

# **ABOUT THE COMMISSIONER**

#### Deane R. Beman

Born: April 22, 1938

Birthplace: Washington, DC Family: Wife, Judy; five children

Entering his 17th year as Commissioner of the PGA TOUR, Deane R. Beman has overseen the most explosive period of growth in the TOUR's history, since succeeding Joseph C. Dey, Jr, on March 1, 1974.

During the Beman administration, the "business side" of the PGA TOUR has shown dramatic growth and now includes many heretofore uncharted paths, each designed to help encourage continued prosperity and to ensure the future of the game.

PGA TOUR Investments, Inc., created just seven years ago, has already grown to include 13 "Stadium Golf" facilities nationally with another five in planning or construction stages across the United States. In 1989,



TPC International was added to the network with the announcement of the initial three clubs in Japan. In December, 1986, in Clearwater, FL, the PGA TOUR opened the first in a network of "Family Golf Centers." In 1989 the TOUR opened another "Family Golf Center" at the Golf Club of Jacksonville, a municipal course the PGA TOUR built for the city of Jacksonville. In addition to providing state-of-the-art tournament and teaching golf arenas, Tournament Players Clubs and Family Golf Centers have been instrumental in the growth of PGA TOUR assets, which have climbed from \$730,000 to more than \$80 million during the Beman era.

PGA/PGA TOUR Properties, the joint marketing venture of the TOUR and PGA of America, continues to make steady progress in its quest to open new opportunities in golf for commercial sponsors and the TOUR's members. The Nabisco Golf competitions on the Regular TOUR and the Vantage Cup involvement with the Senior TOUR, an infusion of millions of dollars combined for players, sponsors and charities, is the largest example of these efforts.

PGA TOUR Productions, introduced in 1985, is the TOUR's first-ever in-house TV/audio-visual production entity, the creative possibilities of which are nearly limitless. Tournament highlight films, vignettes, commercials, specialty pieces and the acclaimed "Inside the PGA TOUR" weekly half-hour show airing on ESPN are several of Production's successful projects.

Other important innovations introduced during the Beman administration include a professional Agronomy department, the Nabisco Stats program, electronic scoreboards, "Official Golf Destinations" and the Centinela Hospital Fitness Van.

Competitively, the Beman era has witnessed the birth of the SENIOR PGA TOUR which started in 1980 with two events and has grown to 40 events this year, and the Ben Hogan Tour, which debuts with 30 events this year. In all, over 120 tournaments are on the combined slate with prize money having increased from \$8.2 million in 1974 to approximately \$75 million this year.

The Player Retirement Plan, inaugurated in 1983, has already contributed \$10 million toward the future benefit of active Plan participants, and larger contributions are expected in future years.

Charity, easily the TOUR's leading money winner during the Beman era, continues to benefit at a yearly record pace. Contributions by American Golf Sponsors to charitable organizations rose to another unprecedented total of \$19.8 million and will again be substantially supplemented by \$2 million in the Nabisco Team Charity Competition.

During his active years as a player, Beman established an enviable slate of accomplishments, compiling one of the great amateur records of all time. He won United States Amateur titles in 1960 and 1963 and the British Amateur championship in 1959. As an amateur, Beman was a member of four Walker Cup teams, four World Amateur Cup teams and three U.S. Americas Cup squads.

At the age of 29, in 1967, he left a prosperous insurance brokerage firm in Bethesda, MD, to join the PGA TOUR as a full-time player. During his six-year professional career, he won the 1969 Texas Open, 1970 Greater Milwaukee Open, 1972 Quad Cities Open and 1973 Shrine-Robinson Classic.

# A BRIEF HISTORY OF THE SENIOR PGA TOUR



The SENIOR PGA TOUR, tabbed by many as the most successful professional sports venture of the 1980s, began rather inauspiciously from discussions during 1979 in which leading senior players expressed an interest in playing several "senior" events, provided sponsors could be found and if the PGA TOUR would administer the tournaments. Prior to that time, only certain special events for tournament professionals over the age of 50 were held, most notably the Legends of Golf and the PGA Seniors Championship.

