

THE SENIOR PGA TOUR DIVISION BOARD

The Senior PGA TOUR, formerly a department within the overall structure of the PGA TOUR, became an operating division of the PGA TOUR in October, 1985. The restructuring, along with the naming of a nine-man Senior PGA TOUR Division Board, gives the Senior TOUR greater ability to deal with its particular policies, opportunities and issues.

The nine-member Board, is composed of the following:

Four Player Directors, elected by the Senior PGA TOUR membership.

Four Independent Directors, representing the public interest. One serves as Chairman of the Board.

One PGA Director, who is the Honorary President of the PGA of America.

A Player Advisory Council consults with the Policy Board.

ABOUT THE COMMISSIONER

Deane R. Beman

Born: April 22, 1938

Entering his 15th year as Commissioner of the PGA TOUR, Deane R. Beman has overseen the most explosive period of growth in the TOUR's history, since succeeding Joseph C. Dey, Jr., on March 1, 1974.

During the Beman administration, the "business side" of the PGA TOUR has shown dramatic growth and now includes many heretofore uncharted paths, each designed to help encourage continued prosperity and to ensure the future of the game.

PGA TOUR Investments, Inc., created just five years ago, has already grown to include 12 "Stadium Golf" facilities nationally, and opened in December, 1986, in Clearwater, FL, the first in a network of "Family Golf Centers." In addition to providing state-of-the-art tournament and teaching golf arenas, Tournament Players Clubs and Family Golf Centers have been instrumental in the growth of PGA TOUR assets, which have climbed from \$730,000 to more than \$62 million during the Beman era.

PGA TOUR Properties, the joint marketing venture of the TOUR and PGA of America, continues to make steady progress in its quest to open new opportunities in golf for commercial sponsors and the TOUR's members. The Nabisco Grand Prix of Golf on the Regular TOUR and the Vantage involvement with the Senior TOUR, an infusion of millions of dollars combined for players, sponsors and charities, is the largest example of marketing's efforts.

PGA TOUR Productions, introduced in 1985, is the TOUR's first-ever in-house TV/audio-visual production entity, the creative possibilities of which are nearly limitless. Tournament highlight films, vignettes, commercials, specialty pieces and the acclaimed "Inside the PGA TOUR" weekly half-hour show airing on ESPN are several of Production's successful projects.

Other important innovations introduced during the Beman administration include a professional Agronomy department, the Nabisco Stats program, electronic scoreboards, "Official Golf Destinations" and the Centinela Fitness Training Center.

Competitively, the Beman era has witnessed the birth of the SENIOR PGA TOUR which started in 1980 with two events and has grown to 37 events this year. In all, almost 90 tournaments are on the combined slate with prize money having increased from \$8.2 million in 1974 to close to \$50 million this year.

The Player Retirement Plan, inaugurated in 1983, has already contributed \$4.4 million toward the future benefit of active Plan participants, and larger contributions are expected in future years.

Charity, easily the TOUR's leading money winner during the Beman era, continues to benefit at a yearly record pace. Contributions by American Golf Sponsors to charitable organizations rose to another unprecedented total of \$17.6 million and will again be substantially supplemented by \$2 million in the Nabisco Grand Prix Program.

During his active years as a player, Beman established an enviable slate of accomplishments, compiling one of the great amateur records of all time. He won United States Amateur titles in 1960 and 1963 and the British Amateur championship in 1959. As an amateur, Beman was a member of four Walker Cup teams, four World Amateur Cup teams and three U.S. Americas Cup squads.

At the age of 29, in 1967, he left a prosperous insurance brokerage firm in Bethesda, MD, to join the PGA TOUR as a full-time player. During his six-year professional career, he won the 1969 Texas Open, 1970 Greater Milwaukee Open, 1972 Quad Cities Open and 1973 Shrine-Robinson Classic.





