closed with a 67.

Maybe the most interesting finish of the year was at Jacksonville. He posted 72-78-150 for the first two rounds and barely made the cut. Then he shot 67-69 the last two days and jumped into a solo sixth-place finish, earning \$4,500.

His most disappointing tournament was the Byron Nelson Classic at Preston Trail, home of his sponsors. After three rounds of 68, 67 and 69, he was two strokes off the pace set by Billy Casper. Then he skied to a final-day 74 and tied for eighth. Many thought John was on his way to his first Tour victory until the last-day problems a

The one bad round has been John's problem over the years, and it did hurt him several times in 1972. On the positive side, he did have 24 sub-rounds, and cashed checks in 12 of his last 14 events.

His stroke average did go up slightly, from 72.1 the year before to 72.4 last year.

PRIOR YEARS: Schlee has spent seven full years on the Tour, but it appears as if the curly-haired veteran is just finding the secret to success.

When he joined the Tour late in 1965, he did so with great hopes. He was the medalist in the first Qualifying School that year, and he moved through 1966 winning \$21,442 and earning Rookie-of-the-Year honors.

He was unsteady the next four years, never able to put his game together for a long enough period of time to cash the healthy checks. That is, not until 1971 when he made the top 60 and earned \$47,815.

He had six finishes in the top 10 that year, and his best individual finishes were ties for seventh in the Andy Williams-San Diego Open, the Kaiser International and the Disney World Open. He had seven opening rounds and nine finishing rounds in the 60s, but had his trouble with the middle days.

John is a graduate of Memphis State, and one of his main hobbies is astrology. One of these days, he hopes to find himself up there with the stars.

Before turning professional, he did a short hitch with the paratroopers.

1972 RECAP: It was a most unusual year for Bob Shaw, to say the least. The first time he went the distance in a main Tour event was at the Tallahassee Open - and he won. But, in 32 events, the big Australian finished in the money only eight times.

After failing to go the route eight times - he tied for 27th in the Magnolia Classic - Bob put it all together in his adopted city of Tallahassee.

He started there with a two-under-par 70 and was four shots off the lead. A second day 67 moved him to within two of the No. 1 spot and the third-day 68 gave him sole possession of the lead. His final day 68 cinched the victory by two. It was his first triumph since joining the Tour in 1969.

His next best finish was a tie for 11th in the Kemper Open in Charlotte, N.C., thanks to a closing $68. \,$

After he tied for 20th in the PGA championship in August, Bob was hindered by a bad hand. It definitely affected his play, and in the next eight tournaments he entered, he only survived the cut in one.

Prior to his victory, Bob had been giving some thought to leaving the Tour. But with his exempt status through the 1973 Tallahassee assured, he decided to remain on the circuit. But, unfortunately, the injured hand did not let him finish the year the way he expected.

He won \$25,183, but the check from his victory week totaled \$15,243.His scoring average was 73.3.

PRIOR YEARS: After winning the 1968 New Zealand PGA and enjoying an exceptional year on the Continental tour, Bob Shaw decided to test his skills on the U.S. Tour. He was second low scorer in the Qualifying School held at Doral in Miami.


The first tournament he entered was the Andy Williams-San Diego Open and he failed to qualify. His next attempt was in the Hope of Tomorrow, the 54-hole secondary event to the Bob Hope Desert Classic, and he lost by one to Joe Carr when the latter birdied three of the last four holes.

Bob's progress the first two years was

not to his liking, but in 1969 he did tie for second in the Tallahassee Open and also tied for second in the 1971 Greater Milwaukee Open.

He started in the game as a 15-year old apprentice in Sydney, working for \$21.00 a week. During 1968, he was the leading money winner on the Continental Tour. He won the Spanish Open, lost in a playoff for the Dutch Open title; finished second in the German Open and was fifth in the French open.

He has settled down in Tallahassee and that is where he and his family make their home. "The people there have been so good to us," he said, "that my wife, Sarah and I really don"t care to live anywhere else."

1972 RECAP: It was a strange year for Bob E. Smith. There were many good moments, but for this intense competitor from Sacramento, Calif., it also had too many disappointing ones.

For example, he started the year with a 66 the first day of the Glen Campbell-Los Angeles Open, and he finished in a tie for eighth. But then came two weeks when he failed to survive the cuts, first at the Bing Crosby and then at the Dean Martin-Tucson Open.