A landmark meeting on January 16, 1980, laid the formal groundwork for the SENIOR PGA TOUR. Attending that meeting were Sam Snead, Julius Boros, Gardner Dickinson, Bob Goalby, Don January and the late Dan Sikes—all leaders on the Career Money List. Sikes was named Chairman of what became known as the Senior Advisory Council, and Snead was named Honorary Chairman.

At that meeting, it was recognized that any senior tour would have to trade on the reputations and images made by PGA TOUR players over their long years of activity on that tournament circuit. Eligibility criteria were therefore centered around a player's position on the Career Money List and number of career victories.

It was also determined that such a senior tour could succeed only with a format emphasizing pro-am play. So, the format for play was set with a field of 50 players (later expanded to 52) so that two rounds of pro-am play could be held and that one of these pro-am rounds could be made an official round of the tournament.

After approval of the new SENIOR PGA TOUR by the Tournament Policy Board of the PGA TOUR on January 22,1980, work began on establishing events for Senior TOUR play. Two tournaments were conducted in 1980, one in Atlantic City, NJ, (won by Don January) and the other in Melbourne, FL (won by Charlie Sifford).

The Senior TOUR grew steadily over the next few years with five events in 1981, 11 in 1982 and 18 tournaments by 1983. Prize money offered for players on the 50-and-over circuit tallied over \$3 million for the 1983 season. Miller Barber and Don January, fellow Texans, emerged as the dominant players with each winning two money titles in the first four years of the Senior TOUR, and between them, a total of 21 events. Among the other notable performers on the Senior TOUR during that stretch was a five-time winner, Arnold Palmer.

Expansion and growth continued in 1984 with 24 tournaments on the schedule worth over \$5 million in prize money, prompting January to publicly state, "If you'd have told me back in 1980 that we'd have this many events and be playing for this much money, I'd have said you were crazy."

By 1985, the Senior TOUR was large enough, 27 events worth over \$6 million, to merit its establishment as a Division of the PGA TOUR, a distinct and separate operating and financial entity, with Senior TOUR net revenue going to fund a newly-created Senior Player Retirement Plan. To help guide this fast growing circuit, a SENIOR PGA TOUR Division Board was formed consisting of three Independent Directors, three Player Directors and the immediate Past President of the PGA of America. The Division Board was later expanded from seven to nine with the addition of another Independent Director and Player Director.

Of considerable note to the Senior TOUR was the annoucement prior to the 1985 season that a cable television package on ESPN had been put together allowing seven events to enjoy national cable coverage, with the production costs partially funded by Mazda Motors of America. Mazda also helped create the Senior TOUR's first ever season-long bonus pool (\$300,000) and sponsored a \$1 million season-ending team event

in conjunction with the LPGA.

While 1985 also saw a separate logo and licensing program developed for the Senior TOUR, on the playing front, a different face dominated the scene. Australian Peter Thomson, a five-time British Open winner, won a record nine tournaments during the 1985 season and 10 events in a 12-month stretch. The last event of the year, however, was won by a new Senior entry, Gary Player.

The following year, former two-time Vardon Trophy winner Bruce Crampton took top honors with seven Senior TOUR victories from the 28 tournaments on the 1986 schedule, while two rookies, Chi Chi Rodriguez and Dale Douglass, finished second

and third on the final money list, respectively.

The start of the 1987 season marked the entry of another major corporate sponsor as the Vantage brand of R. J. Reynolds Tobacco Company introduced their Vantage Program to the 35-event Senior circuit. The Vantage involvement included a \$1 million season-long team points competition called the Vantage Cup; the sponsorship of the first \$1 million tournament on the Senior TOUR, called the Vantage Championship; sponsorship of a series of major Vantage Tournaments; sponsorship of a SUPER SENIORS Competition for players 60 years old and above, and a new advanced electronic scoreboard system and a remodeled consumer activity pavilion, both formerly used on the Regular TOUR.

The size of Senior TOUR tournament fields was expanded to 72 players in 1987, and for the first time, the pro-am portion and tournament portion of events were separated. For standard events, the two-day pro-am was held on Wednesday and Thursday with pros only competing Friday through Sunday. That format remains in

effect today.

