After turned pro in 1942, worked in war plant until served in U.S. Army for 14 months in 1944-45, then built a driving range before joined PGA TOUR full-time in 1948 . . . Played TOUR full-time through 1962 . . . Playoff victories were in 1953 Azalea (over Chandler Harper) and in 1961 PGA over Don January at Olympia Fields, IL . . . No one at Olympia Fields will forget final day of regulation when he finished birdie-par-birdie to tie companion January, sinking respective putts measuring 25, 40 and 52 feet . . . Then won playoff by one stroke with a 67 . . . Renowned putting teacher of last decade or so, having helped Tom Watson in 1976, before Watson won four straight money titles on PGA TOUR . . . One of few to play all 18 official events on 1983 Senior TOUR, and at age 67 played extremely steady, without a single round above the 70s . . . In contention in Peter Jackson at midway point after second round five-under par 66, but closing 78-74 dropped him to T24 . . . Best showing was 7th in USGA Senior Open despite final round 76.

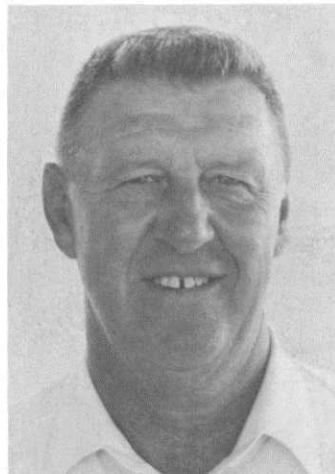

Has played PGA TOUR steadily from 1959 to present, except for summer of 1963 when worked at Apawamis CC, Rye, NY . . . First TOUR victory, in 1964 Cajun Classic, Lafayette, LA, resulted from 65-67 in final two rounds in freezing weather; won by four shots . . . Eleven TOUR triumphs recorded in 11 different years; won only Phoenix Open twice . . . Only he and Jack Nicklaus won at least once a year in eight-year span, 1967-74 . . . Only Senior to play entire 20-tournament slate (18 official, 2 unofficial) . . . His ten Senior TOUR titles since joining in the spring of 1981 are second only to Don January's 12 . . . Opening rounds of 66-65 in Merrill Lynch tied Rod Funseth's Senior TOUR record for low 36-hole total of 13-under par 131, and closing 69 gave him a five-stroke win over Gay Brewer . . . captured Senior TPC in June after leading or sharing lead for three of the four rounds . . . Became the eighth player to earn over \$2 million on TOUR by winning at Hilton Head, his fourth victory of the year.

First TOUR victory, in 1957 Canadian Open, will remain his biggest thrill in game, but for personal satisfaction he'll also never forget winning the par-3 contest at the Masters three years after he won the Masters driving contest second year in a row . . . In late 1950s was practically uncontested longest hitter on TOUR . . . In 1982 as a senior, was three under par and two shots from lead after three rounds at Denver, but closing 75 bumped him back to T9, which remained his top finish of the year . . . Underwent surgery between 1982 and 1983 seasons to implant an artificial joint in hip . . . In 1983 World Seniors, was alone in third place at two-under par after three rounds, but closing 77 dropped him to T7, eight strokes in back of winner Doug Sanders . . . Best showing came in unofficial Vintage where he trailed only Brewer by one after three rounds, but final round 76 bumped him back to T5 . . . Has adopted croquet-style putting form, similar to Sam Snead's.

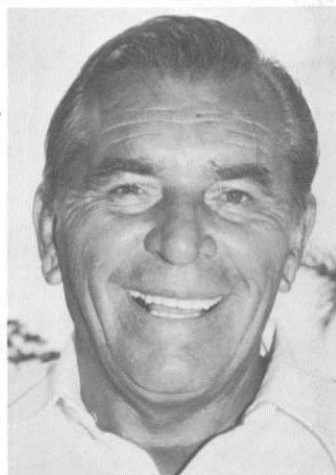

Didn't join Tour until age 32, after spending four years in Army in World War II and 10 years in construction work . . . One of classic swingers of golf club in game's history, but bothered all his life with arthritis in upper back . . . Best remembered exploits included first victory, in 1951 North & South, when beat Cary Middlecoff by three shots, and 1958 U.S. Open at Southern Hills, Tulsa, when beat Gary Player by four in 95-degree heat during double-round final day . . . In June, 1981, moved to Evening Shade, AK, 130 miles north of Little Rock, at least partly because of outdoor sports in Ozark Mountains . . . In 1983 as Senior, withdrew from two of four events entered (Gatlin Brothers, World Senior), but teamed with Art Wall to finish T8 in Legends . . . Teamed with Tom Weiskopf at Jeremy Ranch, and despite T22 performance, were only one stroke from lead at halfway point.