His strongest showing of the year came a short time later when he tied for fourth in the rich Jackie Gleason Inverrary Classic. He won \$10,140, and it represented his largest check ever on the Tour.

Bob also tied for sixth in the Monsanto Open at Pensacola. He opened with a 65 there, his best round of the year, and it placed him one stroke off the first-day pace of Dave Hill. He had three 67s - the third day at Los Angeles, the first day at Hawaii and the second day at New Orleans.

In 1972, Smith competed in 35 events, was in the money 26 times, missing the cut eight times. He had four finishes in the top ten, and compiled a 71.9 scoring average.

PRIOR YEARS: Although his five years on the Tour have not been spectacular, Smith has shown a consistency that is expected to reward him well in the near future.

A strong and long hitter, he was a fine amateur in California before qualifying for the Tour in the 1967 Qualifying School. That also was the year he was graduated from Sacramento State College and that he won the state amateur title.

He has made the top 60 three of his five years on the circuit. He still is searching for his first victory, although he has been in position to go the distance several times.

He has made a solid impression in his rookie year of 1968, winning \$30,044. Although he fell off the following year, his advancement back up the money ladder has put him on the top 60 exempted point list the last two years.

It looked as if Smith would get his victory in 1971, when he opened with 66-69 in the Los Angeles Open, to lead by three strokes. But the touch left him and he closed with 75-74 to tie for 28th.

He is a good putter, but Bob has shown a tendency to experiment when his work on the greens hasn't satisfied him completely. There are some who believe this may have hindered him to a certain extent, but he feels this is the only way to find the stroke that will elevate him toward the top.

His best money year was 1971, when he collected \$1,298 more than he did in 1972, with \$44,596. He finished in the top 25 on 13 occasions, his high mark in this category.

1972 RECAP: J. C. Snead proved without question that he belongs up with the big boys on the Tour, as he backed his superb 1971 season with another exceptional one.

J. C. used to be referred to as "Sam's Snead's nephew." Naturally, he still is on occasion, but now J.C. is piling up a few impressive credentials of his own.

He won \$87,435 on the strength of a victory in the Philadelphia Classic, a tie for third in the Greater Greensboro and five other top 10 finishes.

J. C. trailed Chi Chi Rodriguez entering the final day at the Whitemarsh Valley C.C. in Philadelphia, but he returned with an even-par 72, while Chi was two-over at 74, so the \$30,000 went into the Snead bank account.

PRIOR YEARS: For a while after he joined the professional golf Tour in 1968 J.C. (Jesse Carlyle) Snead probably figured he should have stuck with baseball.

But the big, friendly fellow from Hot Springs, Va., plugged along and improved some in 1969, a little more in 1970 and then suddenly smashed onto the scene with all the authority of one of his tee shots. He won the Tucson Open and the Doral-Eastern Open in a three-week period in 1971.

He was named to the Ryder Cup team in the fall and was unbeaten in four matches. In addition, he lost in a playoff for the Greater Hartford Open to George Archer. By year's end, he had \$92,929.

Until he was 22, J.C. looked at golf as the game that made his Uncle Sam wealthy. Baseball was J.C.'s bag.

J.C. was delighted with the victory, but not the way he finished. He bogied the last hole and sat in the scoring tent, watching Rodriguez do the same.

J.C. was tied for the first round lead at Greensboro with a 66 and he finally gained his tie for third with 69-70-68. He had two other 66's, opening in Tucson with that figure to be one stroke off the pace, and in the second round of the American Golf Classic at Firestone. He finished with 24 rounds in the 60's and a stroke average of 71.9. It's exactly the same as the year before.

He tied for sixth twice, at Memphis and in the Western; tied for ninth in Tucson and in the Kaiser and tied for eighth in the L&M Open.

He entered 35 tournaments and made money in 28, missing five cuts and withdrawing once.

In fact, J.C. received a bonus from the Washington Senators after he hit .450 in high school. He advanced to Double-A, and was hitting .318, when someone in the Senators' front office decided to move him to .00ass A. That was enough for J.C.

It seemed natural for him to concentrate now on golf. Charlie Beverage, former Hot Springs pro, had moved to White Plains, N.Y., and gave him an assistant's job. His game progressed well enough there for a group of his Century C.C. members to finance him on the Tour.

There is a slight resemblance between Sam and J.C., but the nephew is larger and has a little more hair. While his swing is sound, it doesn't have the same ineffable grace of Sam's. But whose does?