Expansion of the Vantage Cup highlighted the 1988 campaign, as the Senior circuit grew to 37 events. In addition to refining its existing programs, Vantage began sponsorship of the Senior TOUR's first-ever statistical program, with season-ending leaders in each of 10 stats categories receiving cash bonuses. Bob Charles, the most successful left-hander in golf history, enjoyed a record-setting year, establishing a new single-season earnings mark on the Senior TOUR as he pocketed \$533,929.

Continued growth marked the 1989 season . With Don Bies, Lou Graham and Homero Blancas all having made successful debuts in 1988, they were joined in 1989 by Frank Beard, Mike Hill, Jim Dent, Larry Ziegler, George Archer, and in the last official event, Lee Trevino. R.J. Reynolds hosted an expanded \$1.5 million Championship, offered another \$750,000 in individual bonus money, and yet another \$750,000 in bonuses to other Senior TOUR tournaments. With the RJR bonus money counting as "official" prize money, Charles again set the earnings pace with a record \$725,887.

While much of the attention in 1990 is being focused on Jack Nicklaus, two new agreements have greatly helped to secure the continued growth of the Senior TOUR. Cadillac Motor Car Division has signed on for three years as "the official car of the SENIOR PGA TOUR" and will help fund production costs for 14 televised events on cable in 1990, 15 in 1991 and 16 in 1992. In all, 24 events will be televised nationally either on network or cable. ESPN has agreed to provide better and more secure airtimes for Senior TOUR telecasts as well as a minimum number of events to be aired on a yearly basis. These changes should help strengthen viewer patterns and ratings for Senior TOUR golf.

In all, the 1990 schedule features 42 events worth close to \$20 million in total prize money.

- 1. Eligibility for Exempt Status in 1990:
  - a. Must be age 50 prior to first tournament round
  - b. Top 31 available players from the 1989 Official Money List (Floor of 50)
  - Top 31 available players from the Combined Career Money List (not otherwise exempt; Floor of 70)
  - d. Top eight available players from the 1989 SENIOR PGA TOUR National Qualifying Tournament, in order of finish
  - e. Winners of SENIOR PGA TOUR events, if not otherwise exempt, gain one-year exemptions from the date of the win
- 2. Eligibility for Non-exempt Players:
  - a. Must be age 50 prior to first tournament round
  - b. Four spots in each tournament field from Open Qualifying
  - c. Four sponsor exemptions per tournament

NOTE: The above requirements apply to standard 78-man format for open SENIOR PGA TOUR events. Invitational tournaments may employ varying criteria.

#### VANTAGE CLASSICS ELIGIBILITY

The Vantage Classics competition consists of players within the starting field who are 60 years of age or older and who have at least one All-Time Victory. Vantage Classics events will include all players in this category within the starting field of 78.

# VANTAGE CUP ENTERS FOURTH SEASON ON SENIOR TOUR

The Vantage brand of R. J. Reynolds Tobacco Co. returns this year to support a series of programs on the SENIOR PGA TOUR. The 1990 campaign marks the fourth season of major involvement in the Senior TOUR for R.J. Reynolds, and each year the programs have grown in scope and popularity.

A number of components comprise the 1990 Vantage Cup program.

- The Vantage Cup is the season-long bonus pool competition for Senior TOUR players and the tournaments they represent. The competition is based on cumulative earnings of players and the three-man teams drafted by Senior TOUR tournaments. Players contend for \$750,000 in bonuses in the \$1.5 million competition, with the top finisher collecting \$112,500. Vantage Cup individual prize money is awarded as official earnings at the conclusion of the season. The remaining \$750,000 is distributed to the tournaments based on the cumulative performance of the three players making up their respective teams. The event represented by the winning squad receives \$100,000. Each of the 34 participating tournaments receives a minimum of \$10,000.
- Vantage Classics, formerly labeled Vantage Super Seniors, will be featured at 25 Senior TOUR events in 1990. Unlike prior years when fields were limited to 12 competitors, the Vantage Classics competitions in 1990 will include all players within the tournament field who are age 60 and over and who have at least one PGA TOUR or SENIOR PGA TOUR victory. Often referred to as "a tournament within a tournament," Vantage Classics events have become a popular part of Senior TOUR tournaments.
- The Vantage Championship, the richest event on the SENIOR PGA TOUR with a total purse of \$1.5 million, is held at famed Tanglewood Park near Winston-Salem, NC. The 1990 Vantage Championship winner will pocket \$202,500. The Vantage Classics will vie for \$150,000 from the total championship purse, with the winner receiving \$30,000.
- Vantage brand again will sponsor the season-long statistical competition on the Senior TOUR. At the conclusion of the year, the leader in each of the 10 Vantage Stats categories will receive a bonus from R. J. Reynolds.
- Vantage also supports on-site programs, including the state-of-the-art electronic scoreboard system and spectator activity pavilion.

