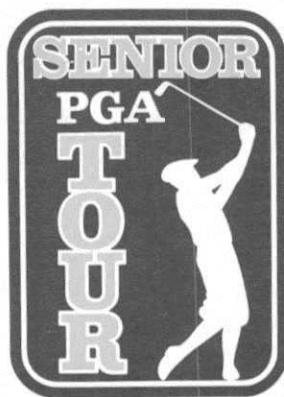

The Senior PGA TOUR, formerly a department within the overall structure of the PGA TOUR, became an operating division of the PGA TOUR in October, 1985. The restructuring, along with the naming of a new seven-man Senior PGA TOUR Division Board, gives the increasingly-popular Senior circuit greater ability to deal with its particular policies, opportunities and issues.

The seven-member Board, is composed of the following:

Three Player Directors, elected by the Senior PGA TOUR membership.

Three Independent Directors, representing the public interest. One serves as Chairman of the Board.

One PGA Director, who is the Honorary President of the PGA of America.

A Player Advisory Council consults with the Policy Board.

ABOUT THE COMMISSIONER

Deane R. Beman

Born: April 22, 1938

Entering his 14th year as Commissioner of the PGA TOUR, Deane R. Beman has overseen the most explosive period of growth in the TOUR's history, since succeeding Joseph C. Dey, Jr., on March 1, 1974.

During the Beman administration, the "business side" of the PGA TOUR has shown dramatic growth and now includes many heretofore uncharted paths, each designed to help encourage continued prosperity and to ensure the future of the game.

PGA TOUR Investments, Inc., created just five years ago, has already grown to include 14 "Stadium Golf" facilities nationally, and opened last December in Clearwater, FL, the first in a network of "Family Golf Centers." In addition to providing state-of-the-art tournament and teaching golf arenas, Tournament Players Clubs and Family Golf Centers have been instrumental in the growth of PGA TOUR assets, which have climbed from \$730,000 to more than \$50 million during the Beman era.

PGA TOUR Properties, the joint marketing venture of the TOUR and PGA of America, continues to make steady progress in its quest to open new opportunities in golf for commercial sponsors and the TOUR's members. The Nabisco Grand Prix of Golf on the Regular TOUR and the Vantage involvement with the Senior TOUR, an infusion of some \$15 million combined, is the latest example of marketing's efforts.

PGA TOUR Productions, introduced in 1985, is the TOUR's first-ever in-house TV/audio-visual production entity, the creative possibilities of which are nearly limitless. Tournament highlight films, vignettes, commercials, specialty pieces and the acclaimed "Inside the PGA TOUR" weekly half-hour show airing on ESPN are several of Production's successful projects.

Other important innovations introduced during the Beman administration include a professional Agronomy department, the Epsom Stats program, electronic scoreboards, "Official Golf Destinations" and the Diversified Products Fitness Training Center.

Competitively, the Beman era has witnessed the birth of the SENIOR PGA TOUR which started in 1980 with two events and has grown to 34 events this year. In all, almost 90 tournaments are on the combined slate with prize money having increased from \$8.2 million in 1974 to close to \$40 million this year.

The Player Retirement Plan, inaugurated in 1983, has already contributed \$3.2 million toward the future benefit of active Plan participants, and larger contributions are expected in future years.

Charity, easily the TOUR's leading money winner during the Beman era, continues to benefit at a yearly record pace. Contributions by American Golf Sponsors to charitable organizations rose to another unprecedented total of \$16.1 million and will again be substantially supplemented by \$2 million in the Nabisco Challenge Program.

During his active years as a player, Beman established an enviable slate of accomplishments, compiling one of the great amateur records of all time. He won United States Amateur titles in 1960 and 1963 and the British Amateur championship in 1959. As an amateur, Beman was a member of four Walker Cup teams, four World Amateur Cup teams and three U.S. Americas Cup squads.

At the age of 29, in 1967, he left a prosperous insurance brokerage firm in Bethesda, MD, to join the PGA TOUR as a full-time player. During his six-year professional career, he won the 1969 Texas Open, 1970 Greater Milwaukee Open, 1972 Quad Cities Open and 1973 Shrine-Robinson Classic.

