


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THE HISTORY OF THE NIKE TOUR

Call it fate if you like, but it was inevitable that this Tour and NIKE would become partners! After all, when PGA TOUR Commissioner Deane Beman first discussed his desire to launch this Tour in 1988, his plan was met with a certain degree of skepticism.

What was Beman's response to this skepticism?

"Just do it."

Does that sound familiar?

As 1992 came to a close, Beman's idea for a Tour that would be a proving ground for young players had completed three successful seasons as the Ben Hogan Tour and stood ready to rise to greater heights.

Enter Nike and its incredible record of success. Nike has evolved from a track shoe operation being run out of laundry rooms and car trunks 21 years ago into the world's largest sports and fitness company with reported 1992 revenues of \$3.4 billion.

When the announcement of Nike's involvement was made August 26, 1992, Beman stated "we are excited to have NIKE as a partner and involved in golf and we are pleased they'll bring their standards of excellence to the NIKE Tour. This Tour has proven to be highly competitive and successful in its brief history. Nike's commitment ensures it will remain a vital part of the PGA TOUR for years to come."

A collective effort of the PGA TOUR, Nike, local civic organizations and the PGA of America and its Sections, the NIKE Tour seeks to discover those players who may have gone unnoticed for lack of financial support or competitive opportunities. Players have an opportunity to hone their skills, compete on a variety of golf courses under different conditions and learn to adjust to life on a competitive tour.

The stars on the inaugural Ben Hogan Tour quickly made themselves known on the 1991 PGA TOUR. Jeff Maggert, Scott Gump, Mike Springer, Ed Humenik and Bart Bryant were familiar names on leaderboards all season. However, the biggest impact was made by John Daly, who won the 73rd PGA Championship and finished 17th on the Official PGA TOUR Money List with \$575,783. With his long booming drives, an exact iron game, and a smooth putting stroke, the 25-year old rookie became the first Ben Hogan Tour product to win an event on the PGA TOUR.

"I expected to be successful (on the PGA TOUR), but I never thought that I would win a major championship my first season," Daly said. "From my perspective, the Ben Hogan Tour prepared me to step onto the PGA TOUR and be competitive right away," he explained.

The Hogan Tour Player of the Year for each of the three previous years has successfully made the jump to the PGA TOUR. Past winners Jeff Maggert (1990), Tom Lehman (1991), and John Flannery (1992) are proof that winners on the NIKE Tour can compete on the PGA TOUR. These three, and others, are proof that Beman was correct when he said in 1988 that many young golfers could compete at the top level if only they had a proper setting to refine their skills in a true tournament environment.

The Hogan Tour, with the support of golf legend Ben Hogan and his Hogan Company, surpassed everyone's expectations during the initial 1990 season. The Tour featured 30 events that brought golf to new markets across the country and was the first major addition to professional golf since the founding of the Senior PGA TOUR a decade earlier.

Following the 1990 Tour, 27 competitors earned playing privileges for the 1991 PGA TOUR. The total purse for the 1990 Tour was \$3,050,000 and will climb to amost \$5 million this year. Those figures, however, are not the ones that Beman derives the most satisfaction.

The numbers that he is most proud of are the total dollars generated for charities by this Tour. In 1990 charitable revenues were \$968,000. That figure rose to \$1,300,000 in 1991 and continued to climb in 1992 to nearly \$1,700,000.

The expectations are these dollars will continue to rise and that as with the PGA TOUR and the Senior PGA TOUR, charity will continue to be the big winner of professional golf.

And you can also expect to see this year's top players on the NIKE Tour compete with the best players in the world on the PGA TOUR in 1994. The top ten players on the '93 NIKE Tour will earn 1994 PGA TOUR cards and other members of the Tour could earn their cards from qualifying school.

With tournament venues expanding in 1993 to outside the United States with a March visit to Monterrey, Mexico, the NIKE Tour continues its steady growth pattern in every aspect.

It has enjoyed success when many questioned the viability of the concept. Beman's diligence and the enthusiastic support of Nike will continue to allow young up and coming golfers to "just do it" for many years to come!

