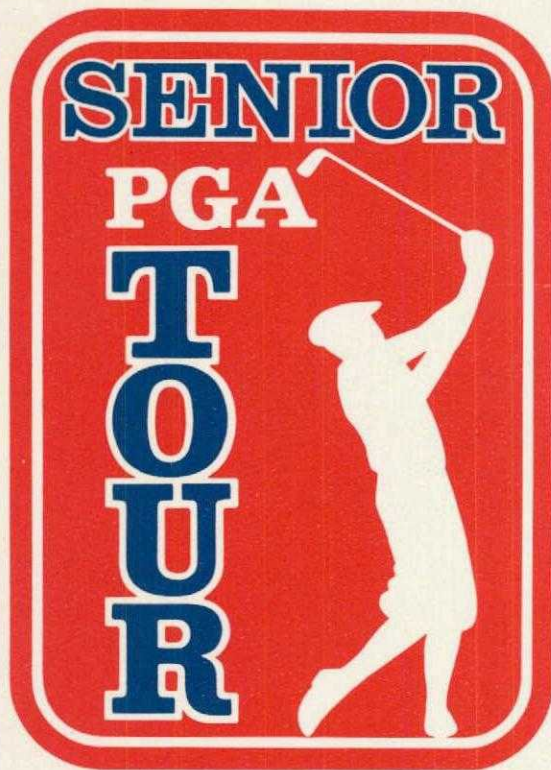

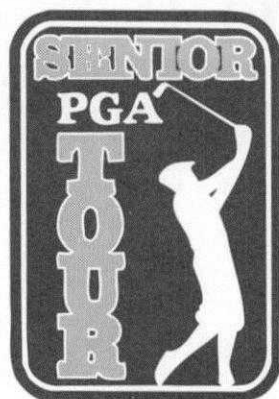

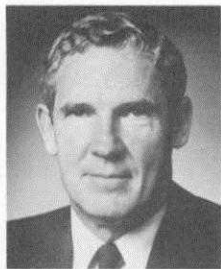

The Senior PGA TOUR, formerly a department within the overall structure of the PGA TOUR, became an operating division of the PGA TOUR in October, 1985. The restructuring, along with the naming of a nine-man Senior PGA TOUR Division Board, gives the Senior TOUR greater ability to deal with its particular policies, opportunities and issues.

The nine-member Board, is composed of the following:

Four Player Directors, elected by the Senior PGA TOUR membership.

Four Independent Directors, representing the public interest. One serves as Chairman of the Board.

One PGA Director, who is the Past President of the PGA of America.

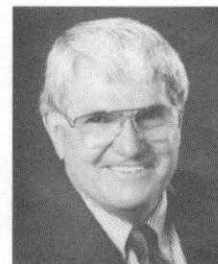

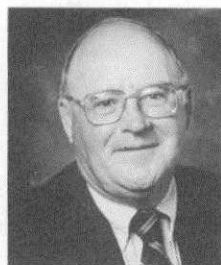

## ABOUT THE COMMISSIONER

---

### Deane R. Beman

Born: April 22, 1938

Entering his 18th year as Commissioner of the PGA TOUR, Deane R. Beman has overseen the most explosive period of growth in the TOUR's history, since succeeding Joseph C. Dey, Jr., on March 1, 1974.

During the Beman administration, the "business side" of the PGA TOUR has shown dramatic growth and now includes many heretofore uncharted paths, each designed to help encourage continued prosperity and to ensure the future of the game.

PGA TOUR Investments, Inc., created eight years ago, has already grown to include 14 "Stadium Golf" facilities nationally with more clubs in the planning or construction stages across the United States. 1989 saw the unveiling of TPC International with three TPC's in Japan with more to come. In December, 1986, in Clearwater, FL, the PGA TOUR opened the first in a network of "Family Golf Centers." In 1989 the TOUR opened another "Family Golf Center" at the Golf Club of Jacksonville, a municipal course the PGA TOUR built for the city of Jacksonville. In addition to providing state-of-the-art tournament and teaching golf arenas, Tournament Players Clubs and Family Golf Centers have been instrumental in the growth of PGA TOUR assets, which have climbed from \$730,000 to more than \$128.5 million during the Beman era.