1972 RECAP: Ken Still made his final round of the year one of his best and it enabled him to slip into the 60th spot - the final position on the list of players who will be exempt from qualifying in 1973.

He recorded a five-under 67 at the Walt Disney World Open to gain a tie for 13th. He was in 61st place when the Tournament began, so a strong finish was a must. The situation appeared grim when Ken opened with a 74, but a second-round 68 put him in position to make his move. The third-round 70 and the closing 67 netted him \$2,550.

PRIOR YEARS: The first triumph was a long time coming for Still. He was eight years on the Tour without tasting the sweetness of victory, but he changed that in 1969, winning the Florida Citrus Open in Orlando. Later in the year, he added the Greater Milwaukee Open title to his list of credentials.

The year 1969 also was his most profitable, as he earned \$72,514. Another triumph followed in 1970, when he captured the Kaiser International Open at Nāpa, Calif., beating Lee Trevino and Bert Yancey in sudden-death. Still was a member of the 1969 Ryder Cup

Without question, Still is the most avid all-around sports fan on the Tour, with baseball being his specialty. As a youngster in Tacoma, Wash., his first desire was to be a baseball player, and he made the Clover Park High varsity as a sophomore.

But a trip to the Firecrest Golf Club to check on a job as a caddie gave him his first real glimpse of golf, and the bug bit him hard. It was his seventh 67 of the year - his low round was a 65 the third day at the Greater Hartford Open. In the final analysis, he finished 369.24 points ahead of the 61st man, Leonard Thompson.

Still had three top 10 finishes, gaining a tie for seventh at Hartford, a tie for eighth in the L & M Open, and a tie for 10th at Tallahassee. Money-wise, his best showing was in the Westchester Classic, finishing in a tie for 12th and pocketing \$4,833. 31. N 35 events, Still was cut only four times. His scoring average was 72.1.

He turned professional in 1953 when he was 18, but he waited until 1960 to take his first crack at the Tour.

It was a long, tough struggle and it wasn't until 1965 that he managed to break through the top 100.

One of Still's more distinctive characteristics is his constant boosting and cheering for his fellow competitors. During a round, if one of his playing partners is having an exceptional day, Ken will be the one leading the loudest cheers.

"I like to see everyone play well," is the way he explains it. "The more that do, the better it will be for the Tour."

And professional golf has no bigger booster than Ken Still.

1972 RECAP: While Dave Stockton's earnings slipped to their lowest point since 1967, he had a most respectable year, collecting \$66,342 and finishing 34th on the money list.

Victory eluded him and his usually magic putter, but he did have two strong third-place finishes -- at the Greater Greensboro Open where a closing 67 propelled him to within one stroke of George Archer and Tommy Aaron (Archer won the playoff); and in the Colonial National at Fort Worth. He was tied for the 36-hole lead there, but Jerry Heard was too steady and gained a three-shot victory.

Dave had seven top 10 finishes, so, when you realize that and the fact that he did not play in eight of the last nine events, you see he did have a most satisfactory season.

Stockton usually disappears after Labor Day, taking the time to enjoy his family in California and for other business activities.

Among his other best finishes, he was a quarter-finalist in the Match Play, being ousted by Babe Hiskey; tied for sixth in the Danny Thomas - Memphis Classic; tied for eighth in the Byron Nelson; tied for ninth in the Tournament of Champions and tied for 10th in the Masters.

During the stretch of eight weeks, from Greensboro through the Atlanta Classic, he was only worse than 11th once. Always a model of consistency, mainly because of his ability to drive the ball well and his smooth putting stroke, he cashed checks in 24 of 30 tournaments. His scoring average was 72.0.


PRIOR YEARS: It took Stockton a little over three years to discover the secret to winning, but once he did, there was no stopping him.

The former Captain of the University of Southern California golf team (just as his father was), Dave has won six tournaments in the last six years.

The first triumph was a most impressive one. It came in 1967 at the Colonial National Invitation in Fort Worth on one of the more difficult courses on the Tour. He also teamed with Laurie Hammer that year to capture the Haig Scotch Foursome.

Dave captured his most important triumph in 1970, when he out-dueled Arnold Palmer in the stretch to take the PGA Championship in the heat of Tulsa's Southern Hills. He was on the 1971 Ryder Cup Team.

A descendant of a Declaration of Independence signer from New Jersey, Stockton didn't take up golf seriously until he was 17. But, before this, he suffered a back injury in a surfing accident, and even today, if he practices too long, he can feel the tiredness.