## **VANTAGE STATS**

For the third year, the SENIOR PGA TOUR will include a season-long statistical program sponsored by the Vantage brand of R.J. Reynolds Tobacco Company. Starting with the MONY Senior Tournament of Champions in January, statistics will be compiled in 10 different categories, with Vantage awarding a \$15,000 bonus to the 10 individual stats champions at the conclusion of the season.

The 10 categories consist of Scoring, Driving Distance, Driving Accuracy, Greens in Regulation, Par-Breakers, Putting, Eagles, Birdies, Sand-Saves and All-Around.

Statistics in each of these areas are gathered at each Senior TOUR event by volunteer scorers accompanying each grouping. The Senior TOUR's official statistician enters the data into a computer which feeds the information back to PGA TOUR headquarters in Ponte Vedra, FL. There the weekly lists and standings are compiled. Epson computer products are employed to gather and tabulate the statistical data. Epson, the "Official Computer Products of the PGA TOUR and SENIOR PGA TOUR," again will sponsor the Epson Senior Stats Match, a nine-hole competition featuring the leaders in each of the statistical categories.

#### CADILLAC JOINS THE SENIOR PGA TOUR

Starting in 1990, the SENIOR PGA TOUR and the Cadillac Motor Car Division begin a new three-year partnership. Cadillac becomes "The Official Car of the SENIOR

PGA TOUR" and the umbrella sponsor for a series of Senior TOUR events televised on ESPN.

By underwriting a portion of the production costs for each of the "Cadillac Series" of televised events on ESPN, Cadillac will greatly help solidify the Senior TOUR's presence on national cable television. This Cadillac Series will consist of 14 events in 1990, 15 in 1991 and 16 in 1992.

Cadillac will also provide a minimum of 60 courtesy cars to each Series event as well as cars for on-site tournament staff and headquarters staff use.

In order to help strengthen its involvement with the Senior TOUR and maximize publicity for the Cadillac Series, Cadillac will award its premium car series -- Allante, Fleetwood 60 Special and Seville STS -- to the best overall performer in the 1990 Cadillac Series of events. Performance will be based on official prize money earned in each Cadillac Series tournament. The player with the most prize money won from these 14 events will be the 1990 winner and receive the three-car Cadillac collection.

Cadillac will also help publicize the Senior TOUR and its involvement through the placement of "tune-in-and-watch" advertisements in major magazines and newspapers, as well as the creation of dealer tie-ins and promotions surrounding each Cadillac Series event.

Also of note is a new three-year agreement with ESPN that provides even greater television coverage than it has enjoyed over the past few years. The three-day coverage of events will include better and more consistent airtimes which should allow the Senior TOUR to develop stronger viewing patterns among golf fans and appreciably increase ratings.

The original concept of the PGA TOUR, The Tournament Players Clubs have within the decade of the 80's gone from a dream to a network that now encompasses 21 courses in 12 states and now with the addition of TPC International, two countries.

It was the TOUR's view that the spectator had been left out in golf course design throughout the years and when it came time for the PGA TOUR to build its own course, the opportunity presented itself for the TOUR to build a course that not only challenged the players, but allowed spectators to see the action as never before.

It's called "Stadium Golf" and once you've viewed a tournament on a Stadium Golf Course, you'll understand why the network has grown in such a short period of time.

Spectator mounds abound that afford fans unrestricted views whether on tee shots, fairway shots or on the greens. In fact, the 18th hole at the original TPC at Sawgrass can accommodate crowds of some 30,000 people-all with a clean view of the action. You won't see any periscopes at an event on a Players Club course.