PGA TOUR Properties, the joint marketing venture of the TOUR and PGA of America, continues to make steady progress in its quest to open new opportunities in golf for commercial sponsors and the TOUR's members. The Nabisco Golf competitions on the Regular TOUR and the Vantage Cup involvement with the Senior TOUR, an infusion of millions of dollars combined for players, sponsors and charities, is the largest example of these efforts.

PGA TOUR Productions, introduced in 1985, is the TOUR's first-ever in-house TV/audio-visual production entity, the creative possibilities of which are nearly limitless. Tournament highlight films, vignettes, commercials, specialty pieces and the acclaimed "Inside the PGA TOUR" weekly half-hour show airing on ESPN are several of Production's successful projects. In 1990 "Inside the PGA TOUR" was nominated for an ACE Award honoring cable television's best.

Other important innovations introduced during the Beman administration include a professional Agronomy department, the Nabisco Stats program, electronic scoreboards, "Official Golf Destinations" and Centinela Fitness Training Center.

Competitively, the Beman era has witnessed the birth of the SENIOR PGA TOUR which started in 1980 with two events and has grown to 40 events this year and the Ben Hogan Tour, which enjoyed a successful birth last year. In all, over 120 tournaments are on the combined slate with prize money having increased from \$8.2 million in 1974 to over \$80 million this year.

The Player Retirement Plan, inaugurated in 1983, has already contributed over \$12 million toward the future benefit of active Plan participants, and larger contributions are expected in future years.

Charity, easily the TOUR's leading money winner during the Beman era, continues to benefit at a yearly record pace. Contributions by American Golf Sponsors to charitable organizations rose to another unprecedented total of \$20.2 million in 1990.

During his active years as a player, Beman established an enviable slate of accomplishments, compiling one of the great amateur records of all time. He won United States Amateur titles in 1960 and 1963 and the British Amateur championship in 1959. As an amateur, Beman was a member of four Walker Cup teams, four World Amateur Cup teams and three U.S. Americas Cup squads.

At the age of 29, in 1967, he left a prosperous insurance brokerage firm in Bethesda, MD, to join the PGA TOUR as a full-time player. During his six-year professional career, he won the 1969 Texas Open, 1970 Greater Milwaukee Open, 1972 Quad Cities Open and 1973 Shrine-Robinson Classic.

## A BRIEF HISTORY OF THE SENIOR PGA TOUR



The SENIOR PGA TOUR, tabbed by many as the most successful professional sports venture of the 1980s, began rather inauspiciously from discussions during 1979 in which leading senior players expressed an interest in playing several "senior" events, provided sponsors could be found and if the PGA TOUR would administer the tournaments. Prior to that time, only certain special events for tournament professionals over the age of 50 were held, most notably the Legends of Golf and the PGA Seniors Championship.

A landmark meeting on January 16, 1980, laid the formal groundwork for the SENIOR PGA TOUR. Attending that meeting were Sam Snead, Julius Boros, Gardner Dickinson, Bob Goalby, Don January and the late Dan Sikes—all leaders on the Career Money List. Sikes was named Chairman of what became known as the Senior Advisory Council, and Snead was named Honorary Chairman.

At that meeting, it was recognized that any senior tour would have to trade on the reputations and images made by PGA TOUR players over their long years of activity on that tournament circuit. Eligibility criteria were therefore centered around a player's position on the Career Money List and number of career victories.

It was also determined that such a senior tour could succeed only with a format emphasizing pro-am play. So, the format for play was set with a field of 50 players (later expanded to 52) so that two rounds of pro-am play could be held and that one of these pro-am rounds could be made an official round of the tournament.

After approval of the new SENIOR PGA TOUR by the Tournament Policy Board of the PGA TOUR on January 22, 1980, work began on establishing events for Senior TOUR play. Two tournaments were conducted in 1980, one in Atlantic City, NJ, (won by Don January) and the other in Melbourne FL (won by Charlie Sifford).

The Senior TOUR grew steadily over the next few years with five events in 1981, 11 in 1982 and 18 tournaments by 1983. Prize money offered for players on the 50-and-over circuit tallied over \$3 million for the 1983 season. Miller Barber and Don January, fellow Texans, emerged as the dominant players with each winning two money titles in the first four years of the Senior TOUR, and between them, a total of 21 events. Among the other notable performers on the Senior TOUR during that stretch was a five-time winner, Arnold Palmer.