1972 RECAP: Lee Trevino got off to a slow start-by his standards only. In the Crosby, Lee was well in contention until he hit one into the ocean on the 6th in the final round, leaving him a solo third behind Jack Nicklaus and Johnny Miller.

Lee finished in a tie for second two strokes behind Nicklaus in the Doral-Eastern and was again two strokes behind Bobby Mit-chell and Nicklaus in the Tournament of Champions for a third-place finish.

Trevino gained his first victory of the year when he repeated at Memphis. A new caddie and a new putter inspired Lee to a 67 finish for 281, four strokes ahead of John Mahaffey.

In June, Lee had a bout of pneumonia, which threatened to prevent him defending his U.S. open. But Lee made it to the first tee at Pebble Beach, and, while he did not win, he managed to finish in a tie for fourth at

Trevino became the first to successfully defend the British Open title since Arnold Palmer in 1962 by his thrilling win at Muirfield. His six-under 278 edged Nicklaus by a stroke.

PRIOR YEARS: The incredible thing about Trevino's rags-to-riches story is that it only started six years ago.

In the spring of 1967, his wife sent in his entry for the U.S. Open. They could ill afford the \$20 fee. Lee went all the way, and finished fifth at Baltusrol, earning \$6,000. Since then, he has never looked back.

Lee's best year was in 1971. In a stretch of 11 weeks, Trevino won the National

In the Match Play, Trevino was eliminated by Frank Beard, 2 and 1, in the second round, but Lee bounced back to win his next two appearances on Tour.

In the Greater Hartford Open, Trevino and Lee Elder tied at 269, with Lee winning on first hole in sudden-death. At St. Louis, Deane Beman led for the first three rounds, with Lee hot on his heels all the way, and only a stroke behind going into the final round. Then, despite the worst putting round round he could remember, Lee shot a 70, for a 269 total, good enough to beat Beman by a single stroke.

Lee finished his year with a second-place finish at San Antonio, shooting 275, two strokes back of Mike Hill. Although Lee would have liked to have had at least one victory in his home state, his second succ-essive \$200,000 plus year must have been a nice consolation. nice consolation.

In 1972, Trevino played in 31 events finishing in the money 27 times, was cut once and withdrew three times. He had three first places, two second place finishes and one tie for second, plus seven other finishes in the top ten. His scoring average was 70.9.

Open titles of the U.S., Canada and Britain, plus the Tallahassee Open and Danny Thomas Memphis Classic.

In the World Cup, Lee has been on the U.S. team in 1968, 1969, 1970 and 1971. He won the individual title in 1971. He also played on the 1969 and 1971 Ryder Cup Teams.

Trevino was leading money-winner in 1970; second in 1971 and 1972. He won the Vardon Trophy in 1972 with an average of 70.9; he also won in 1970 and 1971.

1972 RECAP: In July of 1972, Lanny Wadkins was asked: "Do you have any

"I sure do," replied Lanny. "First, I want to win a tournament. I almost had one won early this year, but I lost in a playoff. Second, I want to finish in the top 60 money-winners so I won't have to qualify every week next year. I think I already have that clinched. Third, I want to beat Bob Murphy's record for money won by a rookie."

By year end, Lanny had achieved all three goals.

Actually, Lanny almost won two tournaments early in the year. In the Bob Hope Desert Classic, he finished at 345, one

stroke behind winner Bob Rosburg. His second runner-up finish came one week later in the Phoenix Open. Homero Blancas and Wadkins tied at 273, but on the first extra hole, Lanny missed his birdie attempt from 15 feet, while Blancas slotted his three-footer for the birdie and victory.

Wadkins' first fur win came in the Sahara Invitational. Lanny fought off challenges by Arnold Palmer and Jack Nicklaus to win with 273 by a stroke over Palmer. The \$27,000 first prize boosted Wadkins' winnings to \$114,766. This surpassed the previous record of \$105,595, set by Murphy in 1968.

By the end of 1972, Wadkins had played in 36 events, had one win, placed second twice, and finished 8 other times in the top ten. He did not qualify for 2 events, and missed the cut 5 times. He finished in the money 27 times. His scoring average was 71.8.

PRIOR YEARS: "A lot of people hate winners,"
says Lanny Wadkins. "I love
'em. The athletes I admire most are Johnny
Unitas, Mickey Mantle, Arnold Palmer, Bobby
Orr, Wilt Chamberlain and Jerry West -all winners."