The network began in 1980 with the club at Sawgrass where it annually hosts THE PLAYERS Championship, and quickly grew into the present number of 21. All TPCs are designed to host PGA TOUR or Senior PGA TOUR events and to date the clubs have been designed by some of the top architects in the business-Pete Dye, Arnold Palmer, Arthur Hills, Jay Morrish, Bob Cupp, the Von Hagge/Devlin team and Jack Nicklaus to name just a few.

In addition, one of the things that adds a bit of spice to all TPCs is that a PGA TOUR player (or in some cases, two) are assigned to serve as a consultant to the designer. To date, Ed Sneed, Tom Weiskopf, Fuzzy Zoeller, Hubert Green, Craig Stadler, Ben Crenshaw, Al Geiberger and Chi Chi Rodriguez have been among those lending their expertise to the TPC Network.

In reality a nationwide country club, a membership at one TPC affords the member a chance to play at any of the other clubs across the country and an opportunity to view the greatest players in the world in action on his own course once a year.

Since the Tournament Players Club at Sawgrass opened, the TPC Network has now truly become "the best set of clubs in America."

# MERRILL LYNCH SHOOT-OUT SERIES

The Merrill Lynch Shoot-Out Series joined the SENIOR PGA TOUR in full force in 1989 and proved to be an extremely popular addition to tournament-week activities. The series will return for the 1990 campaign.

A 10-player competition over nine holes of play, Merrill Lynch Shoot-Outs will be held at 12 different SENIOR PGA TOUR events in 1990, with top Senior TOUR stars vying for \$10,200 in prize money at each contest.

The Merrill Lynch Shoot-Out format is simple to understand and exciting to follow. Ten players begin, and on each hole the player with the highest score is eliminated. Should more than one player tie for the high score, a sudden-death playoff involving a pitch, chip, bunker shot or long putt will be held. The player whose ball comes to rest farthest from the hole is dropped from the field.

The field for the Shoot-Out is made up of that tournament's defending champion, the top three players entered in that tournament from the current year's money list, the top three players in that tournament from the All-Time Money List and three sponsor selections.

At the conclusion of the season, Merrill Lynch will sponsor a Shoot-Out championship (date and site TBA) in which 10 players will contend for additional prize money. The competitors in that final event will include the top five money-winners on the 1990 SENIOR PGA TOUR Official Money List, the top three money-winners from the season-long Merrill Lynch Shoot-Out Series, and two sponsor picks.

The 1990 Merrill Lynch Shoot-Outs will be conducted on the Tuesday of tournament week.

# **MEDIA REGULATIONS**

### The General Regulations

The following regulations are to be followed by all members of the Media:

- An ARMBAND is necessary to walk inside the galley ropes. Remain not more than an arm's length from the ropes, so as to blend into the gallery and appear to be a part of the gallery at all times.
- Players are not to be distracted during play. DO NOT interview players or ask them to pose for photographs during their round.
- DO NOT interview players or ask them to pose for photographs during their practice sessions prior to their round except by prior arrangement with the player.
- 4. If an interview is to be conducted in the practice areas, either the range or the putting green, it must be done by PRIOR ARRANGEMENT WITH THE PLAYER and up against the ropes and NOT in the middle of the areas where it could be distracting to other players.
- DO NOT disturb players at their 18th green and/or scoring tent until after they have checked, signed and returned their scorecards.

### Working Press Regulations

To avoid embarrassment to you and distraction to the contestants:

- 1. Do not walk or stand in playing areas.
- 2. Follow directions of marshals and other officials.
- Do not interview during play. The leading players each day and others requested will be interviewed following their rounds in the Press Room interview area.

### **Tape Recorder Regulations**

- All tape recorder work should be done in the proximity of the Press Room and/or Clubbouse.
- Tape recorders are NOT permitted in the locker room.
- Tape recorders are NOT permitted within the playing area of the golf course unless written permission has been granted from the PGA TOUR and/or the tournament sponsor.

### Rain Delay Guidelines

- During rain delay situations, NO ONE other than players and essential staff will be permitted in the locker room. This means the Media is not permitted in the locker room in such situations. However, whenever possible, arrangements will be made to provide players for interviews during such situations.
- Fully accredited members of the news media WILL BE WELCOMED into the locker room at all other times to carry out their assigned duties. (Note: Cameras and tape recorders are NOT permitted.)