Expansion and growth continued in 1984 with 24 tournaments on the schedule worth over \$5 million in prize money, prompting January to publicly state, "If you'd have told me back in 1980 that we'd have this many events and be playing for this much money, I'd have said you were crazy."

By 1985, the Senior TOUR was large enough, 27 events worth over \$6 million, to merit its establishment as a Division of the PGA TOUR, a distinct and separate operating and financial entity, with Senior TOUR net revenue going to fund a newly-created Senior Player Retirement Plan. To help guide this fast growing circuit, a SENIOR PGA TOUR Division Board was formed consisting of three Independent Directors, three Player Directors and the immediate Past President of the PGA of America. The Division Board was later expanded from seven to nine with the addition of another Independent Director and Player Director.

Of considerable note to the Senior TOUR was the announcement prior to the 1985 season that a cable television package on ESPN had been put together allowing seven events to enjoy national cable coverage. With the production costs partially funded by Mazda Motors of America, Mazda also helped create the Senior TOUR's first ever season-long bonus pool (\$300,000) and sponsored a \$1 million season-ending team event in conjunction with the LPGA.

While 1985 also saw a separate logo and licensing program developed for the

Senior TOUR, on the playing front, a different face dominated the scene. Australian Peter Thomson, a five-time British Open winner, won a record nine tournaments during the 1985 season and 10 events in a 12-month stretch. The last event of the year, however, was won by a new senior entry, Gary Player.

The following year, former two-time Vardon Trophy winner Bruce Crampton took top honors with seven Senior TOUR victories from the 28 tournaments on the 1986 schedule, while two rookies, Chi Chi Rodriguez and Dale Douglass, finished second and third on the final money list, respectively.

The start of the 1987 season marked the entry of another major corporate sponsor as the Vantage brand of R. J. Reynolds Tobacco Company introduced their Vantage Program to the 35-event Senior circuit. The Vantage involvement included a \$1 million season-long team points competition called the Vantage Cup; the sponsorship of the first \$1 million tournament on the Senior TOUR, called the Vantage Championship; sponsorship of a series of major Vantage Tournaments; sponsorship of a SUPER SENIORS Competition for players 60 years old and above, and a new advanced electronic scoreboard system and a remodeled consumer activity pavilion, both formerly used on the Regular TOUR.

The size of Senior TOUR tournament fields was expanded to 72 players in 1987, and for the first time, the pro-am portion and tournament portion of events were separated. For standard events, the two-day pro-am was held on Wednesday and Thursday with pros only competing Friday through Sunday. That format remains in effect today.

Expansion of the Vantage Cup highlighted the 1988 campaign, as the Senior circuit grew to 37 events. In addition to refining its existing programs, Vantage began sponsorship of the Senior TOUR's first-ever statistical program, with season-ending leaders in each of 10 stats categories receiving cash bonuses. Bob Charles, the most successful left-hander in golf history, enjoyed a record-setting year, establishing a new single-season earnings mark on the Senior TOUR as he pocketed \$533,929.

Continued growth marked the 1989 season, as Senior TOUR tournament fields were increased to 78 players and Frank Beard, Mike Hill, Jim Dent and George Archer made successful debuts. R.J. Reynolds hosted an expanded \$1.5 million Championship, offered another \$750,000 in individual bonus money, and yet another \$750,000 in bonuses to other Senior TOUR tournaments. With the RJR bonus money counting as "official" prize money, Charles again set the earnings pace with a record \$725,887.

In 1990, golf's "Big Four" were reunited on the senior scene. The arrival of Lee Trevino and Jack Nicklaus, together again with Palmer and Player, lifted the popularity of the Senior TOUR to unprecedented levels at the start of the new decade. 1990 also marked the introduction of Cadillac Motor Car Division as the umbrella sponsor for Senior TOUR cable telecasts. Though five players surpassed the previous single-season earnings record, Trevino was the dominant performer, notching seven wins and finishing out of the top 10 only twice in 28 starts. His official earnings total of \$1,190,518 not only made him the Senior TOUR's first "million-dollar man," but also the year's leading money-winner in all of golf.