SENIOR PGA TOUR ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

1. Eligibility for Exempt Status in 1988:
 - a. Must be age 50 prior to first tournament round
 - b. Top 28 players from 1987 Official Money List (Floor of 50)
 - c. Top 28 players from Combined Career Money List (otherwise not exempt; Floor of 70)
 - d. Top eight available players from the 1987 SENIOR PGA TOUR National Qualifying Tournament, in order of finish in the Tournament
 - e. Winners of SENIOR PGA TOUR events, if not otherwise exempt, gain one year exemptions from the date of the win.
2. Eligibility for Non-exempt players:
 - a. Must be age 50 prior to first tournament round
 - b. Four spots in each tournament field from Open Qualifying.
 - c. Four sponsor exemptions per tournament

NOTE: The above criteria is for a standard 72-man open SENIOR PGA TOUR event. Invitational events may employ varying criteria.

A BRIEF HISTORY OF THE SENIOR PGA TOUR

The SENIOR PGA TOUR, tabbed by many as the most successful professional sports venture of the 1980s, began rather inauspiciously from discussions during 1979 in which leading senior players expressed an interest in playing several "senior" events, provided sponsors could be found and if the PGA TOUR would administer the tournaments. Prior to that time, only certain special events for tournament professionals over the age of 50 were held, most notable the Legends of Golf and the PGA Seniors Championship.

A landmark meeting on January 16, 1980, laid the formal groundwork for the SENIOR PGA TOUR. Attending that meeting were Sam Snead, Julius Boros, Gardner Dickinson, Bob Goalby, Don January, Dan Sikes and Bob Rosburg—all leaders on the Career Money List. Sikes was named Chairman of what became known as the Senior Advisory Council, and Snead was named Honorary Chairman.

At that meeting, it was recognized that any senior tour would have to trade on the reputations and images made by PGA TOUR players over their long years of activity on that tournament circuit. Eligibility criteria was therefore centered around a player's position on the Career Money List and number of career victories.

It was also determined that such a senior tour could succeed only with a format emphasizing pro-am play. So, the format for play was set with a field of 50 players (later expanded to 52) so that two rounds of pro-am play could be held and that one of these pro-am rounds could be made an official round of the tournament.

After approval of the new SENIOR PGA TOUR by the Tournament Policy Board of the PGA TOUR on January 22, 1980, work began on establishing events for Senior TOUR play. Two tournaments were conducted in 1980, one being in Atlantic City, NJ, and the other in Malbourne, FL.

The Senior TOUR grew steadily over the next few years with five events in 1981, 11 in 1982 and 18 tournaments by 1983. Prize money offered for players on the 50-and-over circuit tallied over \$3 million for the 1983 season. Miller Barber and Don January, fellow Texans, emerged as the dominant players with each winning two money titles in the first four years of the Senior TOUR, and between them, a total of 21 events. Among the other notable performers on the Senior TOUR during that stretch was a five-time winner, Arnold Palmer.

Expansion and growth continued in 1984 with 24 tournaments on the schedule worth over \$5 million in prize money, prompting January to publicly state, "If you'd have told me back in 1980 that we'd have this many events and be playing for this much money, I'd have said you were crazy."

By 1985, the Senior TOUR was large enough, 27 events worth over \$6 million, to merit its establishment as a Division of the PGA TOUR, a distinct and separate operating and financial entity, with Senior TOUR net revenue going to fund a newly-created Senior Player Retirement Plan. To help guide this fast growing circuit, a SENIOR PGA TOUR Division Board was formed consisting of three Independent Directors, three Player Directors and the immediate Past President of the PGA of America. The Division Board was later expanded from seven to nine with the addition of another Independent Director and Player Director.

Of considerable note to the Senior TOUR was the announcement prior to the 1985 season that Mazda Motors of America was joining the Senior TOUR as Presenting Sponsor for a three-year period. Mazda's commitment to the Senior TOUR included underwriting a substantial portion of the production costs for several cable telecasts each year, sponsorship of the Senior TOUR's first-ever season-long bonus pool (\$300,000) and sponsorship to the season-ending Mazda Champions, a team event placing the top Senior TOUR players with the top LPGA players, and offering a first prize of \$500,000 to the winning team.

While 1985 also saw a separate logo and licensing program developed for the Senior

TOUR, on the playing front, a different face dominated the scene. Australian Peter Thomson, a five-time British Open winner, won nine times during the 1985 season and 10 events in a 12-month stretch. The last event of the year, however, was won by a new Senior entry, Gary Player.