### PHOTOGRAPHY REGULATIONS

This Tournament is essentially for the players and spectators. Fair play requires that there be no noise or other distractions. The interests of all others must be subordinated to the players interests. The result of any one shot could decide the Tournament.

Only ACCREDITED PHOTOGRAPHERS for RECOGNIZED NEWS MEDIA will be permitted to take pictures during the Tournament. Photo assistants may be issued a credential, but not photo arm bands for access inside the ropes. Photography will be restricted to news use. Commercial and personal photography is prohibited (except that spectators may take pictures on practice days and during a Pro-Am). Free lance photographers shooting on speculation will NOT BE ACCREDITED.

The following regulations apply to accredited news and television photographers and videotape cameramen as a condition of the privilege of taking pictures:

### General - All Photographers

A photographer must not ask a player to pose or in any way verbally distract a player during a round.

If a player or an official requests that no photographs be taken in a certain situation, the request must be honored immediately, without discussion.

A camera must not be pointed at a player about to make a stroke in any manner which might tend to disturb him or distract his attention.

At the 9th and the 18th greens, photographers must not approach, delay or distract a player until he has checked, signed and returned his scorecard to the proper official. Under the Rules of Golf, a player turning in an incorrect scorecard in stroke play may be disqualified.

Cameras are not permitted in the locker room.

Use of golf carts or other means of transportation on the course during tournament play is prohibited.

### Still Photographers

Only still photographers to whom armbands have been issued will be permitted inside gallery ropes. They must station themselves immediately inside such ropes, and not more than an ARM'S LENGTH FROM THE ROPES, so as to blend into the gallery and appear to be part of the gallery. They must not take conspicuous positions in the open. Any photographer who violates this regulation will forfeit the right to work inside the ropes and possibly to work at the tournament.

Close-up action shots are prohibited.

All pictures must be taken at appreciable distances, as far from the players as possible and from angles which are not acute to the line of play.

When working at a green, photographers must not position themselves directly in a player's putting line.

Pictures, even from a distance, may not be made until the player has completed his stroke. The photographer must not release his camera shutter until the shot is made.

### Television / Videotape Cameramen

Television and videotape filming may be done from inside the gallery ropes, or from areas approved by the PGA TOUR. All camera personnel who have been issued PHOTO armbands will be permitted inside the gallery lines but this does not include other members of the crew. Camera personnel must station themselves immediately inside the gallery lines, not more than an arm's length from those lines, so as to blend into the gallery. They must not take conspicuous positions in the open.

Filming may be done from such locations during a player's stroke, provided modern equipment that produces a minimum of noise is used.

Post-round interviews must be filmed far enough away from the arena of play to eliminate the possibility of distraction to those competing.

Difficulties will be avoided is photographers are fair and will treat players as they themselves would wish to be treated in similar circumstances.

The cooperation of all photographers will be appreciated.

Water sports aren't the only lures in **The Bahamas**. Golf is an important part of a Grand Bahama Island and in Nassau/Cable Beach vacation. Five top golf resorts receive advice on golf course care from PGA TOUR Agronomy Service. Excellent courses join forces with quality resorts for a complete golf getaway.

Puerto Rico offers great golf, a great Caribbean vacation, and tournament play as well. In December 1990, Puerto Rico hosts the New York Life Champions Classic at the Hyatt Dorado Beach. This seasonending event on the Senior PGA TOUR will be televised by ABC and ESPN. The top 30 Senior money-winners for the year will vie for \$1 million in prize money.

### **Travel Partners**

The PGA TOUR's "travel partners" work to make golf-related travel as easy as possible.

Delta Air Lines is the "official airline of the PGA TOUR." Delta promotes general air travel to golf destinations. TOUR members and staff receive special air fares. PGA TOUR activities appear in Delta's Sky magazine. All Delta timetables feature Regular and Senior PGA TOUR schedules. And Delta keeps its Frequent Flyers updated on a variety of PGA TOUR activities.

Golfers and fans often look for leisure and luxury in vacation travel. Royal Caribbean Cruise Line is the "official cruise line of the PGA TOUR." The "Golf Ahoy!" program is good for TOUR golfers and tourists alike. Host Golf Professionals may earn a cruise for two in exchange for teaching golf to cruise passengers. In February 1990, the company begins sponsorship of the Royal Caribbean Classic. This Senior event Key Biscayne, FL, is televised on ESPN.