Cadillac will return in 1991 as "the official car of the SENIOR PGA TOUR," with the Cadillac Series on ESPN expanding to 15 events. In all, 24 tournaments will be shown nationally on network and cable television. Additionally, PGA TOUR Productions will introduce a new show, "Inside the SENIOR PGA TOUR," slated to air on ESPN three times weekly for 39 consecutive weeks beginning in February.

The 1991 schedule will feature 42 events worth more than \$24 million in total prize money, including nearly \$20 million in official purses.

---

## SENIOR PGA TOUR ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

---

In order to be eligible for an official SENIOR PGA TOUR event, a player must be at least 50 years of age prior to the first tournament round.

1. Eligibility for Exempt Status in 1991 (in order of priority):
  - a. Top 31 available players from the 1990 Official Money List (Floor of net 50);
  - b. Top 31 available players from the Combined Career Money List (not otherwise exempt; Floor of net 70);
  - c. Top eight available players from the 1990 SENIOR PGA TOUR National Qualifying Tournament, in order of finish;
  - d. Winners of SENIOR PGA TOUR events for one year from the date of their victory, if not otherwise exempt;
  - e. Past Champions of official PGA TOUR events, excluding team events, in their first two years of participation on the Senior TOUR. Eligibility in this category is on a space-available basis only after the floors of all other exempt categories have been reached.
2. Eligibility for Non-exempt Players:
  - a. Four spots in each tournament field from Open Qualifying;
  - b. Four sponsor exemptions per tournament.

NOTE: The above requirements apply to standard 78-player format for open SENIOR PGA TOUR events. Invitational tournaments may employ varying criteria.

### VANTAGE CLASSICS ELIGIBILITY

The Vantage Classics competition consists of all players within the starting field who are 60 years of age or older. The competition takes place over the first 36 holes of a 54-hole event or the first 54 holes of a 72-hole tournament. Vantage Classics earnings are unofficial, but the participants earn official money for their position of finish in the overall tournament.

## **VANTAGE CUP SET FOR FIFTH SEASON ON SENIOR TOUR**

---

The Vantage brand of R.J. Reynolds Tobacco Co. will again play a major role in sponsorship of the SENIOR PGA TOUR, but not without some changes for the 1991 campaign. The Vantage Cup program now enters its fifth year with a greater commitment than ever.

Prize money for the Vantage Cup season-long bonus competition has been boosted to \$2 million. The individual competition is based on the players' annual earnings, while the team race takes into account the cumulative earnings of three-man teams drafted by Senior TOUR tournaments. Players will vie for \$1 million in individual bonus money, with the leading money-winner at the conclusion of the year receiving a top prize of \$150,000 in official money. The 34 tournaments participating in the 1991 Vantage Cup will divide the other \$1 million based on the cumulative performance of the three players they selected in last December's draft. The event represented by the winning trio collects \$150,000, while the last-place finisher receives \$12,500.

Twenty-five Senior TOUR events will host Vantage Classics competitions in 1991, with all players in the tournament field age 60 and over competing in a "tournament within the tournament." The Vantage Classics event concludes one round prior to the overall tournament, and while Vantage Classics earnings are unofficial, the players earn official money for their finish in the main tournament.

Historic Tanglewood Park outside Winston-Salem, NC, remains the setting for the \$1.5 million Vantage Championship -- the richest event on the SENIOR PGA TOUR. The winner of the 1991 Vantage Championship will collect \$202,500, while the Vantage Classics champion earns \$30,000.

A favorite of golf fans, the popular Vantage Cup spectator activity pavilion will return to most Vantage Cup stops on the Senior TOUR. At the pavilion fans of all ages can have their golf swings analyzed by computer and can compete for prizes in a variety of golf contests.

---

## **VANTAGE SCOREBOARDS**

---

The electronic Vantage Scoreboard systems have become an integral part of the Senior TOUR since they were introduced in 1987 as part of the Vantage Cup program. The systems provide fans and players with updated status reports, current scores, biographical information, statistical facts, special reports and messages. The boards are not only designed to handle the rigors of cross-country travel, but they can also withstand all types of weather conditions while on site.