Lanny's desire to be a winner in golf manifested itself early. He first broke 80 when he was 10. In 1963, at 13, he shot 69-70 at Florida's Rio Pinar to win the National Pee Wee title. In 1966, he competed in the U.S. Amateur at Merion, finishing at 294, nine strokes back of Deane Beman and Gary Cowan who tied for first.

"When it was over, I realized I had three-putted 14 times, and that if I could learn to putt, I could play with anybody," recalls Lanny.

While at Wake Forest, Wadkins solved his putting problems with a putter given

him by teammate Loge Jackson early in 1970. With it he enjoyed his greatest year in the amateur ranks. He won the Virginia, Southern, Western and U.S. Amateurs, as well as the Red Fox and Palmetto Invitationals (college events), the Richmond City Amateur, and All Dixie Amateur. He was also runnerup to Bob Goalby in a Tour event, the Heritage Classic, and played on the winning U.S. World Amateur Team.

Other amateur achievements by Wadkins included wins in the 1968 Southern Amateur, the 1969 Esstern Amateur, the 1971 Dixie Amateur and the 1969 Atlantic Coast Conference, membership in the 1969 and 1971 Walker Cup teams, and selection to College All-American in 1970 and 1971.

After finishing second to Bob Zender at the 1971 Qualifying School, Wadkins gave early notice of his skill. In the final four events of the year, he earned \$15,921, including a tie for 3rd in the Disney World.

1972 RECAP: During the first half of the year, DeWitt Weaver was not playing as well as felt he should. Primarily it was his putting stroke that was not to his liking.

Then, during the heart of the summer, he missed four straight cuts, at the Western, Cleveland and Canadian Opens plus the National Team Play. Then, he suddenly found what he was after.

"My game is just about ready now," he said in early August during the PGA champion-ship. He went the distance, tying for 33rd. The next week at Westchester, he opened with a brilliant eight-under par 64 to lead the field.

He went on to tie for fifth there, but it was obvious that DeWitt had found his putting stroke again. Three weeks later, he did win, in the Southern Open at Columbus,

Ga., scoring 65-67-72-72-276, and then edging Chuck Courtney in sudden-death with a par on the first extra hole.

Weaver's other finish in the top ten came in the Match Play, when he was a first-round loser to Lee Trevino by 2 & 1.

He finished the year with \$53,278 the second best of his six years on the Tour. The difficulty he had during the early part of the year is evidenced in the fact that he missed 11 cuts in 32 events. His scoring average for 1972 was 73.5.

His best efforts through the first six months were ties for 18th in the Tournament of Champions and 19th in Philadelphia. He only had three sub-70 rounds, but he also had seven 80-plus rounds. Once he regained the touch on the greens, he had seven rounds in the 60s in his last eight tournaments.

PRIOR YEARS: Once DeWitt was able to put a harness on his power, he became a winner on the Tour. Regarded as one of the longest hitters in the game, DeWitt struggled through his first four seasons, mainly because he could not control his cannon shots.

By 1971, DeWitt became less distanceminded, and the results were most profitable. He won the U.S. Match Play championship, defeating George Archer, Doug Sanders, Julius Boros, Lou Graham, Bruce Crampton and Phil Rodgers along the way. Only once was he over par on the difficult Country Club of North Carolina course.

He had other strong finishes. He led through the first 69 holes of the Hawaiian Open and finally finished third. He tied for sixth in Tucson, tied for seventh in Houston, and was ninth in the Canadian Open. When the year ended, DeWitt had \$76,256 in the bank - which was \$38,000 more than he had won during his first four years combined.

Weaver turned to golf rather late in life, in that he was an all-star high school quarterback in Lubbock, Texas, and went to Southern Methodist to play football. He rode the bench for two years behind the heralded Don Meredith, so DeWitt turned to golf. He became a professional in 1963 and took a shot at the Tour the next year.

"I found out I couldn't play a lick," is the way he explains it. So, he took a job as head pro at Cairo Country Club in Cairo, Ga. He worked on his game, and by 1967, he was ready to give the Tour another try. He made it in the Qualifying School.

1972 RECAP: When Jim Wiechers walked into the press room at the Preston Trail Golf Club just prior to the Byron Nelson Classic in Dallas, he was the saddest player on Tour.

"The doctor just told me I have hepatitis, and I'll be off for at least six weeks," he said. "I'm leaving for home tonight."