ABOUT THE COMMISSIONER

Deane R. Beman

Born: April 22, 1938 Birthplace: Washington, DC Family: Wife, Judy; five children

Entering his 20th year as Commissioner of the PGA TOUR, since succeeding Joseph C. Dey, Jr., on March 1, 1974, Deane R. Beman has overseen the most explosive period of growth in the TOUR's history.

During the Beman administration, the "business side" of the PGA TOUR has shown dramatic growth and now includes many heretofore uncharted paths, each designed to help encourage continued prosperity and to ensure the future of the game.

PGA TOUR Golf Course Properties has grown to include 14 Tournament Players Clubs nationally with more clubs in the planning stage across the United States. TPC International was started in 1989 with a



Players Club in Japan. The Golf Club of Jacksonville, a municipal course operated by the PGA TOUR for the city of Jacksonville, opened in 1989, followed by the Golf Club of Miami the next year. In addition to providing tournament state-of-the-art facilities, Tournament Players Clubs have been instrumental in the growth of the PGA TOUR assets, which have climbed from \$730,000 to more than \$200 million during the Beman era.

The marketing arm of the PGA TOUR continues to open new opportunities in golf for commercial sponsors and the TOUR's members. Long-term programs with Coca-Cola and IBM that were initiated in 1992 and the replacement of the Ben Hogan Company with NIKE to form the NIKE Tour are the latest in a long line of marketing efforts designed for the combined benefit of players, sponsors and charities.

PGA TOUR Partners was started in 1991 to enhance the golf experience for serious fans by giving them a unique, inside look at the PGA TOUR, and providing charitable support to worthy non-profit organizations. In less than two years the Partners program now includes over 75,000 members.

PGA TOUR Productions, created in 1985, is the TOUR's in-house TV/audio visual production entity. Created to produce tournament highlight video films, vignettes, commercials, specialty pieces and the acclaimed "Inside the PGA TOUR," a weekly half-hour show airing on ESPN, Productions added "Inside the SENIOR PGA TOUR" in 1991. "Inside the PGA TOUR" was nominated for an ACE Award honoring cable television's best for the third consecutive year.

Other important innovations introduced during the Beman administration include a professional agronomy department, PGA TOUR Stats Program, electronic scoreboards, "Official Golf Destinations" and establishment of mobile fitness training centers, sponsored by Centinela. Competitively, the Beman era has witnessed the birth of the Senior PGA TOUR which started with two events in 1980 and has grown to its present 43 events. The NIKE Tour, born in 1990, has been a success by all measures and has provided aspiring professionals with TOUR-like competition as a stepping stone to the PGA TOUR. In all there are 118 tournaments on the combined Tours, and total prize money has increased from \$8.2 million in 1974 to more than \$97 million for the 1993 season.


The Player Retirement Plan was instituted in 1983 to help provide PGA TOUR members with a stable source of income upon retirement from tournament competition. At the time, establishment of the plan was viewed as a significant step towards bringing the TOUR closer to the ranks of other "major" sports with respect to player benefits.

Charity has easily been the TOUR's leading money winner during the Beman era. Surpassing the \$20 million mark in 1992, the American Golf Sponsors and the PGA TOUR have donated over \$135 million over the past seven TOUR seasons alone. In the fall of 1992 the TOUR and the American Golf Sponsors surpassed the \$200 million mark in donations since 1938.

During his active years as a player, Beman established an enviable slate of accomplishments, compiling one of the great amateur records of all-time. He won the U.S. Amateur title in 1960 and 1963 and the British Amateur Championship in 1959. Beman was a member of four Walker Cup teams, four World Amateur Cup teams and three U.S. America's Cup Squads.

In 1967, at the age of 29, he left a prosperous insurance brokerage firm in Bethesda, MD, to join the PGA TOUR as a full-time player. During his six-year professional career, he won the 1969 Texas Open, 1970 Greater Milwaukee Open, 1971 Quad Cities Open (Unofficial), 1972 Quad Cities Open and the 1973 Shrine-Robinson Classic before hanging up his spikes to become Commissioner in 1974.