In 1988, the original systems were replaced with the state-of-the-art equipment that is in operation today. The Vantage Scoreboards feature "Glowcube" technology from Daktronics, Inc. of Brookings, S.D.—the manufacturer of the electronic scoreboards for the 1988 Winter Olympics. The "Glowcube" technology driven by Epson computers allows for faster scoring and better graphics. Data is transmitted through radio signals, thus eliminating the need for costly telephone lines over the entire course.

## MERRILL LYNCH SHOOT-OUT SERIES

The Merrill Lynch Shoot-Out series, a fixture on the Senior TOUR for the last two seasons, returns in 1991 with an expanded schedule and increased prize money.

Merrill Lynch Shoot-Outs will be a part of 13 Senior TOUR events in 1991 campaign, up two from a year earlier. The nine-hole competitions, conducted on Tuesdays of tournament weeks, will feature top Senior TOUR stars battling for \$12,650 in prize money at each contest, with the weekly winner taking home \$4,000.

A Merrill Lynch Shoot-Out begins with 10 players, and on each hole the player with the highest score is eliminated. Ties are broken by a sudden-death "shoot-out," involving a pitch, chip, bunker shot or putt. The individual whose ball comes to rest farthest from the hole is ousted from the field.

Each Merrill Lynch Shoot-Out comprises the defending champion of that particular tournament, the top three players entered in that tournament from the current money list, the top three players in the tournament from the Combined Career money list and three sponsor selections.

At the end of the season, Merrill Lynch will sponsor a Shoot-Out Championship (date and site TBA) featuring the top five money-winners from the 1991 Senior TOUR official money list, the top three money-winners in the season-long Merrill Lynch Shoot-Out series and two sponsor selections.

## CADILLAC SERIES EXPANDS IN 1991

### *Cadillac* **SENIOR** PGA TOUR SERIES

Cadillac Motor Car Division and the Senior TOUR enter the second year of their partnership in 1991, with Cadillac returning as "The Official Car of the SENIOR PGA TOUR" and the umbrella sponsor for Senior TOUR events televised on ESPN.

Cadillac underwrites a portion of the production costs for each of the "Cadillac Series" telecasts, helping to fortify the Senior TOUR's presence on national cable television. The Cadillac Series comprises 15 events in 1991 and will grow to 16 tournaments next year.

Cadillac will also furnish a minimum of 60 courtesy cars for each event in the Series, plus a fleet of cars for on-site tournament staff and headquarters staff use.

As in 1990, Cadillac will present its premium car series to the top overall performer in this year's 15 Cadillac Series events. This year the three-car premium series features the Allante, El Dorado Touring Coupe and Seville STS. A player's performance is based on official prize money collected in each Cadillac Series tournament. Last season, Charles Coody claimed the top spot in the Cadillac Series, outdistancing runner-up Lee Trevino by nearly 20,000 points.

Cadillac will also help publicize the Senior TOUR and its involvement through the placement of "tune-in-and-watch" advertisements in major magazines and newspapers, as well as the creation of dealer tie-ins and promotions surrounding each Cadillac Series event.

Last year, two-thirds of the Senior TOUR's Cadillac Series telecasts enjoyed increased viewership, with the final round of The Tradition at Desert Mountain attaining ESPN's highest golf rating, a 3.4 mark.

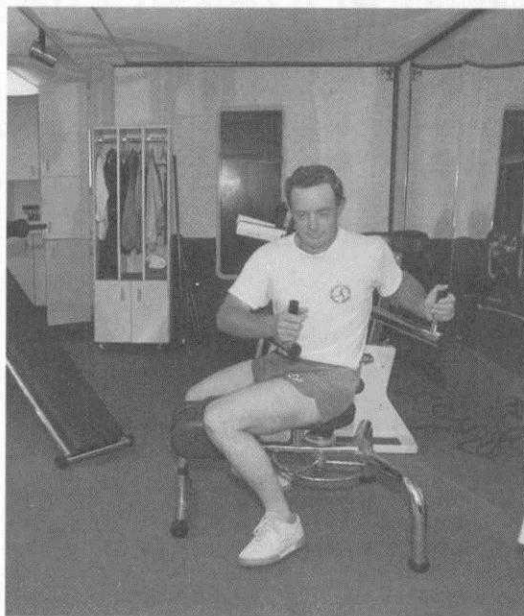

## TOURNAMENT PLAYERS CLUBS

---

The original concept of the PGA TOUR, The Tournament Players Clubs have within the decade of the 80's gone from a dream to a network that now encompasses 22 courses in 12 states and with the addition of TPC International, two countries.