Jim did miss six weeks, but when the big fellow from Napa, Calif., came back, he played the finest golf of his career -- for some unexplained reason.

He returned to Philadelphia and tied for 14th. In the U.S. Open, he tied for 25th, and then came a tie for third in the Western Open with a 68-68 finish. After two indiff-

erent weeks, he put together a solid string of three with a tie for sixth at Milwaukee (67-70-68-68); solo fifth at American Golf Classic (70-68-75-66); and joined Harry Toscano to tie for fifth in the Team Play.

There were times after his return that Jim did feel himself getting tired. To help he said, "I just keep chewing candy."

He had two other top 10 finishes, a tie for fourth at Phoenix, opening and closing with 68's; and a tie for seventh at the Kaiser International on his home Silverado courses, opening with a 68 and closing with

His \$54,749 easily was his best money year and he only missed the cut five times in 35 starts. He carved out 28 rounds of 69 or better, and his scoring average was

PRIOR YEARS: Wiechers is one of the biggest men on the Tour, but one of the secrets to his success has been his touch around the greens. It is better than most people realize.


After a fine amateur career, Jim qualified for the Tour in the Fall School of 1966. His first year was not too profitable, but he began his advancement, winning \$20,170 in 1968 and hitting it big in 1969, capturing the West End Classic in the Grand Bahamas, and \$40,100. He used a 65 the second day as the springboard to his five-stroke triumph.

Jim also had a second that year, as he lost in sudden-death at the Robinson Classic to Bob Goalby. He needed a birdie on the final hole to tie Goalby, and he got it by sinking a seven-foot putt.

The following year was a bad one for Wiechers, but he came back strong in 1971. His \$40,110 was \$10 ahead of his previous best money year, but only good for 64th on the money list. He finished second to Lee Trevino at Tallahassee.

Jim was graduated from Santa Clara College in 1966 with a degree in business. He and Ron Cerrudo - along with two others joined the "amateur tour" that summer, with their final destination being the U. S. Amateur at Merion Golf Club, Ardmore, Penna.

Along the way, Jim won the Western Amateur and the Trans-Mississippi.

1972 RECAP: Tom Weiskopf enjoyed his second "richest" year on the Tour, as he collected \$129,422 to finish sixth on the money list. But 1972 also was a year for Tall Tom to break out on the international scene.

His victory on the U.S. Tour came in the year's richest event, the \$260,000 Jackie Gleason Inverrary Classic, when he edged Jack Nicklaus by one stroke and collected \$52,000. Tom opened with a 69, and, after a second day 72, followed with 69-68 to nail it.

He also had two second-place finishes, one being in the Masters - the second time in four years he has finished in that position at Augusta - and a solo second at the Heritage Classic. He closed with a strong 66 at Harbour Town.

PRIOR YEARS: It was four years before
Weiskopf was able to nail down
his first victory on the Tour, but when he
did capture the Andy Williams-San Diego
Open in 1968, it launched him into one of the
game's starring roles.

He was expected to be an instant success when he joined the Tour in late 1964 after two years at Ohio State. Tom admits that he felt extra pressure, because people were trying to compare him with another OSU great, Jack Nicklaus.

Tom made a steady advancement up the money list, winning \$40,069 in 1967, but once he was able to crack the winner's circle, success has been his. He added the Buick Open title later in 1968. He went two years without a victory, partially because of a service commitment, but he still won \$81,594 in 1969 and \$95,287 in 1970.

Tom had 10 finishes in the top 10 out of 26 tournaments, and he only missed the cut twice. He had 23 rounds in the 60's, and it is interesting to note that nine of them came in the first round. His scoring average was 71.5.

After the Westchester Classic in mid-August, he left the Tour and did not return until the final two events of the year.

Abroad, he won the World Piccadilly Match Play in Great Britain, beating Lee Trevino in the 36-hole final. Then he finished second in the Lancome in France, and headed for Australia where he teamed with Jim Jamieson to represent the U.S. in the World Cup.

He broke the victory drought in 1971 in a big way, with triumphs in the Kemper Open when he defeated Lee Trevino, Gary Player and Dale Douglass in sudden-death, and in the Philadelphia Classic, after fighting off the challenges of Nicklaus and Dave Hill.

It was a super year in 1971, as he compiled a 71.3 stroke average and had eight rounds of 66 or better.

All this despite the fact that nearly every Monday night of the year, he must report to his Army Reserve unit in Columbus, O.