The following year, former two-time Vardon Trophy winner Bruce Crampton took top honors with seven Senior TOUR victories from the 28 tournaments on the 1986 schedule, while two rookies, Chi Chi Rodriguez and Dale Douglass, finished second and third on the final money list, respectively.

The start of the 1987 season marked the entry of another major corporate sponsor as the Vantage brand of R. J. Reynolds Tobacco Company introduced their Vantage Program to the 35-event Senior circuit. The Vantage involvement included a \$1 million season-long team points competition called the Vantage Cup; the sponsorship of the first \$1 million tournament on the Senior TOUR, called the Vantage Championship; sponsorship of a series of major Vantage Tournaments; sponsorship of a SUPER SENIORS Competition for players 60 years old and above, and a new advanced electronic scoreboard system and a remodeled consumer activity pavilion, both formerly used on the Regular TOUR.

The size of Senior TOUR tournament fields was expanded to 72 players in 1987, and for the first time, the pro-am portion and tournament portion of events were separated. For standard events, the two-day pro-am is now held on Wednesday and Thursday with pros only competing Friday through Sunday.

With the large majority of Senior TOUR events now having corporate sponsors, major network television coverage has expanded to eight events for the 1988 season with as many as 13 events slated for cable coverage.

Players such as Al Geiberger, Dave Hill and Bruce Devlin are now competing on a full-time basis, with Lou Graham, Phil Rodgers and Bert Yancey becoming eligible in 1988; Frank Beard, George Archer and Lee Trevino in 1989; and Jack Nicklaus on January 21, 1990.

VANTAGE CUP PROGRAM EXPANDS FOR 1988



A new point system for the Vantage Cup, and expansion of the Vantage Cup teams, new eligibility requirements for playing in the \$1 million Vantage Championship and a change in the Vantage Super Seniors competition are all refinements for the 1988 Vantage Cup sponsored by R. J. Reynolds and coordinated by RJRN Golf.

The first change has Senior PGA TOUR players participating in the \$1 million Vantage Cup program earning points based on the money they win in each official tournament during the 1988 season. Previously, players earned Vantage Cup points for a top 40 finish in each official money event, with a maximum of 200 points. Now, one dollar equals one point.

Second, the Vantage Cup teams expand from two-man to three-man teams. Players earn individual Vantage Cup points and points for the tournament they represent. At the conclusion of the Vantage Cup season, the players and teams will divide \$1 million based on finish. The winning trio will share \$125,000, based on percentage of accumulated points, while the winning tournament will receive \$75,000.

"Because of the players' response to the program this year, more want to share in the rewards of the \$1 million Vantage Cup bonus," said E. A. Horrigan, vice chairman of RJR Nabisco Inc. and Chairman and CEO of R. J. Reynolds Tobacco Company.

Third, qualifications for the \$1 million Vantage Championship, which has a first prize of \$135,000, have been altered. 1988 eligibility will be: 1) the 1987 defending champions, Al Geiberger and Mike Fetchick, 2) the top 11 Vantage Super Seniors, not otherwise exempt, on the season-long Super Seniors Money List, and 3) the remaining players, not otherwise exempt, required to complete a field of 72 from the current year's Vantage money list. The Super Seniors will again vie for \$100,000, with \$25,000 to the winner, at the Vantage Championship.

The fourth change affects competition in the Vantage Super Seniors program. In 1988, the field is expanded from 10 players to 12. Eligibility to participate includes the top ten available on the all-time victory list (Senior and Regular TOUR victories) already in the field, one sponsor's exemption and the top Super Senior, not otherwise exempt, from the previous year's money list. The 12 players will compete for \$35,000 at each event, with \$7,000 to the winner. Super Seniors competition is open to players 60 years or older.

"The changes in 1988 in the Vantage Cup program represent a refinement and continued emphasis on the Senior TOUR by Vantage," said PGA TOUR Commissioner Deane R. Beman. "1987 was a rewarding year for players and tournaments, and we expect 1988 to be even better."

VANTAGE STATISTICS

Beginning in 1988, Vantage will expand its commitment to the Senior PGA TOUR and sponsor the Senior's first statistical program.