It was the TOUR's view that the spectator had been left out in golf course design throughout the years and when it came time for the PGA TOUR to build its own course, the opportunity presented itself for the TOUR to build a course that not only challenged the players, but allowed spectators to see the action as never before.

It's called "Stadium Golf" and once you've viewed a tournament on a Stadium Golf Course, you'll understand why the network has grown in such a short period of time.

Spectator mounds abound that afford fans unrestricted views whether on tee shots, fairway shots or on the greens. In fact, the 18th hole at the original TPC at Sawgrass can accommodate crowds of some 30,000 people-all with a clean view of the action. You won't see any periscopes at an event on a Players Club course.

The network began in 1980 with the club at Sawgrass where it annually hosts THE PLAYERS Championship, and quickly grew into the present number of 22. All TPCs are designed to host PGA TOUR or Senior PGA TOUR events and to date the clubs have been designed by some of the top architects in the business-Pete Dye, Arnold Palmer, Arthur Hills, Jay Morrish, Bob Cupp, the Von Hagge/Devlin team and Jack Nicklaus to name just a few.

In addition, one of the things that adds a bit of spice to all TPCs is that a PGA TOUR player (or in some cases, two) are assigned to serve as a consultant to the designer. To date, Ed Sneed, Tom Weiskopf, Fuzzy Zoeller, Hubert Green, Craig Stadler, Ben Crenshaw, Al Geiberger and Chi Chi Rodriguez have been among those lending their expertise to the TPC Network.

In reality a nationwide country club, a membership at one TPC affords the member a chance to play at any of the other clubs across the country and an opportunity to view the greatest players in the world in action on his own course once a year.

Since the Tournament Players Club at Sawgrass opened, the TPC Network has now truly become "the best set of clubs in America."

## RYDER CUP MATCHES

The Ryder Cup Matches developed from a match played between representatives of the American and British Professional Golfers' Association in England in 1926. That unofficial match, incidentally, was won by the British 13½ to 1½.

Following this highly successful exhibition, Samuel A. Ryder, a wealthy British seed merchant, offered to donate a solid gold trophy bearing his name to be competed for in a series of matches between professionals of the two nations.

From the start of the series through the 1959 Ryder Cup matches, the competition was comprised of four foursome matches one day and eight singles matches the other day, each at 36 holes.

In 1961, the format was changed to provide for four 18-hole foursomes the morning of the first day and four more that afternoon, then for eight 18-hole singles the morning of the second day and eight more that afternoon. As in the past, one point was at stake in each match, so the total number of points was doubled.

In 1963, for the first time, a day of four-ball matches augmented the program to add new interest to the overall competition. This brought the total number of points to 32.

In 1977, the format was altered once again. This time there were five foursomes on the opening day, five four-ball matches on the second day, and ten singles matches on the final day. This reduced the total number of points to 20.

For 1979, eligibility for the Great Britain-Ireland side was expanded to include all British PGA/European TPD members who are residents of European nations.

## MEDIA REGULATIONS

### THE GENERAL REGULATIONS

The following regulations are to be followed by *all* members of the Media:

1. An **ARM BAND** is necessary to walk inside the gallery ropes. Remain *not more than an arm's length from the ropes*, so as to blend into the gallery and appear to be a part of the gallery at all times.
2. Players are not to be distracted during play. **DO NOT** interview players or ask them to pose for photographs during their round.
3. **DO NOT** interview players or ask them to pose for photographs during their practice sessions prior to their round except by prior arrangement with the player.
4. If an interview is to be conducted in the practice areas, either the range or the putting green, it must be done by **PRIOR ARRANGEMENT WITH THE PLAYER** and up against the ropes and **NOT** in the middle of the areas where it could be distracting to other players.
5. **DO NOT** disturb players at their 18th green and/or scoring tent until after they have checked, signed and returned their scorecards.