As an amateur, his best victories came in the Western Amateur and twice won the Ohio Public Links title.

1972 RECAP: Bert Yancey was mad at himself when he arrived at Akron for the American Golf Classic in mid-July. In his four previous tournaments, he had missed cuts in the Western and Cleveland, tied for 41st in Canada and had not played to his liking in the British Open.

"I decided I must not be working hard enough on my game," he said. "If you want something bad enough, you have to work hard."

He was one of the last to leave the practice areas every day, and he also was the man to walk away with the winner's check of \$30,000. He had to edge tall Tom Ulozas on the first extra hole to do it, too. Bert had rounds of 69-68-67-72--276, four under.

Bert had five finishes in the top 10, and in the last event of the year, the Walt Disney World, he put on quite a display of

shotmaking in the third round. He tied the course record with a 64. Starting on the 10th tee, he birdied the first seven holes - a high on the Tour this year - and his 15-footer for a birdie that would have tied the PGA all-time record just stopped short.

Bert finished in a tie for fifth at the Disney, and he used two middle rounds of 68 to gain a tie for fifth in San Diego, too. He closed with a 66 for a tie for sixth at Tallahassee; and had the same finish for a tie for eighth at Doral-Eastern. He had another 66, in the second round at Greensboro and totaled 20 sub-70 rounds for the year.

Bert entered 34 events and made money in 25. He compiled a stroke average of 71.9, slightly higher than the year before, but it did help him accumulate \$75,926. The last three years, his earnings had been in the over \$80,000 class.

PRIOR YEARS: Albert Winsborough Yancey believes the most difficult part of golf is the mental attitude, and trying to stay mentally alert for every round. "I believe it accounts for about 90 per cent of your success," he has said.

"Physical strength is one thing that helps the top players," he said, "but it's not the whole picture. You have to have determination and drive. You must be able to maintain your concentration."

Over the years, Bert has been one of the Tour's leading craftsmen , as he has won seven titles and accumulated more than a half-million dollars in winnings.

The former West Pointer turned pro in 1961, gave the Tour a brief whirl and realiz-

ed he wasn't ready. After working as an assistant pro in Philadelphia for a while, he rejoined the circuit in 1964.

Now he was ready. He averaged \$25,000 the first three years, increased it to \$66,000 the next two, and then enjoyed a stretch of three years, 1969 through 1971, when he was over \$80,000.

His one big desire is to win the Masters, and he nearly always has been a contender there. But in the 1968 U.S. Open in Rochester, he had a five-stroke lead with 27 to play, but Lee Trevino's late charge nipped him at the finish.

In 1966, Bert won three times - Azalea, Memphis and Portland. He added Dallas in 1967, Atlanta in 1969 and the Bing Crosby in

1972 RECAP: One of the happiest days of Kermit Zarley's golf career came at Laurel Valley in Ligonier, Pa., when he joined with his close friend, Babe Hiskey, to win the National Team Play Championship.

Naturally, he was delighted with the victory for himself, but he also was excited because the triumph meant he and Hiskey would be exempt for the next year. And it was especially important to Hiskey, who has been having a difficult time on the Tour.

At the press interview, Zarley yelled, "The Preachers' got 'em ". You see, Kermit and Babe also are among the leaders of the weekly Bible study group on the Tour. Their friendship goes back to their days at the University of Houston.

There was another day in 1972 Kermit long will remember. It was the final, windy

PRIOR YEARS: There have been many solid performers venture onto the Tour from the University of Houston, and Zarley has been one of the better ones.

He joined the circuit after he was graduated in 1963, and although he has not had a spectacular career, it has been profitable. One of the titles he brought with him when he left the amateur ranks was that of the 1963 NCAA champion.

He has won three titles during his nine years on the road, the 1968 Kaiser International when his blistering 65 on the final day edged Dave Marr by one; and the 1970 Canadian Open when his closing 67 nipped Gibby Gilbert, plus the Team Play crown he

afternoon in June at Pebble Beach during the U.S. Open. He only was one stroke in back of Jack Nicklaus entering the final 18, but on that wild day, Zarley could do no better than 79 and dropped into sixth place, six strokes back of Nicklaus.

He tied for 10th in two other tournaments, the Bing Crosby - also at Pebble Beach - and the Bob Hope Desert Classic, when he finished with 69-65.