When the plane lands or the boat docks, golfers turn to **National Car Rental System**. The PGA TOUR's "official car rental company" offers good rental rates on new cars to TOUR members and staff. National also supplies cars for THE PLAYERS Championship. The company publicizes its TOUR connection in its Emerald Club Newsletter for frequent renters.

Marriott, "official hotel and resort of the PGA TOUR," is where golfers hang their hats and lay their heads. PGA TOUR members, headquarters staff, and sponsors receive corporate hotel rates. Marriott also offers special bonus points under its "Honored Guest" program.

### **On-Site Marketing Partners**

Along with RJR/Nabisco, a wide variety of other companies have joined forces with the PGA TOUR. These companies trade their goods and services for

exposure to golf's fans and players.

Epson America, the computer company, works closely with RJR/Nabisco on the electronic scoreboards. Epson provides the computers to operate the scoreboards during TOUR events. In addition, Epson compiles the Nabisco Stats on the Regular PGA TOUR and the Vantage Stats on the Senior TOUR. These programs decide who will play in the Regular and Senior TOUR Epson Stats matches, televised at the end of each season. Epson also supplies PGA TOUR Headquarters with personal computers for daily business activities.

Merrill Lynch sponsors the popular Merrill Lynch Shoot-Outs at Regular and Senior TOUR events. This 10-man, nine-hole, elimination event culminates in a year-end Finals competition. The Shoot-Out is a real fan-pleaser wherever it appears.

Gatorade sponsors a series of Youth Clinics during Regular TOUR events. Here touring prostake time out from their competition schedule to share their knowledge and experience (and maybe a few laughs, too) with the golfers of tomorrow.

Buick Motor Division is a long-time marketing partner and "official car of the PGA TOUR." The Buick celebrated its 25th year as a Regular TOUR event in 1989. In 1990, Buick adds the Buick Classic to the events it sponsors. The company also provides courtesy cars for most Regular PGA TOUR events.

Other PGA TOUR marketing partners supply special services during PGA TOUR events on the Regular and Senior TOURs.

MCI Communications sponsors the MCI Heritage Classic on the Regular PGA TOUR. At tournaments, MCI provides free long-distance telephone service to the players' locker rooms. This service has been a feature on the Regular PGA TOUR for some time. In 1990, MCI extends that service to players on the Senior TOUR.

United Van Lines changes its tournament activity for 1990. Last year the company sponsored Senior TOUR golf clinics. This year, it has begun a program to provide promotional golf posters to both Regular and Senior TOUR events.

Finally, two top golf magazines print special inserts to help fans keep up with PGA TOUR events. **Golf Digest** publishes Senior TOUR Journal in its February issue, and distributes the insert at Senior TOUR events. TV Picture also appears twice each year as a Golf Digest insert.

Golf Magazine covers Regular TOUR events in TOUR Magazine. The insert appears in the January issue, and as a handout at most Regular PGA TOUR events. This year Golf Magazine also covers the Ben Hogan Tour, and distributes its supplement at Hogan Tour tournaments.









### **Other Marketing Partners**

The PGA TOUR's upscale golf audience attracts all kinds of businesses to its sport.

Philips Consumer Electronics is a new partner this year, the "preferred consumer electronics company." Philips offers players and staff special prices on audio and video products. It is one of the largest companies of its kind in the world. Philips' inventions include the audio cassette, compact disc player, and laser optical video disc. The company



also manufactures and markets Magnavox and Sylvania brands in the U.S.

If you like computer games, you'll like **Electronic Arts**, another new licensee of the PGA TOUR. The company will make and sell a state-of-the-art computer golf game. The scene? TPC golf courses. The challenge? A chance to shoot it out on your own computer against top PGA TOUR players.

**Doubleday** has joined forces with the PGA TOUR to publish the TOUR's first hard-cover book, The History of the PGA TOUR. The book was written by Al Barkow, noted golf historian, with a foreword by Commissioner Deane Beman. Packed with information about the TOUR and its players, the book is now available at bookstores across the country.