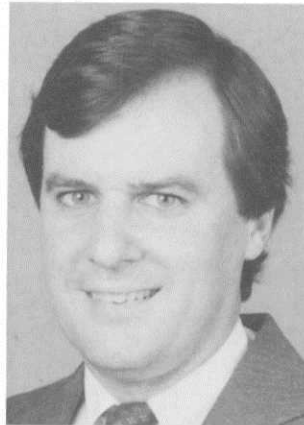

SENIOR PGA TOUR ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

1. Eligibility for Exempt Status in 1987:
 - a. Must be age 50 prior to first tournament round
 - b. Top 28 players from 1986 Official Money List
 - c. Top 28 players from Combined Career Money List (otherwise not exempt)
 - d. Top eight available players from the 1986 SENIOR PGA TOUR National Qualifying Tournament, in order of finish in the Tournament
 - e. Winners of SENIOR PGA TOUR events, if not otherwise exempt, gain one year exemptions from the date of the win.
2. Eligibility for Associate Member Status (not exempt):
 - a. Must be age 50 prior to first tournament round
 - b. Must be active member of PGA of America
3. Eligibility for Non-Senior PGA TOUR Members:
 - a. Must be age 50 prior to first tournament round
 - b. Four spots in each tournament field from Open Qualifying.
 - c. Four sponsor exemptions per tournament

NOTE: The above criteria is based upon standard 72-man format for open SENIOR PGA TOUR events. Invitational events may employ varying criteria.

VANTAGE JOINS SENIOR TOUR IN 1987



Vantage brand of R.J. Reynolds Tobacco Co. will provide sponsorship in excess of \$3 million for the 1987 SENIOR PGA TOUR.

Aspects of the Vantage program include: a \$1 million season-long points competition called the Vantage Cup; the sponsorship of the first \$1 million tournament ever on the Senior TOUR; the sponsorship of a series of major Vantage Tournaments equalling one-half to three-quarters of a million dollars; sponsoring a \$630,000 competition for Super Seniors—Senior TOUR players over 60 years old—at 18 selected Vantage Cup events; and a new advanced scoreboard system and a remodeled consumer activity pavilion, both formerly used on the Regular TOUR.

"R.J. Reynolds Tobacco Co. is determined to help make 1987 a great year for the Senior PGA TOUR," said Richard A. Kampe, executive vice-president-marketing for Reynolds Tobacco. "We've been expanding our involvement in golf since we joined the PGA TOUR in 1981, but this year, with our new commitment to the Senior PGA TOUR, Vantage is taking on a major role unmatched in any of our six previous seasons in golf."

"It has been a pleasure to work with R.J. Reynolds and Vantage in the past, and I look forward to a long relationship with the Senior TOUR in the future," said PGA TOUR Commissioner Deane R. Beman. "The Senior PGA TOUR is the most successful sports entity in the 1980's and the involvement by Vantage makes an unbeatable combination."

The \$1 million Vantage Cup will be divided among the participating Senior TOUR players and the tournament sponsors selected charities. Through a draft process, each tournament selected a two-man team to represent the event. The money will be divided among the players on the 23 teams and all the participating tournaments charities at the conclusion of the Vantage Cup season. The team with the most points in the Vantage Cup competition will win a bonus of \$125,000.

The \$1 million Vantage Championship will have players from the participating teams, the top 10 Super Seniors and Vantage Cup participants not otherwise exempt to complete the 72-man field. The Vantage Championship will be the final event in the Vantage Cup and Tournament Series with double points to be awarded. It will premiere this fall. The top 40 finishers in each official money event will earn points toward the Vantage Cup Championship. A tournament winner will earn a base of 200 points, plus additional bonus points that escalate in increments of 25 depending on the number of wins he has during the season. Double points are awarded in the Vantage sponsored events.

The first event on the Vantage Championship Series where players can earn

double bonus points will be the Vintage Invitational beginning March 19, at Indian Wells' Vintage Club. Other events currently on the Senior TOUR schedule will be selected to join the Vantage Tournament Series.