Timothy W. Finchem has served as Deputy Commissioner of the PGA TOUR since 1990.

He has management responsibility for all TOUR operations as the organization's Chief Operating Officer.

Finchem joined the PGA TOUR staff in 1988 as Vice President for Business Affairs, exercising oversight responsibility for the TOUR's diverse relationship with corporate sponsors, marketing, promotion and television matters.

He came to the TOUR from National Stategies

and Marketing Group, a Washington, D.C. firm of which he was co-founder. At NS&MG, he represented the TOUR's legislative interests and was a marketing consultant for the Tournament Players Club network.

Finchem had served at the White House as Deputy Advisor to the president for economic affairs in the early 1980's prior to helping found NS&MG.

A native of Virginia Beach, VA, Finchem is a graduate of the University of Richmond and holds a law degree from the University of Virginia.

STEVE RANKIN

A member of the PGA TOUR staff since 1980, Steve Rankin moved into the position of Vice President - Tournament Affairs/Sponsor Relations in 1988. Rankin started with the PGA TOUR as a Media Official before assuming the post of Director of Public Relations in 1982. He moved into the Executive Department in the winter of 1985 as Assistant to the Commissioner. A native of Springfield, OH, Rankin holds a bachelor's degree from Northwestern University and a



master's degree from Ohio University. He and his wife, Amy, and their two children reside in Ponte Vedra Beach, FL.



NIKE TOUR MAKES ITS DEBUT

Nike is a rookie on the NIKE Tour this year.

But like more than 100 players vying for the top honors at 30 NIKE Tour stops around North America in 1993--some of them rookies--Nike believes that what counts is today's performance, not the length of your career.



In fact, 1993, the inaugural season as the title sponsor of Tour, marks only NIKE's 21st year as a brand. And in that short span of time, NIKE has become the world's largest sports and fitness company, with \$3.4 billion in annual sales and business in more than 100 countries. Nike is the recognized leader for innovative, performance products for athletes in more than 20 categories of sport, from tennis and basketball to cross-training and aerobics.

How does the NIKE Tour--with 30 tournaments from Monterrey, Mexico to Springfield, Missouri--fit with the plans of the world's largest sports and fitness company?

According to co-founder, Chairman and CEO Philip H. Knight, the NIKE Tour will fit like one of Nike's new seamless-palm golf gloves. Not only because of the opportunity to make significant contributions to local charities, and to provide the opportunity to involve Nike athletes and coaches in pro-am events, but because the NIKE Tour will provide support for competitive golf performance that deserves a continuing national showcase.

"Nike has a long history of supporting sports at all levels, from grassroots through the professional ranks," says Knight. "The NIKE Tour adds to that tradition by supporting a schedule of tournaments for young professional players who have hopes of becoming champions.

"Not to be forgotten, too, is that the NIKE Tour will bring competitive tournament-caliber play to 30 markets around North America that might otherwise not be able to witness the excitement of great golf."

It was only a few years ago that Knight and Nike co-founder Bill Bowerman were like the NIKE Tour players of the sports business--two men with the will to be champions and the commitment needed to get there. They had worked together as runner and coach, respectively, at the University of Oregon in the late 1950s, where Knight was a quality miler and Bowerman in the midst of a legendary career coaching the best runners of a generation. In 1964, Nike's forerunner Blue Ribbon Sports, was started when the pair each chipped in \$500 and shook hands on the new venture.

Through many of the early years, Knight and Bowerman each worked two jobs--Knight as a Portland State professor, Bowerman as the Oregon head track coach. On weekends, Knight would travel to West Coast track meets to sell Tiger brand running shoes designed by Bowerman and made in the Far East. That early prototype of a Nike pro shop was in fact the back of Knight's station wagon. BRS world headquarters were housed in his mother's laundry room.