Starting at the MONY Tournament of Champions, 10 distinct statistical categories will be tabulated with cash prizes awarded to each category winner. The 10 performance levels are average driving distance, driving accuracy, greens in regulation, putting leaders, par breakers, eagle leaders, birdie leaders, sand saves, scoring leaders and money leaders. Each individual winner will receive \$15,000 for a total purse of \$150,000.

Statistics are gathered at each Senior TOUR event by scorers who accompany each threesome. The TOUR's official statistician then enters the raw data into a computer which feeds the information back to TOUR Headquarters in Ponte Vedra, FL. There the weekly money lists and statistical standings are tabulated.

In addition to the first-time statistical program, Vantage also sponsors on the Senior TOUR the Vantage Cup team program, the Vantage Super Seniors for players 60 and older, is the host of the only \$1 million tournament on the Senior TOUR, the Vantage Championship and provides a new advanced scoreboard system and a remodeled consumer activity pavilion, both innovations which reached new heights of popularity in 1987.

Epson, the title sponsor for the Epson Stats Match on the Regular TOUR, will host a new Senior TOUR version, and will increase its role as the "Official Computer Products Company of the PGA TOUR and the Senior PGA TOUR."

CENTINELA HOSPITAL MEDICAL CENTER

In 1985, the PGA TOUR named the Centinela Hospital Medical Center as the "Official Hospital of the PGA TOUR." In 1986 the Senior PGA TOUR also came into fold. Working in conjunction with the PGA TOUR and Diversified Products, the Centinela Hospital team is headed by the internationally recognized orthopedist, Dr. Frank Jobe.

Dr. Jobe, an expert on sports medicine and team physician for several major league teams, makes periodic visits to TOUR events for personal consultations with the players regarding their physical problems and fitness programs.

Chosen as an "Official Hospital of the 1984 Olympic Games," Centinela Hospital has long enjoyed a reputation as a leader in the medical field. This reputation is so well recognized that both the White House and the State Department have chosen the facility as its treatment center whenever the President or other major dignitaries are in the Los Angeles area.

A major aspect of Centinela Hospital's reputation is its expertise in sports medicine. Centinela staff orthopedists are the team physicians for most of the Los Angeles professional teams, as well as many teams and individual athletes in all sports throughout the United States and Canada. In addition to sports medicine, Centinela Hospital is dedicated to injury prevention, performance testing, research and education.

Housing the National Athletic Health Institute at its Inglewood, California complex, Centinela Hospital stands at the forefront of treatment and research into athletic related health problems. When the PGA TOUR sought to protect the health and enhance the fitness of its players, the obvious choice was for TOUR officials to name Centinela as the "Official Hospital of the PGA TOUR."

Once again, this season will begin with Centinela Hospital providing health examinations and physical fitness testing for TOUR players, and then will develop fitness programs for each participant.

Centinela has expanded its role even further with the addition of the Centinela Hospital Player Training Center on the Senior and Regular TOUR.

Finally, Centinela Hospital will continue to conduct research and develop data to use as a foundation for the continued good health of the participating PGA TOUR and Senior TOUR members.

The association with Centinela Hospital should again prove to be a winning one for PGA TOUR professionals with increased fitness, improved performances, and injury prevention the end result.



CENTINELA PLAYER TRAINING CENTER



In 1986 Centinela Hospital expanded its association with the PGA TOUR and sponsored a mobile training center for the SENIOR PGA TOUR. In 1988 they furthered their commitment by sponsoring a unit on the Regular TOUR.

The Centinela Player Training Center premiered and was officially dedicated at the Seiko-Tucson Matchplay Championship, November 1, at Randolph Park in Tucson, AZ.

One of the most popular innovations on the circuit, the center is a mobile gymnasium that includes a state of the art line of Diversified Products exercise equipment, a massage table, television, stereo and a full line of vitamins and nutritional products.

In addition, Centinela is working in conjunction with Moex Corporation, the engineer and manufacturer of the Center. The purpose of the Center is to make use of Centinela's research findings and help players attain optimum fitness. The Player Training Center is staffed by TOUR employees Tom Jackson and Bill Dolan, registered physical therapists, under the supervision of Dr. Frank Jobe, an internationally recognized orthopedist and expert in medicine.