The \$630,000 competition for Super Seniors will take place at 18 events where the golfers 60 years and older will be competing in a two-day 36-hole tournament within the Senior TOUR event with a purse of \$35,000. The golfers must declare in advance whether they will play for the Super Seniors purse or the tournament prize money.

The scoreboards and consumer activity pavilion will be modified and advanced models of those formerly used on the Regular TOUR. The use of the Vantage scoreboards has changed the way galleries view golf.

Vantage Cup Team And Tournament Prize Money

Through the Vantage Cup, \$1 million in year-end bonuses will be awarded to players and tournaments on the Senior TOUR. Half the money will be divided among the players on the 23 teams and the remainder will be distributed to all participating sponsors. At the end of the season, the teams will split the prize money according to the percentage of total points contributed by each player.

Vantage Cup Points Distribution

Vantage Cup points will be awarded through the 40th-place finisher in each official Senior TOUR event ending with the \$1 million Vantage Championship. Winners receive a minimum of 200 points scaling down in increments of five points to 40th place. Tournament winners will receive 25 bonus points for a first-season win, 50 points for a second win and continues in incremental increases of 25 points for each succeeding win. Base points will be doubled in Vantage-sponsored events.

CENTINELA HOSPITAL MEDICAL CENTER

Dr. Jobe, an expert on sports medicine and team physician for several major league teams, makes periodic visits to TOUR events for personal consultations with the players regarding their physical problems and fitness programs.

Chosen as an "Official Hospital of the 1984 Olympic Games," Centinela Hospital has long enjoyed a reputation as a leader in the medical field. This reputation is so well recognized that both the White House and the State Department have chosen the facility as its treatment center whenever the President or other major dignitaries are in the Los Angeles area.

A major aspect of Centinela Hospital's reputation is its expertise in sports medicine. Centinela staff orthopedists are the team physicians for most of the Los Angeles professional teams, as well as many teams and individual athletes in all sports throughout the United States and Canada. In addition to sports medicine, Centinela Hospital is dedicated to injury prevention, performance testing, research and education.

Housing the National Athletic Health Institute at its Inglewood, California complex, Centinela Hospital stands at the forefront of treatment and research into athletic related health problems. When the PGA TOUR sought to protect the health and enhance the fitness of its players, the obvious choice was for TOUR officials to name Centinela as the "Official Hospital of the PGA TOUR."

Once again, this season will begin with Centinela Hospital providing health examinations and physical fitness testing for TOUR players, and then will develop fitness programs for each participant.

Centinela has expanded its role even further this year with the addition of the Centinela Hospital Player Training Center on the Senior TOUR. The outgrowth of a similar program that has enjoyed much success on the regular TOUR, Centinela is now providing its expertise to the Senior circuit as well.

In addition, Centinela will continue to assist in the further development of a computer program for the monitoring of the activities associated with the Diversified Products Fitness Training Center.

Finally, Centinela Hospital will continue to conduct research and develop data to use as a foundation for the continued good health of the participating PGA TOUR and Senior TOUR members.

In its initial year of use, the Player Training Center was of great help to 1986 money leader Bruce Crampton and top players Dale Douglass, Butch Baird, Jim Ferree and Charlie Sifford.

Moex, who manufactured the Center in Albany, OR, is one of the leading companies in expandable facilities. The Center is quickly expandable and will provide 500 square feet of floor space and carry sophisticated training equipment manufactured by Diversified Products.



JAMAICA BECOMES "AN OFFICIAL GOLF DESTINATION OF THE PGA TOUR"

The PGA TOUR and the country of Jamaica reached an agreement early in 1986 whereby Jamaica became "An Official Golf Destination of the PGA TOUR." The announcement was made by PGA TOUR Commissioner Deane R. Beman and Senator, the Honorable Hugh Hart, Minister of Tourism, Mining & Energy for Jamaica.

The agreement, the first of its kind ever made by the PGA TOUR, allows use of the PGA TOUR logo by Jamaica for marketing and promotional purposes. In turn, the PGA TOUR will promote golf-related travel to Jamaica through its corporate sponsors, licensees and Tournament Players Club network; design outings and travel packages geared toward Jamaica, and offer its services as consultants in golf course management and agronomy.