By 1972, the BRS founders and their small collection of employees had decided it was time to produce a house brand. The Tiger brand distributorship went its own way, and Nike--named for the Greek Goddess of Victory--was born, along with the Waffle Trainer, a revolutionary light-weight jogging shoe that helped jump-start the American running boom. The next two decades saw Nike blossom into a major force in sports and fitness, expanding from its early running base to tennis, and then to basketball, cleated products, women's fitness, apparel, cross-training and outdoor.

The '80s saw Nike's entry into golf. It was a debut that awakened a whole industry from a long snooze. For almost one hundred years, the model for the golf shoe had been the classic dress shoe, with spikes added. The four Nike golf shoes introduced in 1984 turned that theory on its head. They used the athletic lasting method of construction to bring lightweight performance and tennis shoe comfort to the business. The golf shoe business was transformed, virtually overnight.

In a sense, the Nike athletic golf shoe became an overnight classic, and it is appropriate that same company is now sponsoring a series of professional level golf tournaments around the continent. After all, the NIKE Tour, like Nike, is expected to produce champions--not only on the NIKE Tour, but for future stops on the PGA TOUR as well.


NIKE TOUR CONTINUES COMMITMENT TO CHARITY

The Ben Hogan Tour, now the NIKE Tour, has provided hundreds of talented golfers with an opportunity to hone their skills in a competitive environment as they waited for the chance to propel their careers to golf's highest level, the PGA TOUR.

However, as is the case with the PGA TOUR, charity is the leading money winner on the NIKE Tour. The Tour has generated nearly \$4 million for local charitable organizations in its first three years. Beneficiaries of tournament proceeds range from the Boys and Girls Clubs of Cleveland to the Ronald McDonald House of the Ozarks in Springfield, MO.

"We are pleased that the success of the NIKE Tour has benefitted charities," said Deane R. Beman, PGA TOUR Commissioner. It's a positive situation for everyone where the NIKE Tour continues the PGA TOUR's commitment to charity."

1993 NIKE TOUR ELIGIBILTY REQUIREMENTS

The standard tournament format for NIKE Tour events will consist of 54 or 72 holes of official competition (Thursday or Friday through Sunday) preceded by an open qualifying and pro-am competition. Monday Open Qualifying will be held at the tournament site unless, with approval of PGA TOUR:

(a) the event is scheduled for 72 holes; or

(b) the sponsor schedules a Monday half-day pro-am. In those instances, the open qualifying competition will be at an off-site location.

1. TOURNAMENT WINNERS

The winners of NIKE Tour co-sponsored events in the last calendar year or during the current calendar year.

NOTE: Tournament winners are exempt for one calendar year following the end of the calendar year in which they won the event. Brian Henninger, Ted Tryba, Steve Lowery, and Brian Kamm, all 1992 tournament winners, declined NIKE Tour membership, a NIKE Tour event in catagory 12. tian

3. PGA NATIONAL OFFICE SELECTIONS

Five members of the PGA selected on a competitive basis by the PGA National Office, using criteria (such as its official money or point standings and/or a qualifying competition) approved by the PGA TOUR.

4. OPEN QUALIFYING

The 14 low scorers at Open Qualifying for each tournament held in accordance with applicable NIKE Tcur policies and procedures. Such Open Qualifying shall normally be held on Monday of tournament week and shall be open to all amateurs with USGA handicaps of 2 or less and to all professional golfers. Open Qualifying is to be conducted by the local PGA Section.

5. HOST PGA SECTION SELECTIONS

Ten members of the PGA Section in which the event is held selected on a competitive basis by the host PGA Section, using criteria (such as its official money or point standings and/or a section qualifying competition) approved by the PGA provided that, at the option of such PGA Section, the host PGA Professional at the site of the applicable event shall be eligible for the event.

6. ADDITIONAL HOST PGA SECTION SELECTIONS

An aggregate of seven players to be added, in such proportion as shall be determined by the PGA Sect on in which the event is held, to the number of players eligible for the event in categories 3,4, and/or 5 above.