The Player Training Center has been of great help to 1986 money leader Bruce Crampton and top players Dale Douglass, Butch Baird, Jim Ferree, Bobby Nichols, Orville Moody, Bob Charles and Al Geiberger.

Additionally, Centinela Hospital Medical Center will provide each player with a personal physical conditioning program based on that individual's current level of conditioning and will provide noted orthopedic surgeon Dr. Jobe of the National Athletic Health Institute for consultations with the players. Dr. Jobe is a consultant to the PGA TOUR on health matters.

The Fitness Center has made its impact over the past two years with many players finding the center and the available technicians an invaluable aid to their success on the Senior TOUR. In fact, many players have commented that they would have been unable to compete in some tournaments without this facility and the training staff to administer to them.

The PGA TOUR and the country of Jamaica reached an agreement early in 1986 whereby Jamaica became "An Official Golf Destination of the PGA TOUR." In turn, the PGA TOUR will promote golf-related travel to Jamaica through its corporate sponsors, licensees and Tournament Players Club network; design outings and travel packages geared toward Jamaica, and offer its services as consultants in golf course management and agronomy.

"We're extremely pleased to enter this unique agreement with a country such as Jamaica," said Commissioner Beman. "We're excited about the prospects of this agreement, creating a variety of events where Jamaica can play host, and look forward to the development of an outstanding relationship."


"It is indeed a pleasure and an honor for Jamaica to receive this distinction," noted Minister Hart. "I feel the PGA TOUR understands not only the objectives of this country to become a premier golf destination, but to further enhance its image as a premier tourist destination as well."

Tryall Golf & Beach Club, overlooking the Caribbean Sea on Jamaica's North Coast just west of Montego Bay, has played host to the \$850,000 Mazda Champions. The innovative event paired the top players from the Senior PGA TOUR with the top LPGA players in a 54-hole best ball event. The winning team splits golf's richest first place prize, \$500,000, for their efforts over the 6,407-yard, par 72 Tryall layout.

TOURNAMENT PLAYERS CLUBS

The brainchild of PGA TOUR Commissioner Deane R. Beman, the Tournament Players Club concept has within the decade of the 80's gone from a dream to a network that now encompasses 12 courses in seven states.

It was Beman's view that the spectator had been left out in golf course design throughout the years and when it came time for the PGA TOUR to build its own course, the opportunity presented itself for Beman to build a course that not only challenged the players, but allowed spectators to see the action as never before.

It's called "Stadium Golf" and once you've viewed a tournament on a Stadium Golf Course, you'll understand why the network has grown so rapidly in such a short period of time.

Spectator mounds abound that afford fans unrestricted views whether on tee shots, fairway shots or on the greens. In fact, the 18th hole at the original TPC at Sawgrass can accommodate crowds of some 30,000 people—all with a clean view of the action. You won't see any periscopes at an event on a Players Club.

The network began with the club at Sawgrass where it annually hosts the The Players Championship and quickly grew into the present number of 12. All TPC's are designed to host PGA TOUR or Senior PGA TOUR events and to date the clubs have been designed by some of the top architects in the business—Pete Dye, Arnold Palmer, Arthur Hills, Jay Morrish, Bob Cupp and the Von Hagge/Devlin team to name a few.

In addition, one of the things that adds a bit of spice to all TPC's is that a PGA TOUR player (or in some cases, two) are assigned to serve as a consultant to the designer. To date, Ed Sneed, Tom Weiskopf, Fuzzy Zoeller, Hubert Green, Craig Stadler and Ben Crenshaw have been among those lending their expertise to the TPC Network.

Truly a nationwide country club, a membership at one TPC affords the member a chance to play at any of the other clubs across the country and an opportunity to view the greatest players in the world in action on his own course once a year.

In fact, Tournament Players Clubs are developed only in places where such courses will substantially improve tournament sites. In short, they are built with the guidance and expertise of the PGA TOUR and financed by the local real estate developers, to provide fans with the best possible atmosphere in which to enjoy tournament golf, and to offer a challenging and rewarding golf experience for members. Only in cases where local tournament sponsoring organizations whole-heartedly endorse such deals are Tournament Players Clubs practical or prudent.

While there is ultimately no definitive number of Tournament Players Clubs planned, the PGA TOUR will always judge a potential site's merits with the concerns of the fans, the developer and the local tournament sponsors in mind.