"We're extremely pleased to enter this unique agreement with a country such as Jamaica," said Commissioner Beman. "We're excited about the prospects of this agreement, creating a variety of events where Jamaica can play host, and look forward to the development of an outstanding relationship."

"It is indeed a pleasure and an honor for Jamaica to receive this distinction," noted Minister Hart. "I feel the PGA TOUR understands not only the objectives of this country to become a premier golf destination, but to further enhance its image as a premier tourist destination as well."

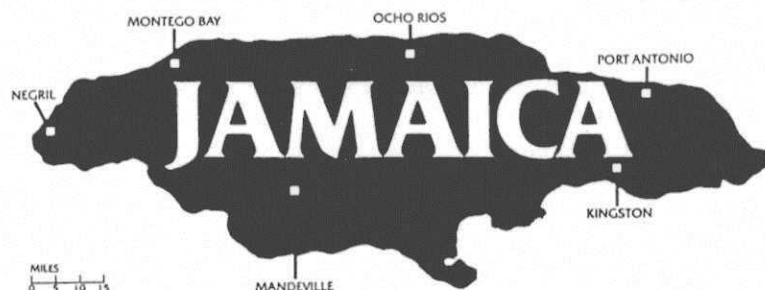
Tryall Golf & Beach Club, overlooking the Caribbean Sea on Jamaica's North Coast just west of Montego Bay, played host this past December to the \$730,000 Mazda Champions. The innovative event paired the top players from the Senior PGA TOUR with the top LPGA players in a 54-hole best ball event. The winning team, Bob Charles and Amy Alcott, split golf's richest first place prize, \$500,000, for their efforts over the 6,407-yard, par 72 Tryall layout.

The Mazda Champions is scheduled for its third year for the Tryall Golf & Beach Club this December.

The agreement also called for the creation of a highlights film by PGA TOUR Productions which featured not only the Mazda Champions, but tourism and cultural aspects of Jamaica as well.

"STADIUM GOLF"...DESIGN CONCEPT OF THE FUTURE

Born in 1980 with the opening of the Tournament Players Club at Sawgrass, a bold new concept in golf course design has swept the country, as the PGA TOUR's Tournament Players Club network had grown to 14 members by late 1986, with several others in negotiation stages.

While all of the courses vary in design, and though a number of architects are being utilized, the one common thread which binds them and makes them unique from anything seen previously is the concept of "Stadium Golf," as conceived by PGA TOUR Commissioner Deane Beman and demonstrated by the design of Pete Dye, who created the TPC at Sawgrass.

The most prominent feature of the courses is the attention paid to making the sites a most enjoyable experience for the galleries. Large spectator mounds and amphitheaters abound, affording fans the best possible vantage points for viewing golf tournaments.

As we enter the 1987 season, a total of six TPC's have hosted PGA TOUR events while two others have been the site of a Senior TOUR tournament. In 1987, the TPC of Scottsdale will host the Phoenix Open and the TPC at Star Pass will be the host course for the Tucson event. Additionally, the TPC at Prestancia will be the site of the Chrysler Cup on the Senior TOUR.

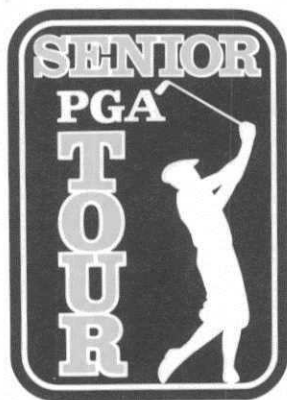
Already under construction are three more Players Clubs, the TPC at Piper Glen in Charlotte, NC, the TPC at Southwind located in Memphis, TN and the TPC at Snoqualmie Falls near Seattle, WA.

In keeping with the already established Players Clubs, both of these new courses are slated to host a PGA TOUR or Senior TOUR cosponsored event upon completion.

Suffice it to say, though, the concept of "Stadium Golf" and Tournament Players Clubs will have a significant impact on the golf world for years to come.