Kermit had 12 rounds of 69 or better, including a trio of 66's - Monsanto at Pensacola, the American Golf Classic and Florida Citrus in Orlando. He entered 29 tournaments and finished in the money 23 times, compiling a 72.3 stroke average.

He took home \$ 54,134, making it the second most rewarding year of his nine on the Tour.

shared with Babe Hiskey last summer.

His biggest money year was in 1968 when he finished 21st on the list with \$64,993.

Kermit lives in the Houston area now, but his original home was in Seattle, where his father owned a restaurant near a public course. His father started him in the game. He won both the Washington State and Northwestern Amateur titles before going to Houston.

Zarley has been the target of goodnatured ribbing over the years, regarding his name. It even prompted Bob Hope to remark a few years ago, "With a name like that, it sounds as if he's the pro from the Moon."

QUALIFYING SCHOOL FOR APPROVED TOURNAMENT PLAYERS

The Qualifying School for Approved Tournament Players was initiated in 1965 as the procedure for accrediting new players for the Tour. Since that time 238 men have received Approved Tournament Players membership cards through these Schools.

1972 -- A record number of 468 applicants sought admission to the 1972 Qualifying School. Three regional Tryouts reduced

the group to 81 qualifiers and 25 men received credentials after successfully completing the course at the Silverado Country Club, Napa, Calif. Silverado's South course was the scene of the sixround event. The School program included classroom instructions and a written final examination.

RYDER CUP MATCHES

The Ryder Cup Matches developed from a match played between representatives of the American and British Professional Golfers' Association in England in 1926. That unofficial match, incidentally, was won by the British 13 - 1/2 to 1-1/2.

Following this highly successful exhibition, Samuel A. Ryder, a wealthy British seed merchant, offered to donate a solid gold trophy bearing his name to be competed for in a series of matches between professionals of these two nations.

In placing the Ryder Cup in competition, the donor set forth certain terms which were to be observed by the parties concerned so long as the matches are conducted. Included among these stipulations are the following:

- The matches will be played every other year on a home-and-home basis;
- basis;
 While both parties must mutually agree on the specific dates for each match, the host team may select the site and will be responsible for such arrangements and details as are normally the function of a sponsoring group; The matches shall consist of two days of play with the first being devoted to foursomes and the second to single matches; Each member of the competing teams must be a member of his

country's PGA, and furthermore, must be a native born citizen of that country.

The matches were first officially played for the Ryder Cup in 1927 in the United States. They have been held continuously every other year since except for the period from 1937 when the exigencies of World War II forced their suspension.

From 1927 to date, the United States has won every Ryder Cup match played in this country. It also won on British soil in 1937, 1949, 1953, 1961 and 1965, to run its list of victories to 15 in the 19 matches. The British won at home in 1929, 1933 and 1957. The 1969 match in England resulted in the first tie of the series. series.

From the start of the series through

From the start of the series through the 1959 Ryder Cup matches, the competition was comprised of four foursomes matches one day and eight singles matches the other day, each at 36 holes.

In 1961, the format was changed to provide for four 18-hole foursomes the morning of the first day and four more that afternoon, then for eight 18-hole singles the morning of the second day and eight more that afternoon. As in the past, one point was at stake in each match, so the total number of points was doubled.

In 1963, for the first time, a day of four-ball matches augmented the program to add new interest to the overall competition. This brought the total number of points to 32.

THE VARDON TROPHY

The PGA Vardon Trophy, named in honor of the internationally famous British Golfer, Harry Vardon, was placed in competition among American professionals in 1937 as a successor to the Harry E. Radix Trophy, which, prior to that time, had been awarded annually to the professional having the finest tournament record in play in this country.

Today, the Vardon Trophy, a bronze colored plaque measuring 39" x 27" is awarded each year to the member of the PGA of America maintaining the finest playing average in those events co-sponsored or so designated by the PGA in each such period. A minimum of 80 rounds in tournaments considered official by PGA is required to win.

Each year the PGA of America honors America's leading professional player by presenting him the PGA Player-of-the-Year Award.

This award is made on the basis of playing record for the year, including such things as money winnings, Vardon Trophy scoring average, Ryder Cup points and an overall evaluation of playing achievements.

In the past, selection of the PGA Player-of-the-Year has been made each year by a vote of the PGA membership and the individuals on the PGA national press list. Beginning in 1969 the Award was made by a vote of the PGA Executive Committee. The winner receives a plaque at the President's Dinner during the PGA Annual Meeting.