Since the Tournament Players Club at Sawgrass opened in 1980, the TPC Network has now truly become "the best set of clubs in America."

MEDIA REGULATIONS

The General Regulations

The following regulations are to be followed by *all* members of the Media:

1. Remain close up against gallery ropes in such a way as to appear to be a part of the gallery at all times. An ARMBAND is necessary to walk inside the gallery ropes.
2. Players are not to be distracted during play. DO NOT interview players or ask them to pose for photographs during their round.
3. DO NOT interview players or ask them to pose for photographs during their practice sessions prior to their round except by prior arrangement with the player.
4. Do not disturb players at their 18th green and/or scoring tent until after they have checked, signed and returned their scorecards.
5. If an interview is to be conducted in the practice areas, either the range or the putting green, it must be done by PRIOR ARRANGEMENT WITH THE PLAYER and up against the ropes and NOT in the middle of the areas where it could be distracting to other players.

Working Press Regulations

To avoid embarrassment to you and distraction to the contestants:

1. Do not walk or stand in playing areas.
2. Follow directions of marshals and other officials.
3. Do not interview during play. The leading players each day—and others requested—will be interviewed following their rounds in the Press Room interview area.

Tape Recorder Regulations

1. All tape recorder work should be done in the proximity of the Press Room and/or Clubhouse.
2. Tape recorders are *NOT* permitted in the locker room.
3. Tape recorders are *NOT* permitted within the playing area of the golf course.

PHOTOGRAPHY REGULATIONS

This Tournament is essentially for the players and spectators. Fair play requires that there be no noise or other distractions. The interests of all others must be subordinated to the players interests. The result of any one shot could decide the Tournament.

Only ACCREDITED PHOTOGRAPHERS for RECOGNIZED NEWS MEDIA will be permitted to take pictures during the Tournament. Photography will be restricted to news use. Commercial and personal photography is prohibited (except that spectators may take pictures on practice days and during a Pro-Am).

The following regulations apply to accredited news and television photographers and videotape cameramen as a condition of the privilege of taking pictures:

General—All Photographers

A photographer must not ask a player to pose or in any way verbally distract a player during a round.

If a player or an official requests that no photographs be taken in a certain situation, the request must be honored immediately, without discussion.

A camera must not be pointed at a player about to make a stroke in any manner which might tend to disturb him or distract his attention.

At the 9th and the 18th greens, photographers must not approach, delay or distract a player until he has checked, signed and returned his scorecard to the proper official. Under the Rules of Golf, a player turning in an incorrect scorecard in stroke play may be disqualified.

Cameras are not permitted in the locker room.

Use of golf carts or other means of transportation on the course during tournament play is prohibited.

Still Photographers

Only still photographers to whom armbands have been issued will be permitted inside gallery ropes. They must station themselves immediately inside such ropes, and not more than an ARM'S LENGTH FROM THE ROPES, so as to blend into the gallery and appear to be part of the gallery. They must not take conspicuous positions in the open. Any photographer who violates this regulation will forfeit the right to working inside the ropes and possibly to work at the tournament.

Close-up action shots are prohibited.

All pictures must be taken at appreciable distances, as far from the players as possible and from angles which are not acute to the line of play.

When working at a green, photographers must not position themselves directly in a player's putting line.

Pictures, even from a distance, may not be made until the player has completed his stroke. The photographer must not release his camera shutter until the shot is made.

Television/Videotape Cameramen

Television and videotape filming may be done from inside the gallery ropes, or from areas approved by the PGA TOUR. All camera personnel who have been issued PHOTO armbands will be permitted inside the gallery lines but this does not include other members of the crew. Camera personnel must station themselves immediately inside the gallery lines, not more than an arm's length from those lines, so as to blend into the gallery. They must not take conspicuous positions in the open.

Filming may be done from such locations during a player's stroke, provided modern equipment that produces a minimum of noise is used.

Post-round interviews must be filmed far enough away from the arena of play to eliminate the possibility of distraction to those competing.

Difficulties will be avoided if photographers are fair and will treat players as they themselves would wish to be treated in similar circumstances.

The cooperation of all photographers will be appreciated.