7. SPONSOR EXEMPTIONS

On invitation by the sponsor, at his option, a maximum of two eligible players (including amateurs with USGA handicaps of two or less). On invitation of NIKE, Inc., one additional player, provided that such invitation be confirmed prior to the commitment deadline.

8. TOP FINISHERS FROM PREVIOUS YEAR

If not otherwise exempt under categories 1-7 above, players finishing 11th to 25th on the final Official NIKE Tour Money List from the previous year. Jeff Hart Karl Kimball Marty Schiene

9. TOP 25 FROM PREVIOUS TOURNAMENT

If not otherwise exempt under categories 1-8 above, the top 25 finishing professionals and those tied for 25th place from each tournament into the next NIKE Tour event on a space available basis. This also applies from the last event of one calendar year to the first event of the next calendar year.

10. SPECIAL MEMBERS/MEDICAL

If not otherwise exempt under categories 1-9 above, Special Member/Medical, if any , in order of their position on the previous years NIKE Tour Money List.

11. PGA TOUR MEMBERS 40-49 YEARS OLD

If needed to complete the field, PGA TOUR members ages 40 to 49 years old whose ranking in the PGA TOUR categories of eligibility is no lower than Article III.A.1 (e)--top 40 and ties from Qualifying Tournament. Such NIKE Tour exempt status shall be determined according to such ranking.

12. PGA TOUR MEMBERS NOT ELIGIBLE ON PGA TOUR EVENT IN SAME WEEK

If needed to complete the field, PGA TOUR members who are not eligible for that week's PGA TOUR event and whose ranking in the PGA TOUR categories of eligibility is no lower than Article III. A.1. (g) [25 PGA TOUR members finishing beyond the top 125 PGA TOUR Members from the previous year's Official PGA TOUR Money List]. Such NIKE Tour exempt status shall be determined according to such ranking.

13. LIFE MEMBERS AND PAST CHAMPIONS

If needed to complete the field, PGA TOUR life members and past champions, in order, as provided in Article III.A.1(i), even if they are eligible for that week's PGA TOUR event.

14. SPECIAL TEMPORARY MEMBERS OF PGA TOUR

If needed to complete the field, PGA TOUR special temporary members in order provided in Article III.A.1 (j), even if they eligible for that week's PGA TOUR event.

15. TEAM CHAMPIONSHIP WINNERS

If needed to complete the field, PGA TOUR team championship tournament winners in the order as provided in Article III.A.1 (k), even if they are eligible for that week's PGA TOUR event.

16. VETERAN MEMBERS

If needed to complete the field, PGA TOUR veteran members in the order as provided in Article III.A.1 (I), even if eligible for that week's PGA TOUR event.

17. ADDITIONAL QUALIFYING TOURNAMENT QUALIFIERS

If needed to fill the field, the next available players, in order, from the PGA TOUR Qualifying Tournament (Article III, Section A.1 (b), provided they had committed for the tournament by the commitment deadline. **NOTE:** These "conditional" members of the NIKE Tour re-ordered based on official earnings after 10, 15, 20, and 25 events during the season.

18. SPECIAL TEMPORARY MEMBERS

If not otherwise eligible and if needed to fill the field, players who have met the conditions prescribed in Section 2 (b) of this Article III and paid annual dues to PGA TOUR, in order in which such players qualified for this membership. (Conditions prescribed are the earnings of an amount of official money equal to or greater than that earned by the player who was 50th on the previous year's NIKE TOUR Money List (\$30,572).

19. PRIOR YEAR MEMBERS

If not otherwise eligible under categories above and if needed to fill the field, players who finished in positions 26-55 on the prior year's Official NIKE Tour Money list, in order of position on that list. Jeff Gallagher Mike Foster Steve Ford Tony Grimes

20. PAST CHAMPIONS

21. ADDITIONAL OPEN QUALIFIERS

If needed to complete the field, additional qualifiers from Open Qualifying in order of finish in the Open Qualifying competition.