### WORKING PRESS REGULATIONS

To avoid embarrassment to you and distraction to the contestants:

1. Do not walk or stand in playing areas.
2. Follow directions of marshals and other officials.
3. Do not interview during play. The leading players each day—and others requested—will be interviewed following their rounds in the Press Room interview area.

### TAPE RECORDER REGULATIONS

1. All tape recorder work should be done in the proximity of the Press Room and/or Clubhouse.
2. Tape recorders are **NOT** permitted in the locker room.
3. Tape recorders are **NOT** permitted within the playing area of the golf course unless written permission has been granted from the PGA TOUR and/or the tournament sponsor.

### RAIN DELAY GUIDELINES

1. During rain delay situations, **NO ONE** other than players and essential staff will be permitted in the locker room. This means the Media is not permitted in the locker room in such situations. However, whenever possible, arrangements will be made to provide players for interviews during such situations.
2. Fully accredited members of the news media **WILL BE WELCOMED** into the locker room at all other times to carry out their assigned duties. (Note: Cameras and tape recorders are **NOT** permitted.)

This Tournament is essentially for the players and spectators. Fair play requires that there be no noise or other distractions. The interests of all others must be subordinated to the players interests. The result of any one shot could decide the Tournament.

Only **ACCREDITED PHOTOGRAPHERS** for **RECOGNIZED NEWS MEDIA** will be permitted to take pictures during the Tournament. Photo assistants may be issued a credential, but not photo arm bands for access inside the ropes. Photography will be restricted to news use. Commercial and personal photography is prohibited (except that spectators may take pictures on practice days and during a ProAm). Free lance photographers shooting on speculation will **NOT BE ACCREDITED**.

The following regulations apply to accredited news and television photographers and videotape cameramen as a condition of the privilege of taking pictures:

## PHOTOGRAPHY REGULATIONS

### GENERAL—ALL PHOTOGRAPHERS

- A photographer must not ask a player to pose or in any way verbally distract a player during a round.
- If a player or an official requests that no photographs be taken in a certain situation, the request must be honored immediately, without discussion.
- A camera must not be pointed at a player about to make a stroke in any manner which might tend to disturb him or distract his attention.
- At the 9th and the 18th greens, photographers must not approach, delay or distract a player until he has checked, signed and returned his scorecard to the proper official. Under the Rules of Golf, a player turning in an incorrect scorecard in stroke play may be disqualified.
- Cameras are not permitted in the locker room.
- Use of golf carts or other means of transportation on the course during tournament play is prohibited.

### STILL PHOTOGRAPHERS

- Only still photographers to whom armbands have been issued will be permitted inside gallery ropes. They must station themselves immediately inside such ropes, and not more than an ARM'S LENGTH FROM THE ROPES, so as to blend into the gallery and appear to be part of the gallery. They must not take conspicuous positions in the open. Any photographer who violates this regulation will forfeit the right to working inside the ropes and possibly to work at the tournament.
- Close-up action shots are prohibited.
- All pictures must be taken at appreciable distances, as far from the players as possible and from angles which are not acute to the line of play.
- When working at a green, photographers must not position themselves directly in a player's putting line.
- Pictures, even from a distance, may not be made until the player has completed his stroke. The photographer must not release his camera shutter until the shot is made.

### TELEVISION/VIDEOTAPE CAMERAMEN

- Television and videotape filming may be done from inside the gallery ropes, or from areas approved by the PGA TOUR. All camera personnel who have been issued PHOTO armbands will be permitted inside the gallery lines but this does not include other members of the crew. Camera personnel must station themselves immediately inside the gallery lines, not more than an arm's length from those lines, so as to blend into the gallery. They must not take conspicuous positions in the open.
- Filming may be done from such locations during a player's stroke, provided modern equipment that produces a minimum of noise is used.
- Post-round interviews must be filmed far enough away from the arena of play to eliminate the possibility of distraction to those competing.

Difficulties will be avoided if photographers are fair and will treat players as they themselves would wish to be treated in similar circumstances.

The cooperation of all photographers will be appreciated.