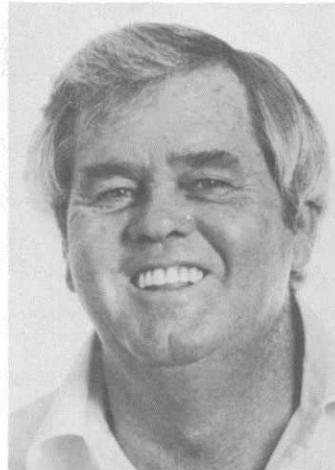

Among top 60 money winners 1951-69 and 1971, leading in 1952 and 1955 . . . Member of PGA Tournament Committee 1958-60 . . . Won Canada Cup 1952 (with Jim Turnesa) and World Cup 1968 (with Lee Trevino) . . . Inducted in PGA Hall of Fame 1974 and World Golf Hall of Fame 1982.

Modest tie for 59th place at Pleasant Valley in 1977, and a check for \$493.75, finally pushed him over million-dollar mark in official career earnings, 14th player to do so at the time . . . Claims he should have won his first TOUR event, 1950 U.S. Open at Merion, but finished 77-74 for ninth place . . . Finally won first TOUR triumph at 1952 U.S. Open at Northwood CC in Dallas, and added 1963 Open at Brookline, MA (in playoff) and 1968 PGA Championship in San Antonio, latter at age 48 . . . Underwent quintuple by-pass heart surgery in December of 1981 and enjoyed remarkable recovery, winning \$41,662 in 1982 . . . As Senior in 1983, partnered with Miller Barber to finish third in Legends . . . At season-ending Boca Grove, was at five-under par 139 at midpoint en route to finishing ninth, his highest official tournament result.

PGA TOUR MEDIA REGULATIONS

General Regulations

The following regulations are to be followed by *all* members of the Media:

1. Remain close up against gallery ropes in such a way as to appear to be a part of the gallery at all times. An ARM BAND is necessary.
2. Players are not to be distracted during play. DO NOT interview players or ask them to pose for photographs during their round.
3. DO NOT interview players or ask them to pose for photographs during their practice sessions prior to their round except by prior arrangement with the player.
4. Do not disturb players at their 18th green and/or scoring tent until after they have checked, signed and returned their scorecards.

Working Press Regulations

To avoid embarrassment to you and distraction to the contestants:

1. Do not walk or stand in playing areas.
2. Follow directions of marshals and other officials.
3. Do not interview during play. The leading players each day — and other requested — will be interviewed following their rounds in the Press Room interview area.

Tape Recorder Regulations

1. All tape recorder work should be done in the proximity of the Press Room and/or Clubhouse.
2. Tape recorders are *NOT* permitted in the locker room.
3. Tape recorders are *NOT* permitted within the playing area of the golf course.
4. If an interview is to be taped in the practice areas, either the range or the putting green, it must be done by prior arrangement with the player and up against the ropes and *NOT* in the middle of the areas where it could be distracting to other players.

PHOTOGRAPHY REGULATIONS

This Tournament is essentially for the players and spectators. Fair play requires that there be no noise or other distractions. The interests of all others must be subordinated to the players interests. The result of any one shot could decide the Tournament.

Only accredited photographers for RECOGNIZED NEWS MEDIA will be permitted to take pictures during the Tournament. Photography will be restricted to news use. Commercial and personal photography is prohibited (except that spectators may take pictures on practice days and during a Pro-Am).

The following regulations apply to accredited news and television photographers and motion picture cameramen as a condition of the privilege of taking pictures:

General — All Photographers

A photographer must not ask a player to pose during a round.

If a player or an official requests that no photographs be taken in a certain situation, the request must be honored immediately, without discussion.

A camera must not be pointed at a player about to make a stroke in any manner which might tend to disturb him or distract his attention.

At the 9th and the 18th greens, photographers must not approach, delay or distract a player until he has checked, signed and returned his scorecard to the proper official. Under the Rules of Golf, a player turning in an incorrect scorecard in stroke play may be disqualified.

Cameras are not permitted in the locker room.

Photography Regulations (Cont'd)

Still Photographers

Only still photographers to whom arm bands have been issued will be permitted inside gallery lines. They must station themselves immediately inside such lines, and not more than an ARM'S LENGTH FROM THE LINES, so as to blend into the gallery and appear to be part of the gallery. They must not take conspicuous positions in the open.

Any photographer who violates this regulation will forfeit the right to enter gallery lines and possibly to work at the tournament.

Close-up action shots are prohibited.

All pictures must be taken at appreciable distances, as far from the players as possible and from angles which are not acute to the line of play.

Pictures, even from a distance, may not be made until the player has completed his stroke. The photographer must not release his camera shutter until the shot is made.

Motion Picture/Videotape Photographers

Motion or videotape pictures may be taken only from *outside gallery lines* or from areas designated by the PGA TOUR. Motion pictures or videotape may be taken from such locations during a stroke.

Only modern equipment which makes a minimum of noise can be used. Motion picture cameras must be equipped with noise-deadening blimps or hoods.

Use of golf carts by news or television photographers is not permitted during play.

A maximum of two working camera crew members will be permitted per camera.

Difficulties will be avoided if photographers are fair and will treat players as they themselves would wish to be treated in similar circumstances.

The cooperation of all photographers will be appreciated.