NIKE TOUR PERFORMANCE BENEFITS

A. Top 10 Money Winners earn exempt status on the PGA TOUR for the following year.

B. Finishers 11-25 are exempted into the Finals of the National Qualifying Tournament.

NOTE: players finishing 11-25 are also fully exempt for the following year on the NIKE Tour, in the event they are unsuccessful in securing their PGA TOUR cards via the National Qualifying Tournament.

C. Finishers 26-55 are exempted into the Second Stage of the National Qualifying Tournament. Such players are also provided with Prior Year Membership for NIKE Tour in the event they are unsuccessful in securing their PGA TOUR cards via the National Qualifying Tournament.

D. Tournament Winners on the NIKE Tour are fully exempt for NIKE Tour tournaments for the balance of the year in which the event is won, and also for the following year.

TRUCKS CREATE TOURNAMENT ATMOSPHERE

A major task of the 30 sites hosting 1993 NIKE Tour events is to create an environment for players and fans that is remarkably similar to that found at a PGA TOUR event.

Leading the way in this effort is the Tournament Services Truck which is operated by the PGA TOUR Promotions Department.

The staff has a customized 18-wheel tractor-trailer truck provided by Ryder systems to carry equipment to each of the 30 tournament sites. PGA TOUR, NIKE Tour and Ryder corporate logos are featured on the vehicle which was prepared by the Winston-Salem, NC based J.D. Bruhn Special Event Productions. In addition to an air-conditioned room for the innovative computerized scoring system, the truck houses a storage area for leaderboards, walking standards, quiet signs, caddie bibs, flagsticks, radios and other equipment.

The Promotions Department also supervises the training of volunteers at each tournament, as well as the operation of other equipment carried on the truck.

The primary staff members handling these chores on the Tour are Steve Horner as manager, Matt Delaney, Chris Murray, and Lee Kaplan.

MERRILL LYNCH SHOOT-OUT SERIES

While only in its second year on the NIKE Tour, the Merrill Lynch Shoot-Out Series has become a sudden success.

The Merrill Lynch Shoot-Out Series will be held at eight different NIKE Tour events in 1993 with the winning team collecting \$1,000 of the \$3,500 purse. Last year the leading money winner on the series was Brian Henninger. He won one event solo and teamed with others to claim three more, including the last two.

What is a Shoot-Out on the NIKE Tour? The format is easy and a pleasure to watch. Twelve players are divided to six two-man teams competing over five holes. Teammates play alternate shot with the team claiming the highest score eliminated from the field. If there is a tie, those teams involved participate in a sudden death playoff where a pitch shot, a chip or a long putt is executed to eliminate the team farthest from the hole.

The Merrill Lynch Shoot-Out has been a hit on the PGA TOUR for the past seven seasons. It is expected to become a staple on the NIKE Tour for years to come.

MEDIA REGULATIONS

THE GENERAL REGULATIONS

The following regulations are to be followed by all members of the Media:

- An ARM BAND is necessary to walk inside the galley ropes. Stay within an arm's length of the ropes, so as to blend into the gallery and appear to be part of the gallery at all times.
- Players are not to be distracted during play. DO NOT interview players or ask them to pose for photographs during their round.
- DO NOT interview players or ask them to pose for photographs during their practice sessions prior to their round except by prior arrangement with the player.
- 4. If an interview is to be conducted in the practice areas, either the range or the putting green, it must be done by PRIOR ARRANGEMENT WITH THE PLAYER and up against the ropes and NOT in the middle of the areas where it could be distracting to other players.
- DO NOT disturb players at their 18th green and/or scoring tent until after they have checked, signed and returned their scorecards.

WORKING PRESS REGULATIONS

To avoid embarrassment to you and distraction to the contestants:

- 1. Do not walk or stand in playing areas.
- 2. Follow directions of marshals and other officials.
- 3. Do not interview during play. The leading players each day—and others requested—will be interviewed following their rounds in the Press Room interview area.

TAPE RECORDER REGULATIONS

- 1. All tape recorder work should be done in the proximity of the Press Room and/or Clubhouse.
- 2. Tape recorders are NOT permitted in the locker room.
- 3. Tape recorders are *NOT* permitted within the playing area of the golf course unless written permission has been granted from the PGA TOUR and/or the tournament sponsor.