MEDIA REGULATIONS

The General Regulations

The following regulations are to be followed by *all* members of the Media:

1. Remain close up against gallery ropes in such a way as to appear to be a part of the gallery at all times. An ARMBAND is necessary to walk inside the gallery ropes.
2. Players are not to be distracted during play. DO NOT interview players or ask them to pose for photographs during their round.
3. DO NOT interview players or ask them to pose for photographs during their practice sessions prior to their round except by prior arrangement with the player.
4. Do not disturb players at their 18th green and/or scoring tent until after they have checked, signed and returned their scorecards.
5. If an interview is to be conducted in the practice areas, either the range or the putting green, it must be done by PRIOR ARRANGEMENT WITH THE PLAYER and up against the ropes and NOT in the middle of the areas where it could be distracting to other players.

Working Press Regulations

To avoid embarrassment to you and distraction to the contestants:

1. Do not walk or stand in playing areas.
2. Follow directions of marshals and other officials.
3. Do not interview during play. The leading players each day—and others requested—will be interviewed following their rounds in the Press Room interview area.

Tape Recorder Regulations

1. All tape recorder work should be done in the proximity of the Press Room and/or Clubhouse.
2. Tape recorders are *NOT* permitted in the locker room.
3. Tape recorders are *NOT* permitted within the playing area of the golf course.

PHOTOGRAPHY REGULATIONS

This Tournament is essentially for the players and spectators. Fair play requires that there be no noise or other distractions. The interests of all others must be subordinated to the players interests. The result of any one shot could decide the Tournament.

Only ACCREDITED PHOTOGRAPHERS for RECOGNIZED NEWS MEDIA will be permitted to take pictures during the Tournament. Photography will be restricted to news use. Commercial and personal photography is prohibited (except that spectators may take pictures on practice days and during a Pro-Am).

The following regulations apply to accredited news and television photographers and videotape cameramen as a condition of the privilege of taking pictures:

General – All Photographers

A photographer must not ask a player to pose or in any way verbally distract a player during a round.

If a player or an official requests that no photographs be taken in a certain situation, the request must be honored immediately, without discussion.

A camera must not be pointed at a player about to make a stroke in any manner which might tend to disturb him or distract his attention.

At the 9th and the 18th greens, photographers must not approach, delay or distract a player until he has checked, signed and returned his scorecard to the proper official. Under the Rules of Golf, a player turning in an incorrect scorecard in stroke play may be disqualified.

Cameras are not permitted in the locker room.

Use of golf carts or other means of transportation on the course during tournament play is prohibited.

Photography Regulations (cont'd)

Still Photographers

Only still photographers to whom armbands have been issued will be permitted inside gallery ropes. They must station themselves immediately inside such ropes, and not more than an ARM'S LENGTH FROM THE ROPES, so as to blend into the gallery and appear to be part of the gallery. They must not take conspicuous positions in the open. Any photographer who violates this regulation will forfeit the right to working inside the ropes and possibly to work at the tournament.

Close-up action shots are prohibited.

All pictures must be taken at appreciable distances, as far from the players as possible and from angles which are not acute to the line of play.

When working at a green, photographers must not position themselves directly in a player's putting line.

Pictures, even from a distance, may not be made until the player has completed his stroke. The photographer must not release his camera shutter until the shot is made.

Television/Videotape Cameramen

Television and videotape filming may be done from inside the gallery ropes, or from areas approved by the PGA TOUR. All camera personnel who have been issued PHOTO armbands will be permitted inside the gallery lines but this does not include other members of the crew. Camera personnel must station themselves immediately inside the gallery lines, not more than an arm's length from those lines, so as to blend into the gallery. They must not take conspicuous positions in the open.

Filming may be done from such locations during a player's stroke, provided modern equipment that produces a minimum of noise is used.

Post-round interviews must be filmed far enough away from the arena of play to eliminate the possibility of distraction to those competing.

Difficulties will be avoided if photographers are fair and will treat players as they themselves would wish to be treated in similar circumstances.

The cooperation of all photographers will be appreciated.