RAIN DELAY GUIDELINES

- During rain delay situations, NO ONE other than players and essential staff will be permitted in the locker room. This means the Media is not permitted in the locker room in such situations. However, whenever possible, arrangements will be made to provide players for interviews during such situations.
- Fully accredited members of the news media WILL BE WELCOMED into the locker room at all other times to carry out their assigned duties. (Note: Cameras and tape recorders are NOT permitted.)

This Tournament is essentially for the players and spectators. Fair play requires that there be no noise or other distractions. The interests of all others must be subordinated to the players' interests. The result of any one shot could decide the Tournament.

Only ACCREDITED PHOTOGRAPHERS for RECOGNIZED NEWS MEDIA will be permitted to take pictures during the Tournament. Photo assistants may be issued a credential, but not photo arm bands for access inside the ropes. Photography will be restricted to news use. Commercial and personal photography is prohibited (except that spectators may take pictures on practice days and during a Pro-Am). Free lance photographers shooting on speculation will NOT BE ACCREDITED.

The following regulations apply to accredited news and television photographers and videotape cameramen as a condition of the privilege of taking pictures:

PHOTOGRAPHY REGULATIONS

GENERAL—ALL PHOTOGRAPHERS

- Photography will be restricted to NEWS use only. COMMERCIAL and PERSONAL photography is prohibited (except that spectators may take pictures on practice days and during a pro-am). Freelance photographers shooting on speculation WILL NOT BE ACCREDITED.
- A photographer must not ask a player to pose or in any way verbally distract a player during a round.
- If a player or an official requests that no photographs be taken in a certain situation, the request must be honored immediately, without discussion.
- A camera must not be pointed at a player about to make a stroke in any manner which might tend to disturb him or distract his attention.
- At the 9th and the 18th greens, photographers must not approach, delay or distract a player until he has checked, signed and returned his scorecard to the proper official. Under the Rules of Golf, a player turning in an incorrect scorecard in stroke play may be disqualified.
- · Cameras are not permitted in the locker room.
- Use of golf carts or other means of transportation on the course during tournament play is prohibited.

STILL PHOTOGRAPHERS

- Only still photographers to whom armbands have been issued will be permitted inside gallery
 ropes. They must station themselves immediately inside such ropes, and not more than an
 ARM'S LENGTH FROM THE ROPES, so as to blend into the gallery and appear to be part
 of the gallery. They must not take conspicuous positions in the open. Any photographer who
 violates this regulation will forfeit the right to working inside the ropes and possibly to work at
 the tournament.
- · Close-up action shots are prohibited.
- All pictures must be taken at appreciable distances, as far from the players as possible and from angles which are not acute to the line of play.
- When working at a green, photographers must not position themselves directly in a player's
 putting line.
- Pictures, even from a distance, may not be made until the player has completed his stroke.
 The photographer must not release his camera shutter until the shot is made.

TELEVISION/VIDEOTAPE CAMERAMEN

- Television and videotape filming may be done from inside the gallery ropes, or from areas approved by the PGA TOUR. All camera personnel who have been issued PHOTO armbands will be permitted inside the gallery lines, but this does not include other members of the crew. Camera personnel must station themselves immediately inside the gallery lines, not more than an arm's length from those lines, so as to blend into the gallery. They must not take conspicuous positions in the open.
- The only EXCEPTIONS to the above regulation concerns workers from the presenting network or PGA TOUR Productions, who have greater liberties in filming the event. Only these two groups will be allowed to move freely inside the ropes.
- Filming may be done from the locations described above during a player's stroke, provided modern equipment that produces a minimum of noise is used.
- Post-round interviews must be filmed far enough away from the arena of play to eliminate the
 possibility of distraction to those competing.

Difficulties will be avoided if photographers are fair and will treat players as they themselves would wish to be treated in similar circumstances.

The cooperation of all photographers will be appreciated.

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
